Life Skills Program

ICC's new life skills program with designated staff is one of the latest efforts to keep up with the changing needs of the children and teens we serve.

"Building a foundation for success"

The new Life Skills Program at ICC is helping to prepare our older residents for the day they are discharged into the world on their own. Headed by Marilyn Cabrera, who comes to ICC with experience in adolescent case management and social services, the program addresses a variety of life tasks through a series of three week modules. Small groups of 2-4 residents will address a needed skill, such as budgeting, hygiene or travel training, by progressing from lecture to an informational review (test) and field trip to exercise the newly learned skill. For instance, in the budgeting module, lessons in simple math may be followed by a test in how to make change, and then a trip to the grocery store where they must purchase a grocery list within an assigned budget. Modules are geared toward older residents preparing for discharge to live on their own, but younger residents can learn from this program as well. Small groups allow staff to tailor to specific goals. The intent is to work with close to 100% of residents within their stay at ICC. We are thrilled to have a program specific to life skills training as it is the most urgent current need of our population. Many thanks to the Alfred E. Smith Memorial Foundation for their support of this program.

Did you know?

Yet again this year, ICC was surveyed by the New York State Department of Health and was not only found deficiency free for clinical issues, but was given a 5 star rating, the highest rating available from Centers of Medicare and Medicaid Services! Way to go ICC staff!





Resident Highlight: Update

"E" is one of our latest "success stories". She was an ICC resident as a young child and was adopted from the Center. She returned recently as a young adult to working on independent living skills such as self administration of medication, budgeting and completing her high school education. ICC staff has been working with her on these areas throughout her admission and we are so proud of her progress. She is close to receiving her high school diploma and has applied to the Access-VR program for vocational rehabilitation. She will be moving to supportive housing in the next few months and we are confident that she will do well on her own. Although she will be missed by staff and the other residents who saw her a role model and mentor, we know she has a bright future ahead.
