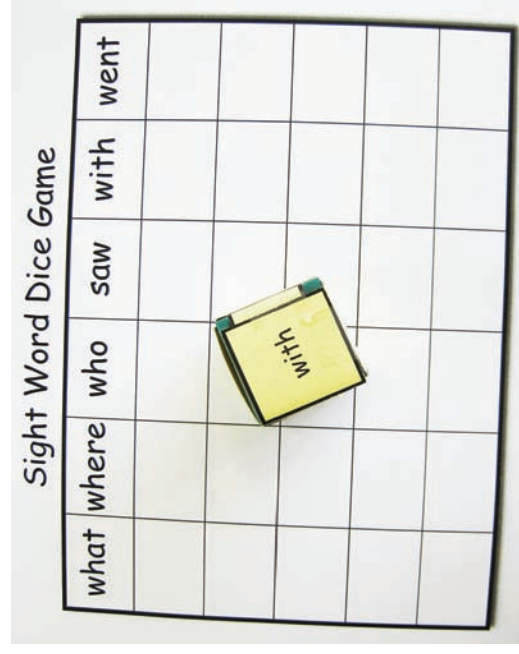
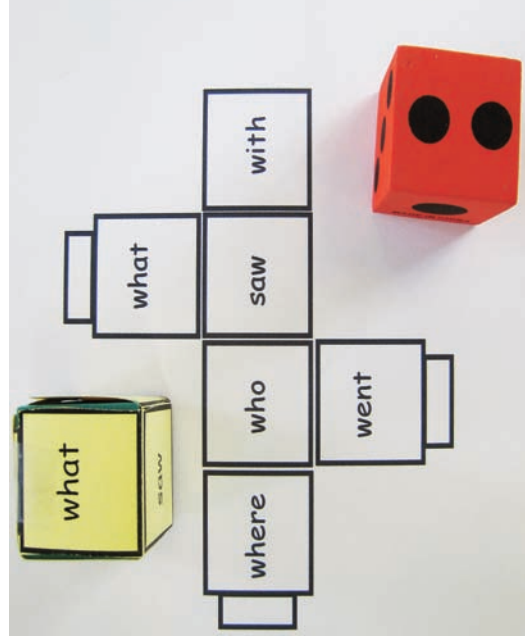
Sight Word Dice Game

Instructions:

1. Decide on the words that you want to teach. Write these words on the blank die and the blank recording sheet, or just use the words on the die and recording sheet that have been filled in for you.
2. Duplicate one recording sheet for each child. You will also need one die for every two children to share. (It might also work for three children to share one die, if they are patient and can share well.)
3. Cut out the outside of the die on the small dashed lines that look like this: -----
4. Fold the die between each of the faces on the dashed lines that look like this: _ _ _ _ _ so that it looks like a cube, and tape it together. I taped my die around a real foam die that I purchased at a teacher supply store so that it wouldn't get squished in the children's hands. It fits nicely around a die that has faces of about 1 and 1/4- 3/8 inches each. (*That means each face of the die is just short of one and a half inches.*)

