## *German Glass Glitter*

Our German Glass Glitter is manufactured in Germany.

During the old world manufacturing process dating back to the 1800's glass is coated with pure silver. It is baked or "fired" at very high temperatures. Once cooled, color coatings are added, then it is fired again.

It is then imported to a factory in the USA and ground into various sizes called grit. 70 grit is the coarsest. Our German Glass Glitter is mixture of several grits and is custom made for The Couture Collection!

We do not add clear glass to our glitters. Some may do this to reduce their cost, that is why you may see some on the market that is less expensive than ours.

German Glass Glitter is not recommended for children because it contains some sharp shards. You can coat your hands with baby powder or wear gloves to avoid being cut.

### *How to apply German Glass Glitter*

This Glitter looks best when the basecoat is painted similar to the glitter color. For example, use Recharge Paint Couture! under French Kiss or Silver Star metallic paint under Pure Silver. Save a step and tint the Mod Podge with the paint color using a 50%-50% ratio! Apply a nice even coat of Tacky Glue, Elmer's Glue All or Mod Podge or the paint/Mod Podge mix. Apply the glitter generously. Be sure to work over a paper plate or a coffee filter so you can capture all the left-over's! Gently shake off excess into the paper plate or coffee filter and back into the jar. On a flat surface, use a thick piece of paper and press it onto the surface to help push down the glitter. Let it dry.
