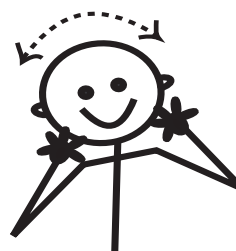
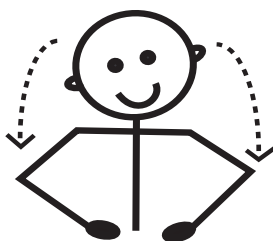
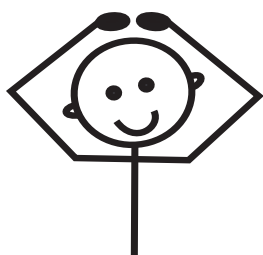
Note: The motions shown here are if you don't want the children to hold hands and form a bridge, as is done in the traditional activity.

Make the bridge fall each time you say "down".

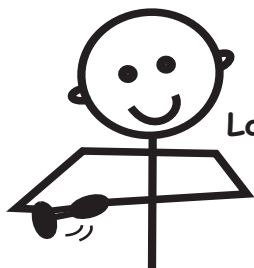