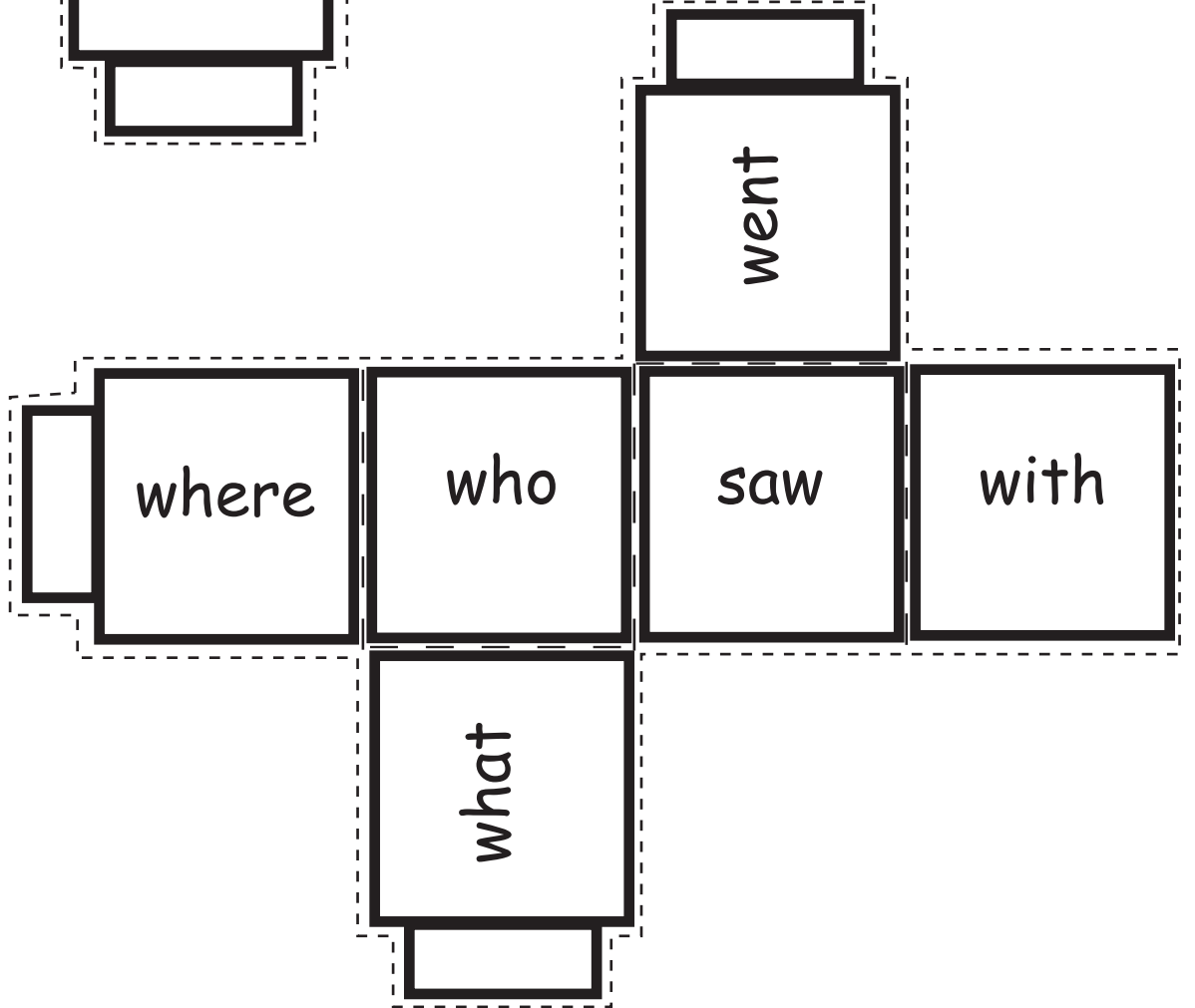
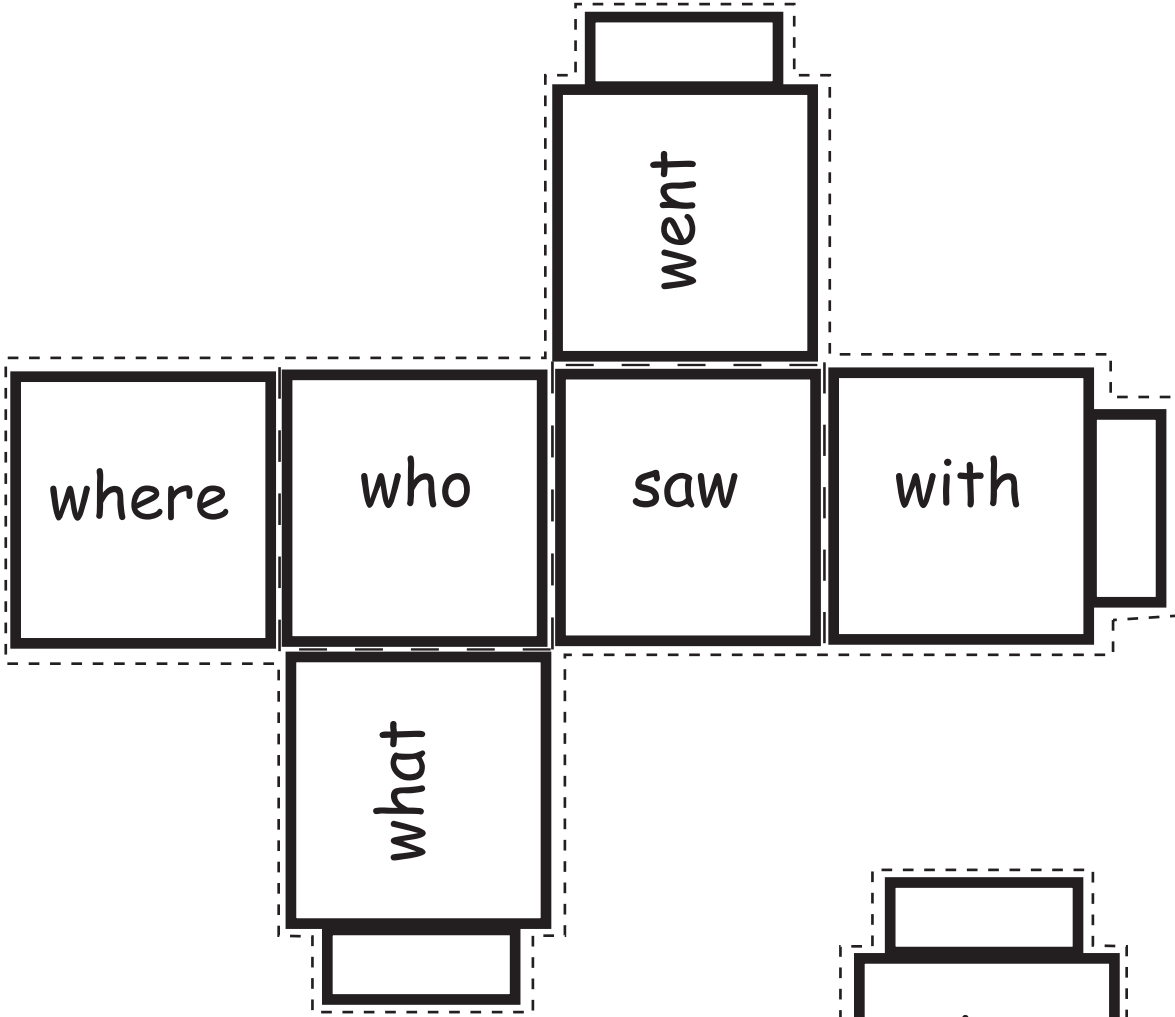
To play the game:

Each child rolls the die in turn and reads the word that comes up. He then writes it in the column under that word. The first child to fill up one entire column is the winner of the game! To make the game last longer, you can tell the children that the first person to fill two columns will be the winner. Have fun!

