Jade (3862) **1 ball**

## ABBREVIATIONS

**Knot-bearing cord** = Cord around which knots are tied.

**Knotting cord** = Cord used to make knots.

**Working end** = End of knotting cord being used to tie knots.

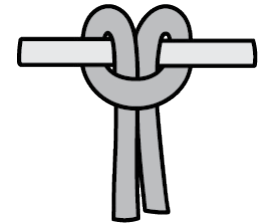
## MEASUREMENT

Approximately 6 feet [1.8 m] long.

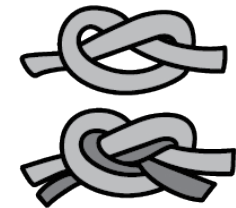
## INSTRUCTIONS

### Tips:

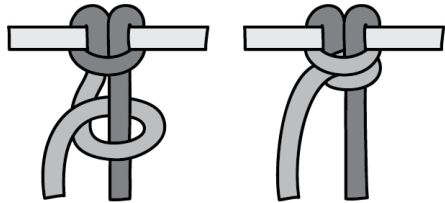
- Text in bold refers to knots illustrated with diagrams.
- Tape Snap Hook to work surface for ease of working.
- For easier knotting, wrap ends of knotting cords into figure-eight '8' bobbins or wrap around fingers and secure with elastic band. Let out cord as needed.
- **Do not** tie knots too tightly. Tighten strands just enough to secure knot.



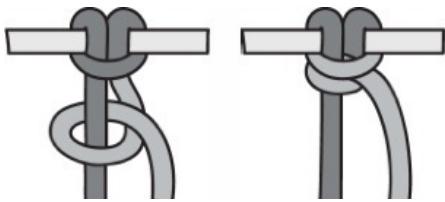
LARKS HEAD KNOT



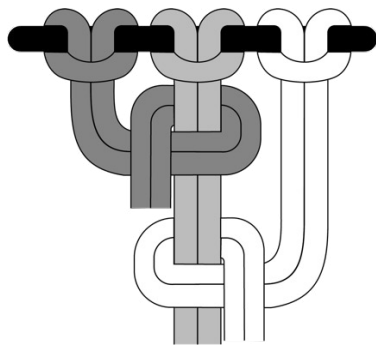
OVERHAND KNOT

ZIPPER KNOT

1. Cut 1 cord 4 yds long [3.6 m] and 2 cords 16 yds long [14.6 m].
2. Fold cords in half and tie all cords in **Larks Head Knot** into Key Ring, placing shortest cord in the middle.
3. Separate cords into knotting cords (longer) and knot-bearing cords (shorter).
4. With both knotting cords on the left, make **Vertical Half Hitch Knot Left-Right** as follows:
  - 2 cords on left are knotting cords, 2 cords in center are knot-bearing cords.
  - Bring the left cords to the right over the 2 knot-bearing cords.
  - Bring the knotting cords back to the left under the knot-bearing cords and over itself.
  - Pull knotting cords to secure the knot.
5. With both knotting cords on the right, make **Vertical Half Hitch Knot Right-Left** as follows:
  - 2 cords on right are knotting cords, 2 cords in center are knot-bearing cords.
  - Bring the right cords to the left over the 2 knot-bearing cords.
  - Bring the knotting cords back to the right under the knot-bearing cords and over itself.
  - Pull knotting cords to secure the knot.
6. Repeat Steps 4 + 5 to form the Zipper Knot. Continue repeats until 4" [10 cm] of knot-bearing cord remains.
7. Tie all 6 strands using an **Overhand Knot**.
8. With remaining knotting cords tie overhand knot 1" [2.5 cm] away from previous overhand knot to create a loop. Trim excess cord.
9. Feed Snap hook end through the loop to create the adjustable handle. **Do not** pull completely through.
