What is the Census?

Every ten years the census gives us a complete picture of the nation. It allows us to compare different groups of people across the United Kingdom because the same questions are asked, and the information is recorded, in the same way throughout England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland.

The census provides information that government needs to develop policies, plan and run public services, and allocate funding.

Plan and run public services

We all use public services such as schools, health services, roads and libraries. These services need to be planned, and in such a way that they keep pace with fast-changing patterns of modern life. We need accurate information on the numbers of people, including the balance of young and old, what jobs people do, where they live and in what type of housing.

Allocate money to local authorities

An accurate count of the population in each local area helps the Government to calculate the size of grants it allocates each local authority and health authority.

The data are also widely used by academics, businesses, voluntary organisations and the public.

The census is the most complete source of information about the population that we have. Every effort is made to include everyone. It is the only survey which provides a detailed picture of the entire population, and is unique because it covers everyone at the same time and asks the same core questions everywhere. This makes it easy to compare different parts of the country.

However no census is perfect and some people are inevitably missed. ONS therefore uses complex statistical techniques to adjust the 2011 Census counts for those people missed by the census. The methods and quality assurance approach was researched and developed in consultation with academics, statisticians, demographers and users of census data. The result was a suite of methods to process, clean, adjust and protect the census results.

Output areas (OAs) are the lowest level of geography at which census estimates are produced. OAs contain approximately equal numbers of population/households, and are intended as geographies that allow reporting of statistics across time on a consistent geographical base.

Using 2001 Census data, 175,434 OAs were created for England and Wales with an average of 297 persons and 123 households in each OA. To prevent statistical disclosure when releasing estimates at OA level, each OA was designed to have a minimum population (100 persons) and number of households (40 households) within it. OAs were intended to be a stable geography and did not change until the 2011 Census when around 2.6% of the 2001 OAs were changed to reflect the change in populations since the 2001 Census. There are now 181,408 OAs in England and Wales.

Postcode Level Counts

As described above, the Census is not collected at a Postcode level and therefore we undertake additional analysis to aggregate Output Area level counts to Postcode Sector, District and Area levels. To do this we source population weighted centroids and, using GIS techniques, we relate the 2011 Output Area geography to the latest Postcode geography to enable us to produce up to date counts.