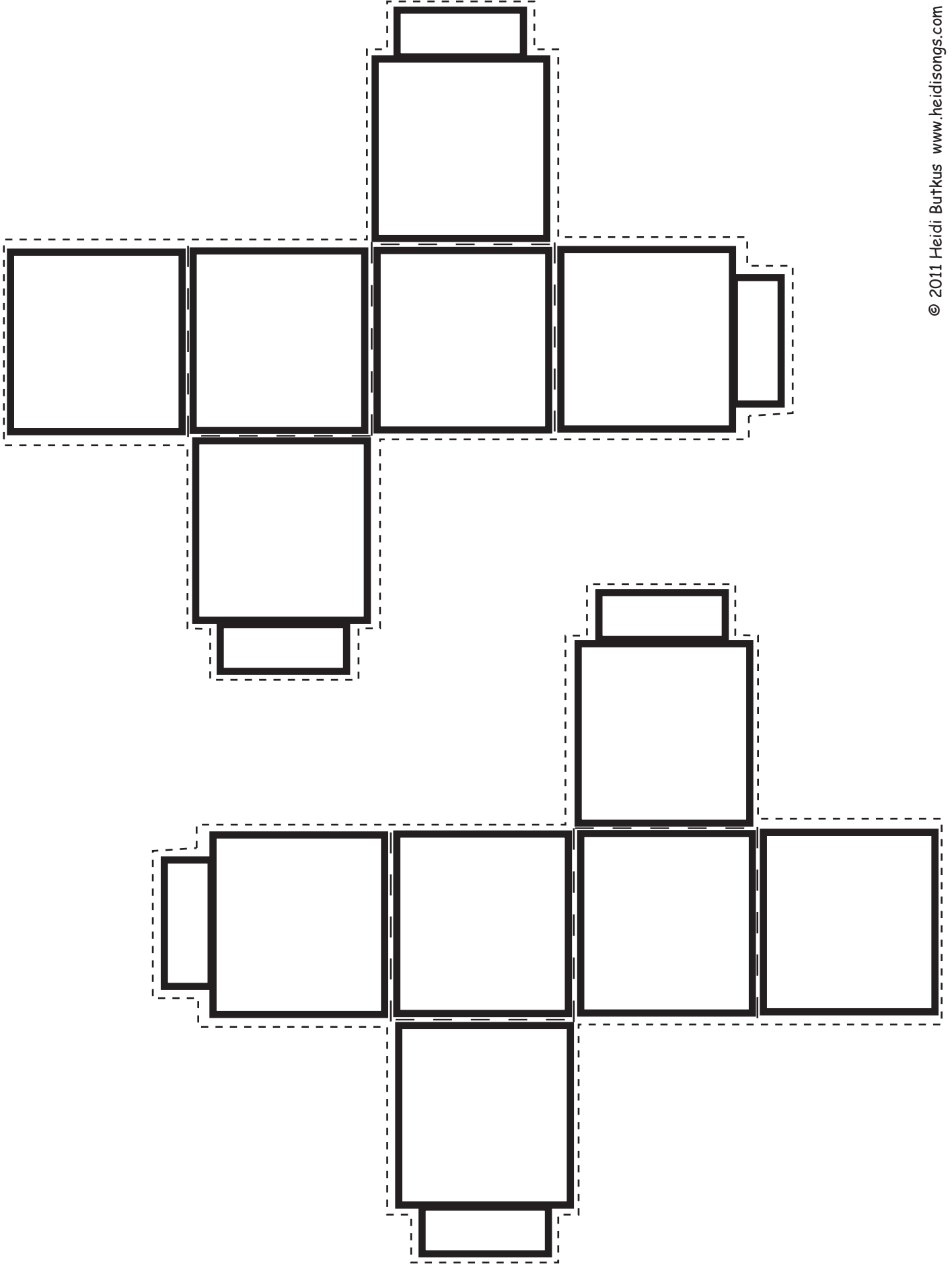

Sight Word Santa

To Prepare: Duplicate and cut apart the Sight Word Santas and the present. Mix up the Santa cards.

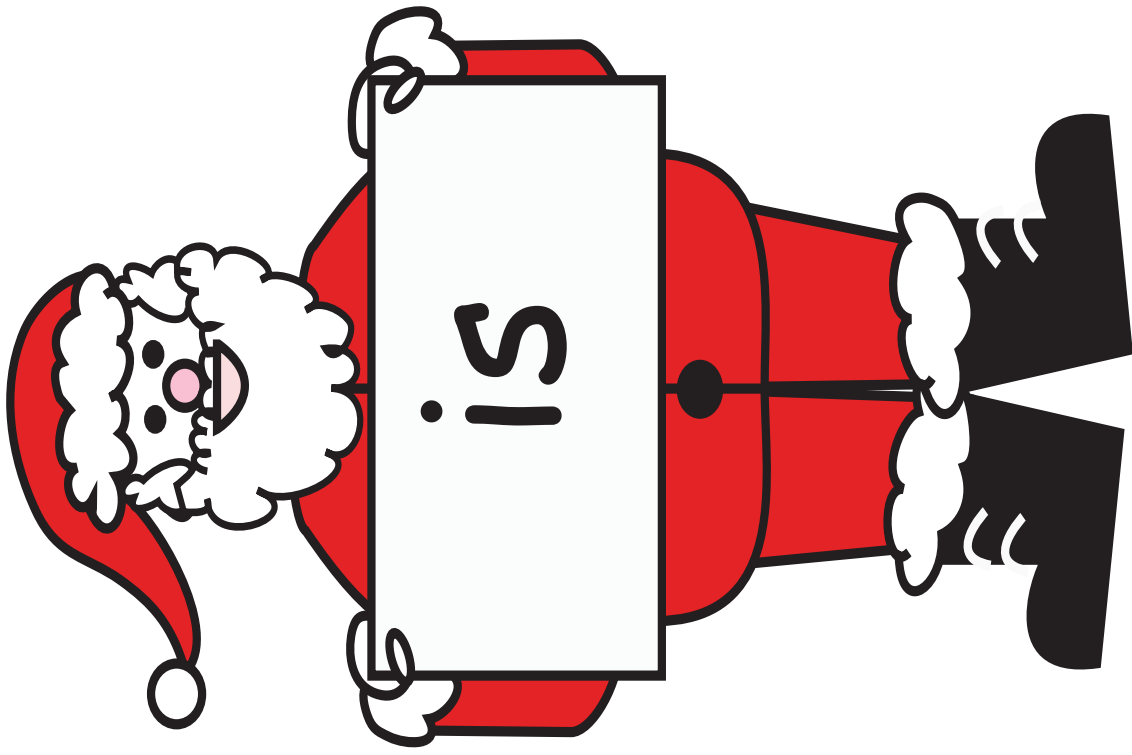
To Play: Have your students make a circle, all sitting on the floor. Once seated, scatter all of the Santa's on the floor. Have the children hide their eyes while you hide the picture of the present underneath one of the Santa's. Ask them to lift their heads up when you are done hiding the present.

Then have the children chant, "Santa, Santa! Ho, ho, ho! Santa, Santa, where did it go?" Chose one child to tell you the sight word Santa that he or she thinks the present is hidden under. Once he or she says the word, that person may lift up that card. If the present is hidden under there, then that child is the winner of that round. If not, then another child gets a turn to guess. Play continues in this fashion until the present is found. If you wish, you may let the child that finds the Santa be the next one to hide him. However, be aware that this likely means that every single child in the class will want a chance to hide the present, so in a whole group situation, this may not be advisable because the game would be too long. Have fun!

