- (1) Please share a time that you have been excluded / had to act differently / been “othered.”
- (2) The history of slavery and racism in the United States is not taught evenly throughout our public education system. What history did you already know? What had you not known? Were there specific chapters that stood out for you as blind spots?
- (3) Of the many stories included in the book, what narrative stood out the most for you?
- (4) In the introduction, the authors discuss why they're invested in this work. Who do you think about, or why do *you* feel invested in, uprooting racism?
- (5) What are some of your personal spheres of influence? And, importantly, what is something you can do differently within those spheres to make change?
