

Quickstart Instructions for your Electronic Combination Safe Entry pad.



Code Recommendations: Personal data that can be related to a code holder, such as a birth date, street number, or phone number, should not be used in creating a lock code. Avoid codes that can be easily guessed. Perform all code changes with the <u>safe door open in the locked position</u>. After the lock is changed to a new code, the lock function must be checked by locking and unlocking it several times with the safe door open. Make sure it functions correctly before closing the door.

Creating a New Code for the First Time

Step 1 Enter the number 0 six times (listen for 1 beep.)

Step 2 Enter 123456, which is the current code (listen for 1 beep)

Step 3 Enter your new six-digit number (listen for 2 beeps)

Step 4 Enter your new six-digit number (listen for 1 beep)

Example:

Enter 000000 (listen for 1 beep^J) 123456 (listen for 1 beep^J) 502070 (listen for 2 beeps^J) 502070 (listen for 1 beep^J) (Where 502070 is shown in the example this is your new 6-digit code)

Notes:

- 1. Always use fresh Duracell Alkaline 9-volt batteries only. To change the battery, lift up on the keypad and the battery is located on the back of the keypad.
- 2. If you enter the wrong code 4 times the lock will go into a 5-minute penalty mode; every time you touch a key the timer resets to 5 minutes. Please do not touch the keypad during this 5-minute time period.
- 3. This symbol means the lock will sound beeps (\downarrow). The number of notes indicates how many beeps there are (\downarrow \downarrow).