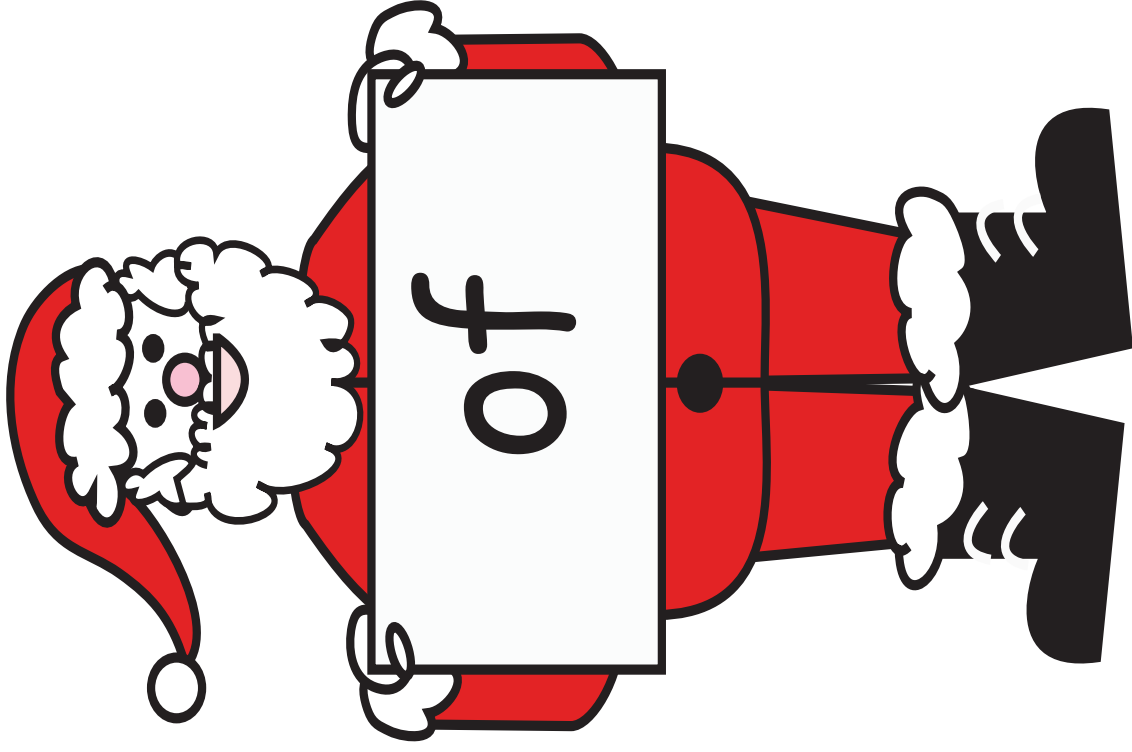






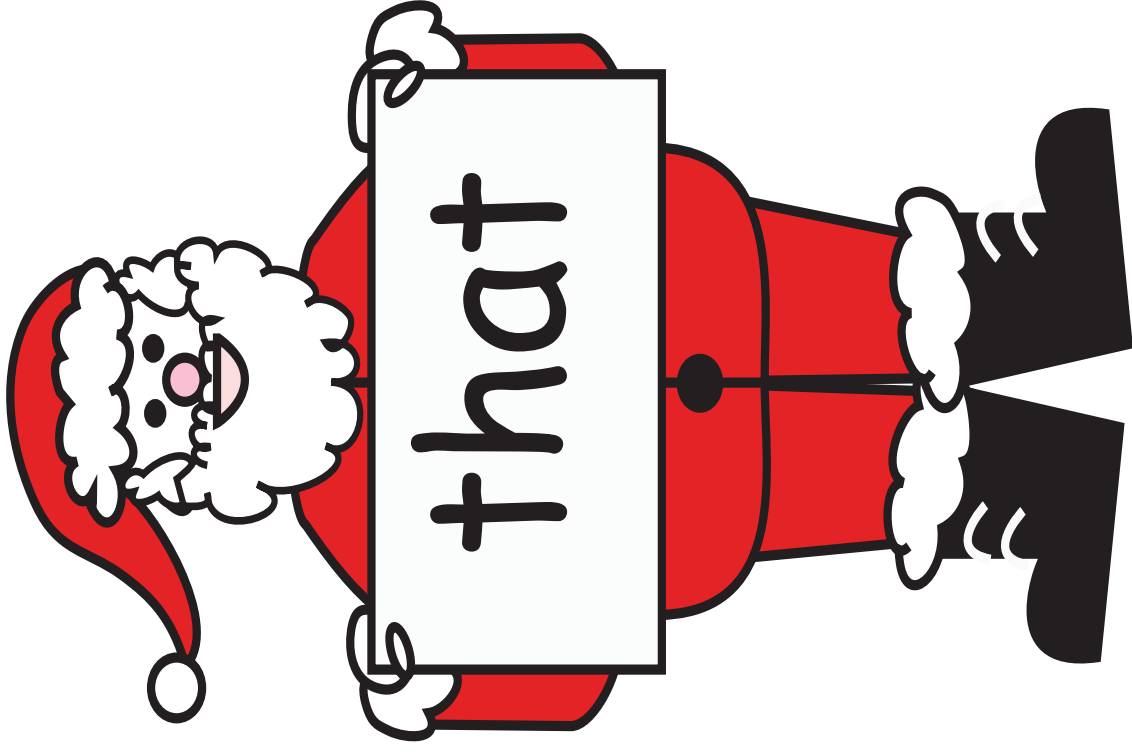








