
## Hidden Parts of Speech Worksheets


These worksheets were designed to give children a fun way to practice identifying what the part of speech to which many common words belong. Children as young as first and second grade are now learning to identify nouns, verbs, adjectives, and more, and these worksheets allow them to color while they practice! Also, the patterns and designs presented also assist in giving the children a clue as to what part of speech each word might be, and help the worksheet to be almost self-checking! Please note that careful attention was paid to the reading level of all of the words presented, so that children as young as first grade should be able to successfully complete the worksheets – as long as they have been introduced to the parts of speech on the page. The parts of speech in this packet include: nouns, verbs, adjectives, adverbs, prepositions, pronouns (personal,) reflexive pronouns, sessive pronouns, conjunctions, and interjections.

## **Instructions:**

After introducing each part of speech, read the instructions at the top of each page with the children. They should color each word according to the instructions given. For example, nouns may be red, adjectives blue, and verbs yellow. You may also want to point out to the children that if they get the colors right for each word, they will see a picture when they are done coloring!

To make this a little easier for beginners, you may wish to have the children find and underline each word with the correct color first, and then release them to their desks to color. After that, consider spending the rest of the time circulating throughout the classroom as you ask the children to read you the words on their worksheet and identify the parts of speech of each word as they read.







