



MATERIALS

Red Heart® **Super Saver**™ (7 oz/198 g; 364 yds/333 m)

Contrast A Coral (0726) **Small amount**

Contrast B Light Grey (0341) **Small amount**

Contrast C Cornmeal (0320) **Small amount**

Red Heart® Hygge Fur™ (7 oz/200 q; 260 yds/238 m)

Contrast D Cotton Tail (0108) or Sienna (0392) 1 ball

Spray adhesive. Sheet of cardboard (for Ilama body). Hot glue gun. Glue sticks. Scissors. 1 white chenille stem (for llama feet and ears). Small sheet of brown felt (for blanket). Pins. 30 lb monofilament line. Large needle.





MEASUREMENTS

Approximately 5" [12.5 cm] tall x 4" [10 cm] wide

INSTRUCTIONS

Notes

- Llama ornament is made in three pieces: Llama, blanket, and scarf. Blanket is glued to llama's back and scarf is tied around llama's neck.
- Only very small amounts of the Super Saver yarn are needed.

Step 1: Print out Llama template. (see page 5). With spray adhesive, glue template to cardboard.



Step 2: Cut out llama, following the template lines.





Step 3: Cut chenille stem into 6 lengths 2" [5 cm] long. Fold in half. With hot glue, glue one folded chenille stem to the head of each llama cutout for ears.



Step 4: With hot glue, glue one folded chenille stem to each leg of each llama cutout for feet.



Step 5: Cut 3 lengths of B and tie them together with an overhand knot. Braid lengths together to make 2" [5 cm] braid and trim off the excess for tail.





Step 6: With hot glue, glue tail to the llama then glue the two cutouts together. The llama is now ready to have yarn attached to it.





Step 7: With hot glue, glue the end of D to head. Wrap D around llama to cover the head.



Step 8: Wrap D around the neck and glue in place where needed.





Step 9: Wrap D around body and glue in place where needed.



Step 10: Wrap D around legs, keeping base of feet exposed and gluing where needed.



Step 11: Continue to wrap and glue until the llama is completely covered and ready for the blanket.





BLANKET

Step 1: Cut out 1½ x 3" [4 x 7.5 cm] rectangle of brown felt.



Step 2: Cut 3 lengths each of A, B and C. Holding 1 strand of each color, tie 3 strands together at each end, leaving approx 3" [7.5 cm] between knots. Repeat to make a total of 3 groups, with 1 strand of each color in each group.



Step 3: With dots of hot glue, glue the knotted strands evenly spaced along rectangle of brown felt placing a dot of glue under each knot.



Step 4: Trim A, B and C to ½" [13 mm] long and fray the ends to create faux tassels.





Step 5: With hot glue, glue blanket to llama, pinning in place until dry.





SCARF

Step 1: Cut one length each of A, B and C approx 15" [38 cm]. Tie A, B and C together with an overhand knot and braid together to make approx 12" [30.5 cm] braid. Tie end together with an overhand knot.



Step 2: Trim A, B and C ½" [13 mm] long and fray the ends to create faux tassels.



FINISHING

Step 1: Wrap and tie Scarf around the llama's neck.



Step 2: Thread a large needle with 12" [30.5 cm] of monofilament line. Push the line through the top of the Llama's back.



Step 3: Tie the monofilament line in a knot, creating a loop for hanging as an ornament.