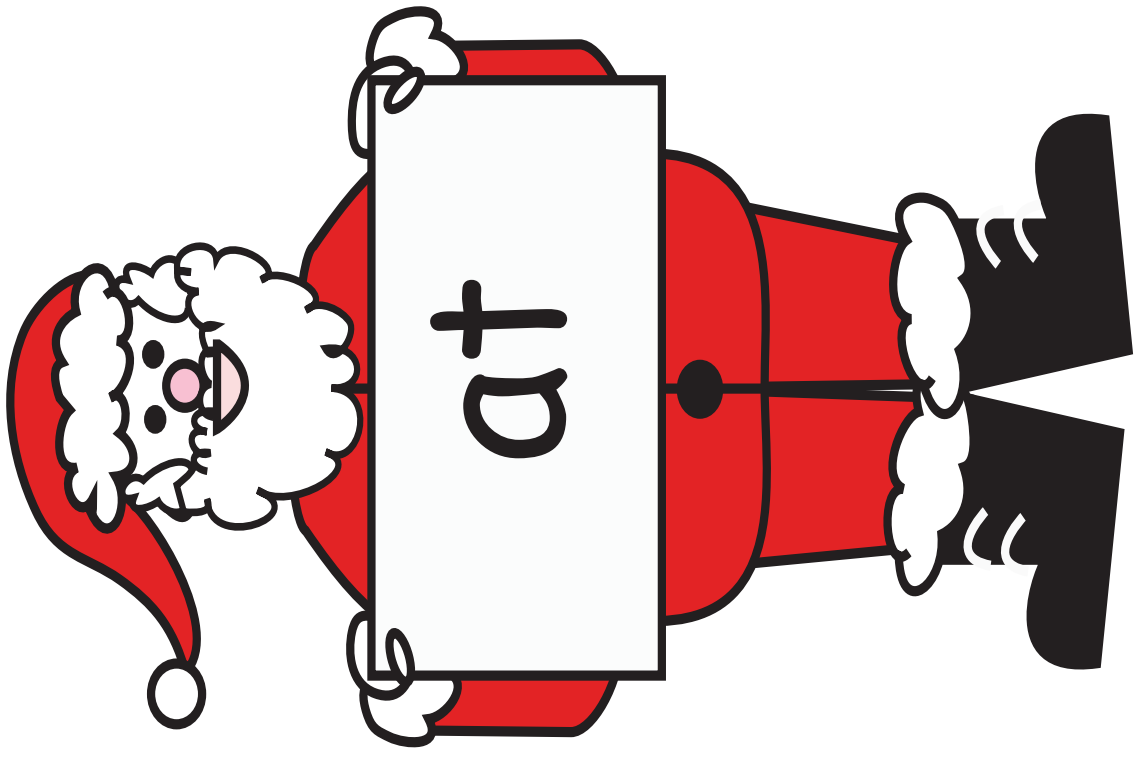


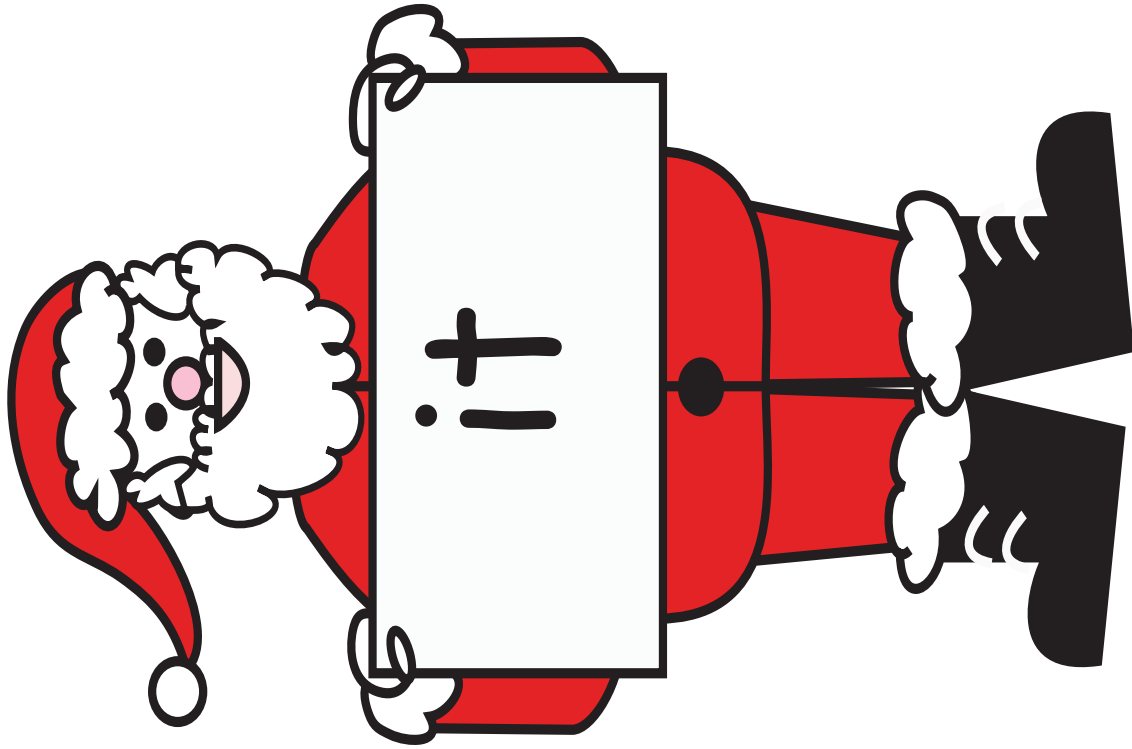
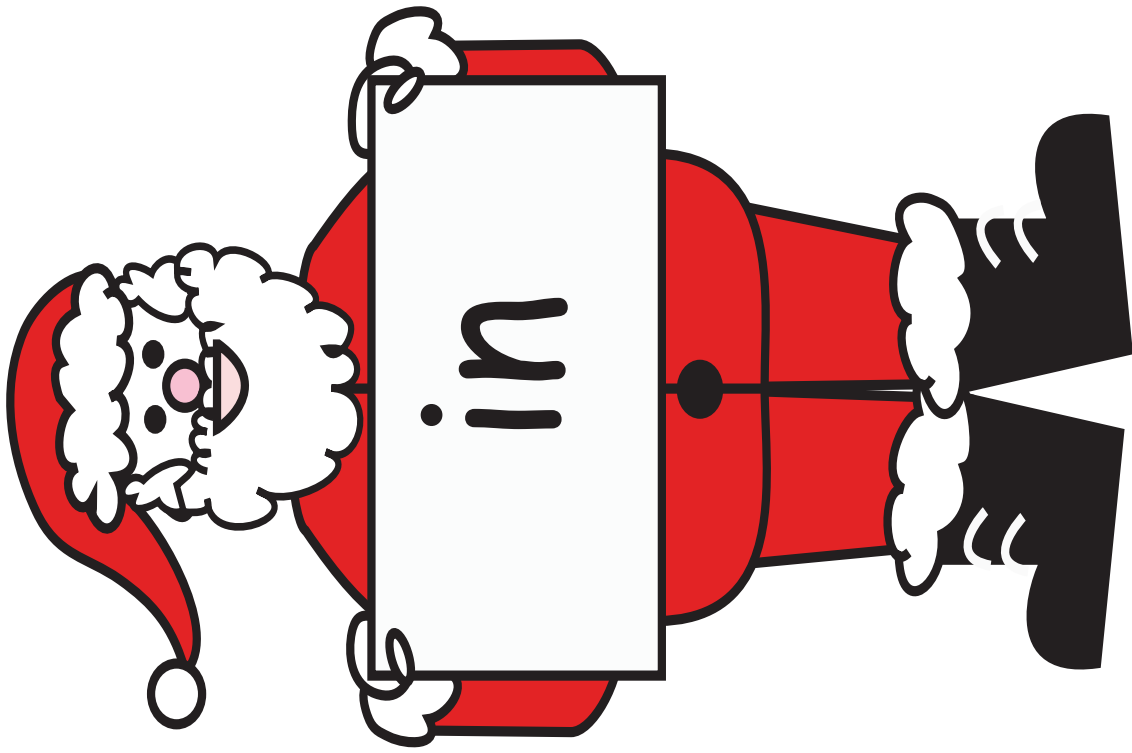


