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Note: Almost all spills are removed by either dry cleaning fluid (follow manufacturer's instructions) or a simple solution of one teaspoon of mild detergent with one teaspoon of white vinegar in a quart of warm water.

*If recommended procedure is not effective call a reputable cleaner. Some stains are so complex that they should be treated by someone with a knowledge of textile chemistry. Don't wait for annual cleaning. It may be too late to remove the stain.

WOOL	 Always use a professional cleaning service. Consumer self-cleaning methods are discouraged.
RAYON	 Clean spills immediately by blotting with a clean sponge or cloth.
COTTON	 Vacuum regularly.
	• Avoid use of beater-bar type vacuum as they may cause yarns to pull or snag. If snagging does occur, avoid pulling yarn

SUEDE LEATHER	 Clean spills immediately by wiping smoothly in the direction of the hair with a slightly damp cloth, using mild soap and water. Care and Maintenance

	• Pile shedding is a normal characteristic of quality area rugs, particularly with wool and other natural fibers.
	Natural skin rugs are not recommended for areas with heavy foot traffic.
JUTE	Cleaning Recommendations
SISAL	 Clean spills immediately with a dab of water and a soft bristle rug. Scrape solid spills with a dull knife, then brush with a stiff bristle brush. Blot liquid spills – do not rub.
1	 Do not steam clean or wet shampoo your jute rug. Plant fibers are highly absorbent, so they are subject to some shrinking and puckering when exposed to liquids or excessive dampness. Dry wet spills immediately with fan or hair dryer.
	 Vacuum regularly on both sides of the rug.
	• Always use a professional cleaning service. Consumer self-cleaning methods are discouraged.

VISCOSE	Cleaning Recommendations
LUXCELLE™	Vacuum regularly. Vacuums with beater bars are not recommended.
BAMBOO-EXTRUDED	Avoid pulling yarn knots out of surface pile.
SILK-LIKE FIBERS	 Always use a professional cleaning service. Consumer self-cleaning methods are discouraged. Carpet can easily stain and yellow with improper cleaning chemicals.
	 For spills, blot the affected area with white paper towels or a clean white terry cloth towel. Moisture will weaken the fiber, and rubbing could then cause breaking or damage.
	• After blotting stains, groom by combing the face of the rug in the direction of the pile with a soft brush. The pile may look flatter and more reflective afterward.
	• Once the stained area is dry, re-brush the fiber to regain original texture.
