What you will need:

RED HEART* "Loop-It":

1 ball each 535 So Jaded A, 531 Everybody in the Pool B, 851 Blue-ming C, 753 Berry Gorgeous D, 779 Cosmopolitan E, and 201 Creamsicle F

Yarn needle

Gauge is not necessary for this project



RED HEART* Loop-It™, Art. E884 available in 3.5 oz (100 g), 7.6 yd (7 m) balls



Loop-It Rainbow Blanket

This sweet little blanket is perfect for nap time! It's easy to make, you don't have to know how to knit or crochet, just pull the loops through and you'll have a cute blanket when finished. Blanket measures 35" [89 cm] wide x 35" [89 cm] long.

NOTES

Finger looping fun $^{\text{TM}}$ - No tools required Begin work on a flat surface. Stitches are worked by pulling loops of yarn through a row of previous loops. Right side will be facing throughout. To change color, cut one loop open on both the ending yarn, and new yarn. Using the loose ends, tie them together. With a yarn needle, weave in ends.

BLANKET

Measure 55 loops of **A** and fold yarn at this point to create base row.

Row 1 (Right Side): Working from left to right, pull loops of working yarn through the loops of base row loops working from back to front – knit row formed. Do Not Turn Work.

Row 2: Working from right to left, pull loops from working yarn through loops of previous row from back to front – knit row. Do Not Turn Work.

Row 3: Working from left to right, pull loops from working yarn through loops of previous row from back to front – knit row. Do Not Turn Work.

Row 4: Working from right to left, pull loops from working yarn through loops of previous row from back to front – knit row. Do Not Turn Work.

Rows 5-6: Repeat Rows 3-4.

Change to ${\bf B}$ and repeat Rows 3-4 three times.

Change to ${\bf C}$ and repeat Rows 3-4 three times.

Change to $\bf D$ and repeat Rows 3-4 three times

Change to ${\bf E}$ and repeat Rows 3-4 three times.

Change to **F** and repeat Rows 3-4 three times.

BIND OFF

Working from left to right, pull the first two loops of working yarn through first 2 loops of previous rows, pull the second loop just worked through the first loop, pull a third loop of working yarn through next stitch, pull that loop through the previous loop. Continue in this manner across the row until all stitches have been secured. Pull end through last loop.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

A, B, C = Color A, B, C; **cm** = centimeters; **mm** = millimeters.