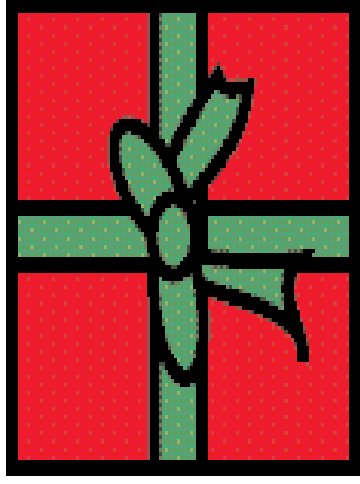


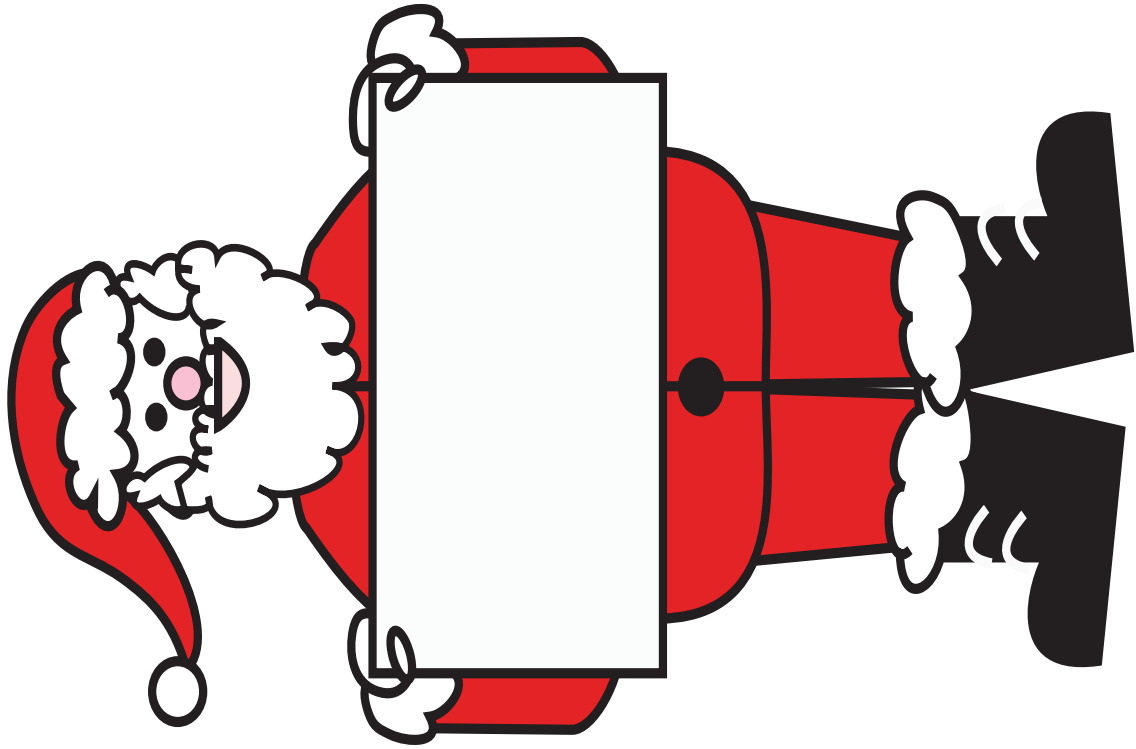
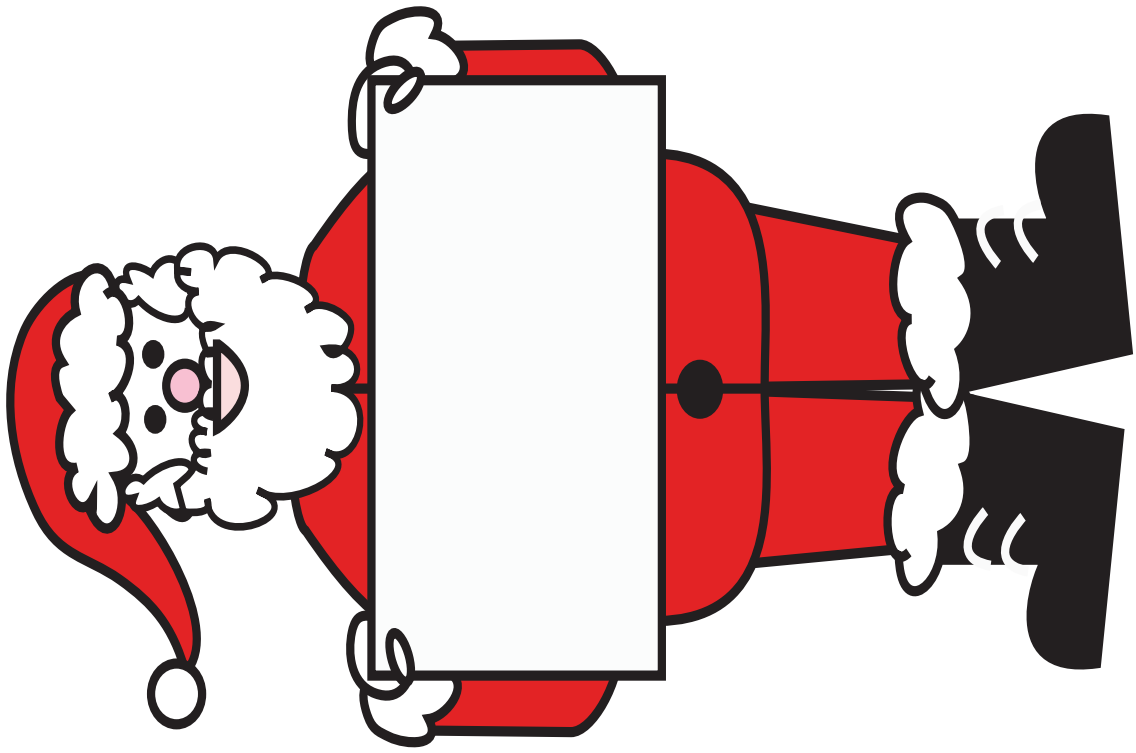








