What you will need:

RED HEART® Soft®: 1 ball each
4608 Wine **A**, 9851 Royal Blue **B**,
9523 Dark Leaf **C**, 4422 Tangerine **E**,
3729 Grape **F**, and 9520 Seafoam **G**
RED HEART® Medley™: 1 ball each
934 Energy **D** and 940 Volcano **H**

Susan Bates® Crochet Hook:
9mm [US M-13].

Silvalume® Handi Tool or small
crochet hook (for fringe), ½ yd
[½ m] burlap, sewing needle or
machine and thread to match,
16" [40 cm] length of ¾" [1 cm]
diameter dowel, Dritz Fray Check®
fabric sealant (optional)

SHOP KIT



Shaggy Chic Wall Hanging

Create a modern wall hanging for a pop of color wherever you may need it. A crochet hook is used to pull yarn through a burlap backing. Have fun changing up the colors for your own unique wall hanging!

Wall hanging measures 15" wide x 19" long [38 x 48.5 cm] on wrong side of fabric, excluding hanger.

Notes

1. Wall hanging is made from burlap with fringes attached in 25 sections. Follow Placement Diagram for color sequence or create your own.
2. Use any size small crochet hook that will fit through the holes of the burlap. Each fringe is worked around horizontal ("weft") threads of burlap separated by vertical ("warp") threads. Each fringe in model was worked over 3 weft threads.
3. Fringes are intended to appear uneven so use strands of differing lengths. You may prefer to add a contrasting strand of color in one fringe of each section.
4. Rod pocket is sewn at top of burlap for insertion of dowel.

WALL HANGING

Prepare Fabric

With selvage at top, cut a piece of burlap measuring 16" [40 cm] wide x 20" [51 cm] long. In this order, press under 1" [2.5 cm] seam allowance at each side edge, ½" [13 mm] seam allowance at bottom edge, and 1½" [4 cm] seam allowance at top selvage edge (for rod pocket). Sew in place then sew ¼" [6mm] from first stitching within each seam allowance to reinforce.

Fabric should measure 14" wide x 18" long [35.5 x 45.5 cm].

Optional: Apply fabric sealant across cut edges to prevent fraying and unraveling. Draw 4 vertical lines and 4 horizontal lines about 3" [7.5 cm] apart to create sections for each color.

FRINGE

Refer to Placement Diagram for color sequence. Cut strands of each color in varying lengths between 8" [20.5 cm] and 11" [28 cm].

For each fringe, hold 2 strands together and fold in half to form a loop. Beginning near side edge and on horizontal line of first section of top row, *insert small crochet hook around burlap strands from right side to wrong side and to right side again, picking up ¼" [6mm] of burlap on hook. Place loops of yarn on hook and draw carefully through burlap. Thread ends of strands through loop and pull gently to tighten without puckering burlap. Skip a few burlap threads and repeat from * to attach as many fringes as needed to fill section. Work a second row of shorter strands about 1" [2.5 cm] below the first row in each section. Repeat to fill in all sections.

Hanger

With larger hook and holding 2 strands of **D** together, crochet a chain about 24" [61 cm] length or desired length; working in back bars, slip st in 3rd ch from hook and in each ch across. Fasten off, pulling beginning and end tails through last st. Tighten slip knot.

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FINISHING

Slide dowel through rod pocket. Push ends of dowel through first ch-2 space at beginning of hanger and in 2nd ch from last st.

Trim strands as desired or leave “as is” for a shaggier appearance.

Optional: If strands are curly, carefully steam fringes without touching iron to yarn; comb strands with your fingers to straighten.

Abbreviations

A, B, C = Color A, B, C; **ch** = chain; **cm** = centimeters; **mm** = millimeters; **st(s)** = stitch(es); * **or** ** = repeat whatever follows the * or ** as indicated.
