



Paint Couture! is a low VOC, water-based paint, available in 32 colors. It is a self priming, acrylic décor, furniture and cabinet paint. Paint Couture! has a great adhesion capability to existing painted or varnished surfaces. With Paint Couture! there is usually no sanding and no priming, but there are exceptions. It lays on very flat with little to no brush marks. The dry finish look is a matte finish.

A Glaze, Lacquer, or Wax is recommended after the paint has cured. There are many Glaze Couture! colors and topcoat options with Lacquer Couture!

Our Accessories include metallic paints and Embossing Medium.

How To Apply

Paint Couture![™]

On previously painted or varnished surfaces “normally” no sanding is required, if the surface area is extremely smooth, rough up the surface with 220 grit sandpaper. It is recommended to clean it with TSP or Simple Green following the directions on the label.

Apply the 1st coat of Paint Couture! with a quality brush or a 1/4" nap velour roller. The 1st coat should be applied as a thin, but opaque coat, not so thin that you can see through the paint. It is **Extremely Important** to have your work dry at least 12 to 24 hours prior to painting a second coat of Paint Couture! Apply the second coat the same way as the first coat. Coverage is about 150 square feet per quart for 2 coats. Clean-up with warm soapy water.

Glaze Couture![™]

Be sure your painted projects have dried at least 12 to 24 hours. Wait 24 hours between coats. Apply the Glaze Couture! with a quality brush. Wait a couple of minutes and wipe off any excess with a dry foam brush or a dry staining pad. If you prefer the Glaze to be deeper, just apply with nice, even brush strokes and let it dry 24 hours for a beautiful "protective" matte finish. Clean-up with warm soapy water.

Accessories Couture![™]

Metallic paints are intended for accenting your furniture! Apply with a good quality brush in one direction using long smooth strokes. A foam nap roller when offloaded is great to use with stencils.

Embossing Medium is a texturing plaster. Apply through a stencil to create a raised plaster effect. Trowel on and use a wallpaper brush for a grass cloth effect. This product is also good for filling in wood.

Lacquer Couture![™]

Lacquer Couture! is water based and is available in 4 sheen levels; Matte, Satin, Semi Gloss and Gloss.

Be sure material to be finished has dried at least 24 hours. Prior to use, stir the can of Lacquer to ensure you have a consistent mix. Apply the 1st coat of Lacquer with a brush, roller or sprayer. If you spray you should be able to use the product right from the can. Depending on the type of sprayer, you may dilute the Lacquer with up to 5% tap water. Do not apply a thick coat; thin coats are best to achieve a beautiful and durable Lacquer look.

If desired a second coat can be applied after 4 hours. **You should sand between coats for increased sheen and smoothness using 240 grit sandpaper.** Wipe off any dust from sanding and then apply the second coat in the same manner as above.

Lacquer Couture covers approximately 150-175 square feet with one coat.