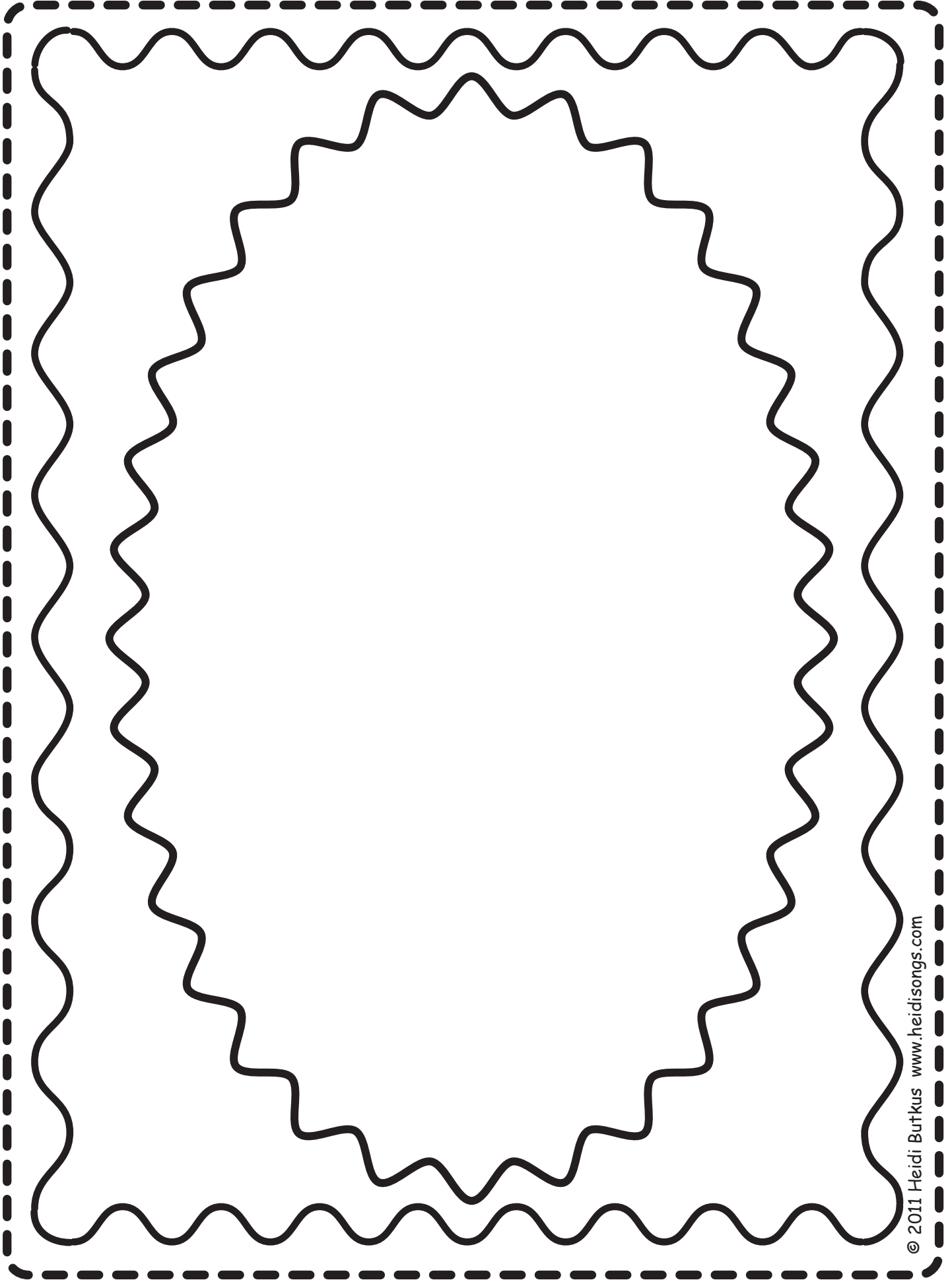


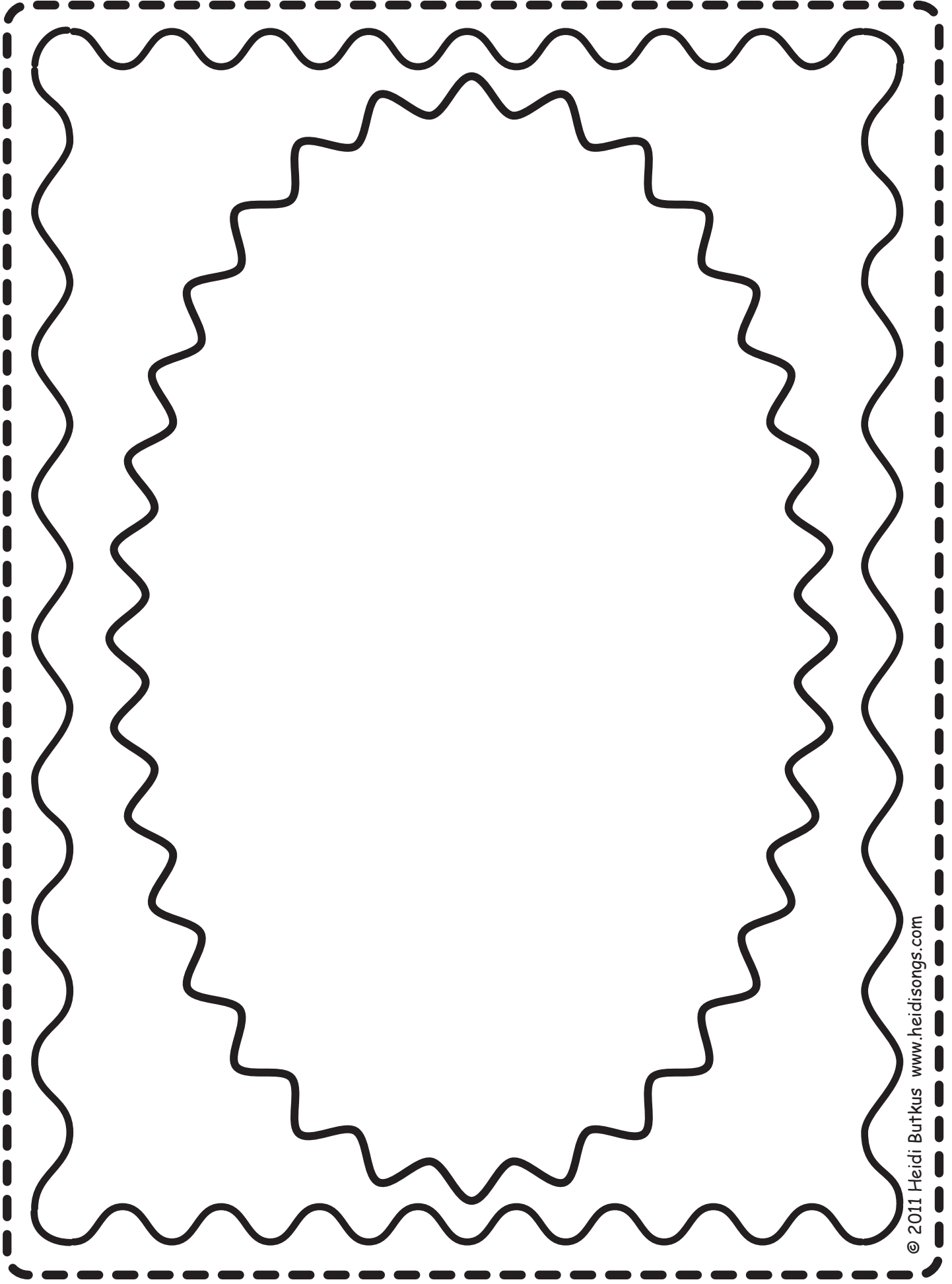


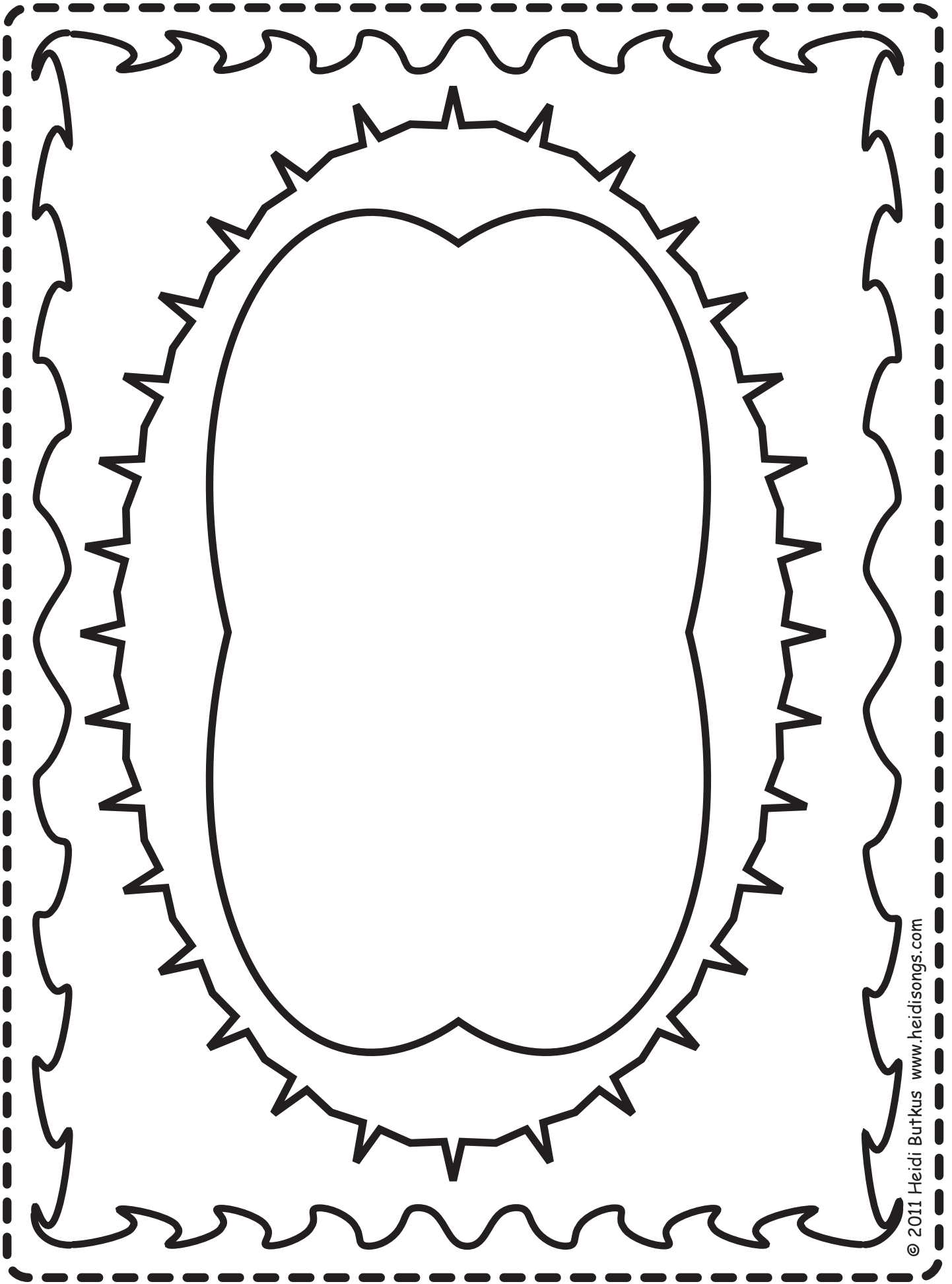

Wide Mouthed Frog Memory or Wide Mouthed Frog Sight Word Game

Note: The sight words included here are from Sing and Spell Volume Four: Fun Song for More Sight Words. However, there are some blank cards at the end of the game, just in case you would prefer to include the words of your choice.

Preparation for the Memory Game: duplicate two sets of the word cards, but no fly card.

To play the Memory Game:

Mix up the cards and place them face down on a table. Have the children take turns flipping over two cards and reading the words. If the words match, then he or she gets another turn. If not, then the turn passes to the next person.

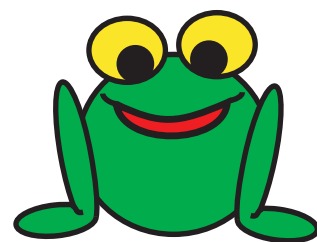
Preparation for the Sight Word Game: duplicate one set of the word cards and one fly card.

