THIS HELMET MEETS CE EN1078 :2012 HELMET STANDARDS

HELMET INSTRUCTIONS

The helmet you have just purchased provides protection, whether on or off the road. To ensure proper use, familiarise yourself with its features, fit and care by carefully reading through this manual before your child wears his new helmet.

WARNING

1. This helmet is designed for bicycles, skateboards and scooters and it is NOT intended for motorsport use.
2. No helmet can protect the wearer from all possible impacts.
3. The helmet is designed to be held by straps under the lower jaw.
4. To be safe and effective, a helmet must be properly worn and adjusted. To check that the helmet fits properly, place the helmet on your child's head and make the indicated adjustments. Attach the clasp securely under the chin. Grasp the helmet and try to rock it forward and backward. A properly fitted helmet should be comfortable and should not move forward to obscure vision or backward to expose the forehead.
5. No parts should be attached to the helmet except those recommended by the helmet manufacturer.

6. The helmet is designed to absorb shock by partial destruction of the shell and lining. This damage may not be visible. Therefore, if the helmet is subjected to a severe impact, it should be destroyed and replaced even if it appears intact.
7. The helmet may be damaged by petroleum and petroleum products, cleaning agents, paint, adhesives and the like without the damage being visible.
8. A helmet has a limited lifespan and must be replaced when it shows obvious signs of wear.
9. This helmet should not be used by children when climbing or doing other activities where there is a risk of hanging or strangulation if the child becomes trapped while wearing the helmet.

THE PROPER FIT

STEP1: The helmet fits properly when the adjustment pads hold it firmly but comfortably in place. The pads are held in place by Velcro. All adjustments must be made with the helmet in the correct position. If not, the helmet will not fit properly. The helmet could then move or come off in an accident. For the proper position, please refer to Diagram A.

STEP 2: Always make sure the child wears the helmet low in the front to protect the forehead as in the "correct" figure above.

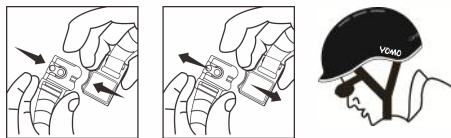
STEP 3: The front and rear side straps should meet at a point slightly below and in front of the ears (see Diagram B). To adjust the position of the straps, hold one end of the buckle and slide the adjuster up or down as needed.

STEP 4: Always fasten the helmet with the strap tight under the chin. Make sure the strap is against the throat, NOT on the tip of the chin. Straps worn on the tip of the chin increase the risk of the helmet coming off during an accident. See Diagrams C and D on how to attach and detach the strap. Diagram E shows the correct positioning of the strap under the chin.

Make sure that the loose end of the strap passes through the rubber band. Otherwise, the strap may slip, and the helmet may accidentally come off (see Diagram F).

STEP 5 : Before using the helmet, make sure it fits correctly and that the straps are tight. Put the helmet in the correct position. Attach the strap under the chin and pull it tight.

CHECK THE FIT

Grasp the helmet with both hands and rotate it to the left and right. If the helmet fits properly, the skin on the forehead will move as you do so. If not, the helmet is too loose. Go back to step 1.

CHECK THE STRAPS

Grasp the helmet with both hands and try to move it by pivoting it forward and backward as far as possible. If you can remove it completely from the child's head in either direction, move it forward until it blocks the child's vision or backward until the child's entire forehead is seen. Repeat steps 3 and 4 until the helmet movement is minimal.

CHECK THE FIT

If you cannot adjust your helmet as required in all steps, DO NOT USE THIS HELMET. Replace it with a different size.

STEP 6: Once you are sure the helmet fits properly and all straps are properly adjusted and tightened, take a short ride to test the helmet. Pay attention to the overall comfort and stability of the helmet as the child rides. Make any minor adjustments to the pads and straps to improve comfort and stability.

CLEANING YOUR HELMET

Use only mild soap and water to clean the helmet, straps and pads. Do not use chemicals. Do not use solvents, paints and hydrocarbons.

STORING YOUR HELMET

After each use, allow the helmet to air-dry, then store it in a cool, dry place. Excessive heat can damage the helmet. In direct sunlight, in dark bags, or in the car, it may be hot enough to cause heat related damage. Damaged helmets will have an uneven or bubbly surface. DO NOT USE IF HELMET SHOWS ANY SIGN OF DAMAGE.
