Through his sculpture work John has been starting to see the world differently. Part of the difficulty of learning to focus on the wholeness and life around us is heightened awareness of the state of the world. It's easy to get stuck in negativity and battling things not working, but John is not buying into the doom and gloom any more. The way forward is connecting inside, feeling and living the wholeness already present in the core of our beings – being the change we want to see, and reminding us of our part in the world.

A fallen tree takes on new life. When sourcing pohutukawa for his work John looks for quirky, human and animal form, indications of intriguing grain and a sense of wholeness. Working with the natural form of a branch or root he pars back the wood to highlight the fundamental form that already exists – less is more – giving each piece a second life and allowing its story to unfold.

Focusing on the sense of wholeness in a piece, and the lack of it, helps indicate what else needs to be done. A defining quality of pieces which do feel whole is that they feel complete in themselves, still inside, happy, or joyful even. Full of life.

Seeing life emerge in a new way from a fallen tree is exciting because it connects us to nature. The life we feel in a sculpture is life we are feeling in us. We are one with nature.