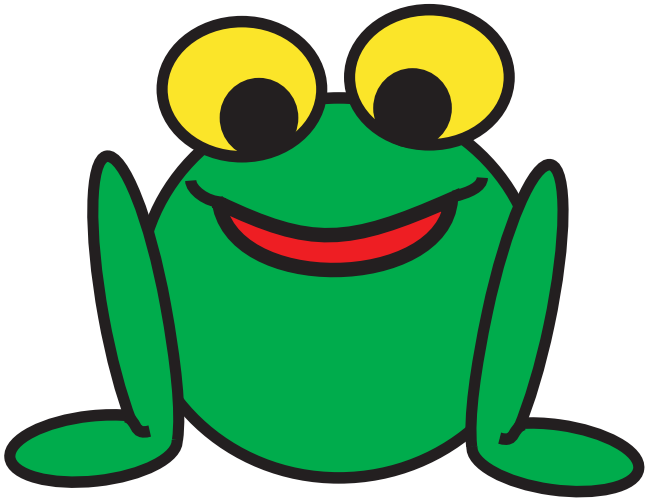
To play the Sight Word Game:

Mix up the cards and place them face UP on the table, keeping the fly card separate. Have the children cover their eyes while you hide the fly card under one of the frog word cards. The children must all chant, "Froggy, froggy! My, oh, my! Froggy, froggy, where's that fly?" Then a child attempts to read a word on one of the frog cards. After identifying a word, then he or she may lift up that word to see if the fly is underneath it. If it is, then that child is a winner and gets a piece of cereal or the treat of your choice. If not, play continues until the fly is found.

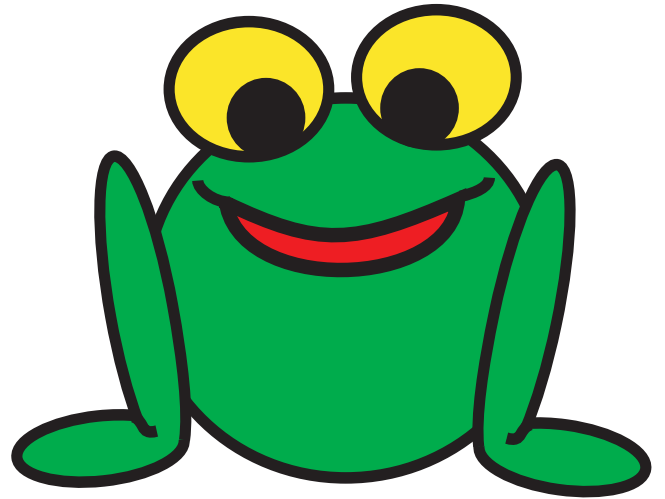
You may want to consider reducing the amount of cards that they have to choose from if the number seems a bit overwhelming.
