## SCHOOL UNIFORM - ALL YEARS

## Years 7-11

Pupils may wear school games kit on days where timetabled games sessions take place.
On other days the following will be worn by all pupils in years 7-11:

- Black blazer with school crest - available from Mr Cricket Hockey. Online purchasing of the blazer will be via a unique website www.perseschoolkit.co.uk, alternatively you can contact Mr Cricket by telephone: 01638741611.
- Plain white, collared shirt/blouse (tucked-in) - available from a retailer of your choice.
- Dark grey/black pleated skirt or dark grey/black trousers with conventional crease available from a retailer of your choice.
- Black/grey socks or plain black/skin-tone tights - available from a retailer of your choice.
- Plain black polishable shoes of conventional design - available from a retailer of your choice. Shoes should be low heeled (approximately 1 inch).
- Optional item: Purple, black and red striped school tie - available from the School Office.
- Optional item: v-neck plain grey jumper without logo - available from a retailer of your choice.

If children in Year 11 need new uniform whilst in Year 11, they are allowed to wear a dark suit as a transition towards Sixth Form dress code.

## Free deliveries and returns of orders are made regularly throughout the term direct to the

 Upper School.During the Summer holidays, collection and returns can only be made via the Upper School.
All online items are available to try on and purchase at the Mr Cricket Hockey shop. Mr Cricket Hockey also sell sports equipment and has a labelling service. All items of uniform, footwear and bags must be clearly labelled.

Children are required to wear the appropriate sports kit for games and PE. Sports kit can only be worn to academic lessons on days where pupils have timetabled games, or if there is an early lunch departure to an away fixture. Children attending lunch or academic lessons in sports kit must wear a Perse-branded top and a pair of Perse-branded tracksuit bottoms. Failing this, children are required to change into full school uniform.

## Sixth Form Dress Code

The principles for Sixth Form uniform are to enhance a sense of pride in our school, comfort, modesty and consideration for the values of the community. As leaders within our school community, students are expected to be smartly dressed in accordance with the guidance below. Students' appearance should reflect a sense of pride in themselves and of the school.

## Sixth Form games kit

- Hoodies or sweatshirts
- Jumpers/cardigans with obvious writing/logo on the front or back
- Leather, faux leather, PVC or denim (excepting leather shoes)
- Fishnet tights
- High heels, stilettos, platform shoes, trainers, Crocs, flip flops or Ugg boots
