Prompting Technique

2. End the prompt with "Take a deep breath and work on this problem step-by-step."

Sequential Prompting: Break tasks into smaller steps. Guide: Outline → Expand → Detail.

3. Directive Prompting: Use specific, direct prompts. Example: "Summarize [topic].

- Best practices: label examples, keep uniform format
- Tip: align examples to your target




