Egg Addition

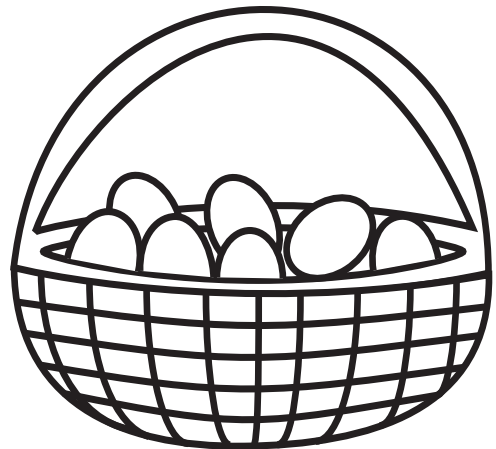
This activity can be done with plastic eggs and a basket or the paper ones provided.

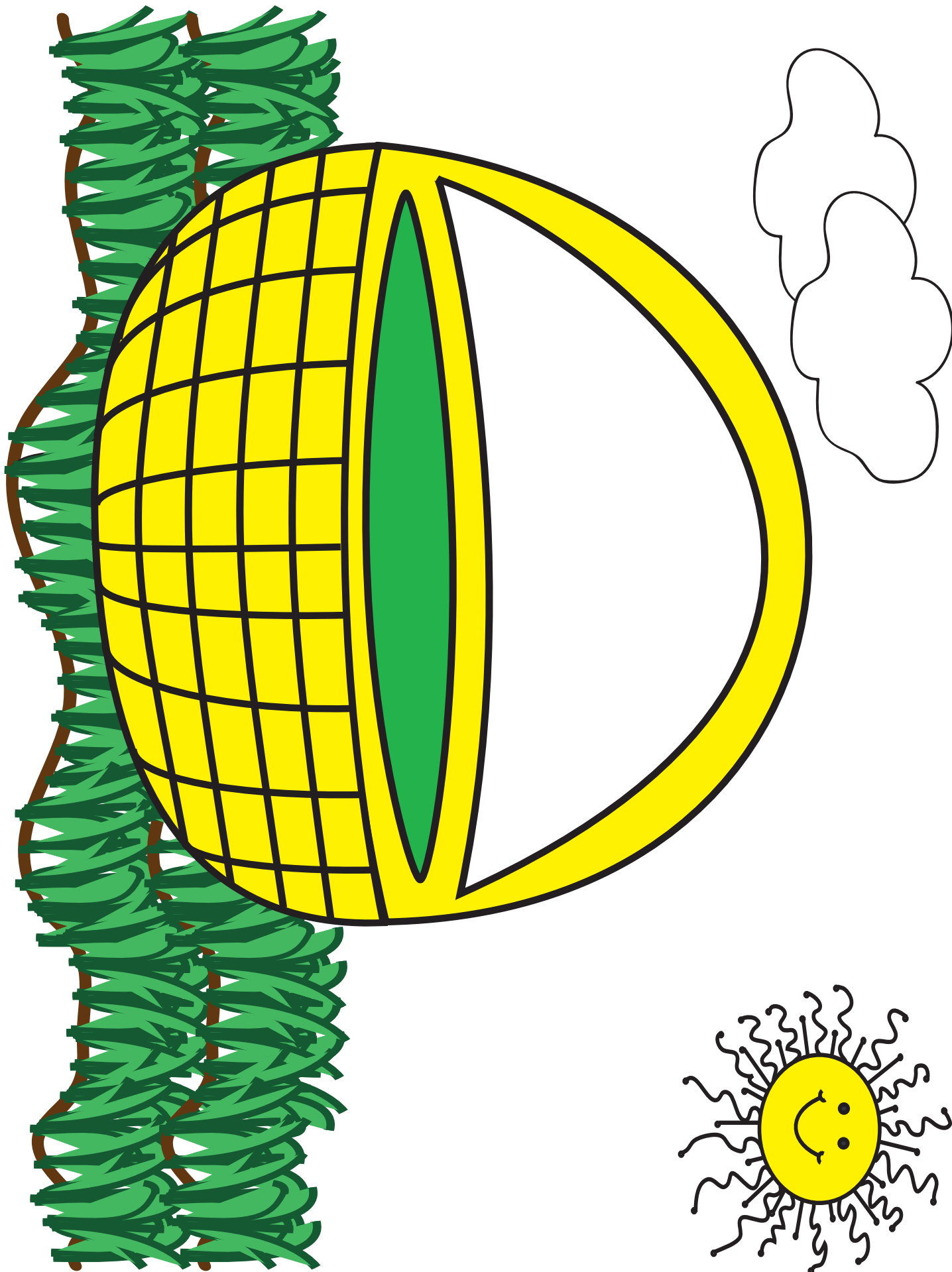
1. Print out one of the activity mats with the grass, sun, and sky either in color or black and white. Or, if you prefer, use a real spring basket! If you are going to use plastic eggs, then there is no need to print out the pages with the large eggs. Then, print the addition worksheets with the small eggs. (One sheet of eggs has designs on it, and one does not. Feel free to use whichever one you prefer, but you will need to print out two pages of eggs total.)

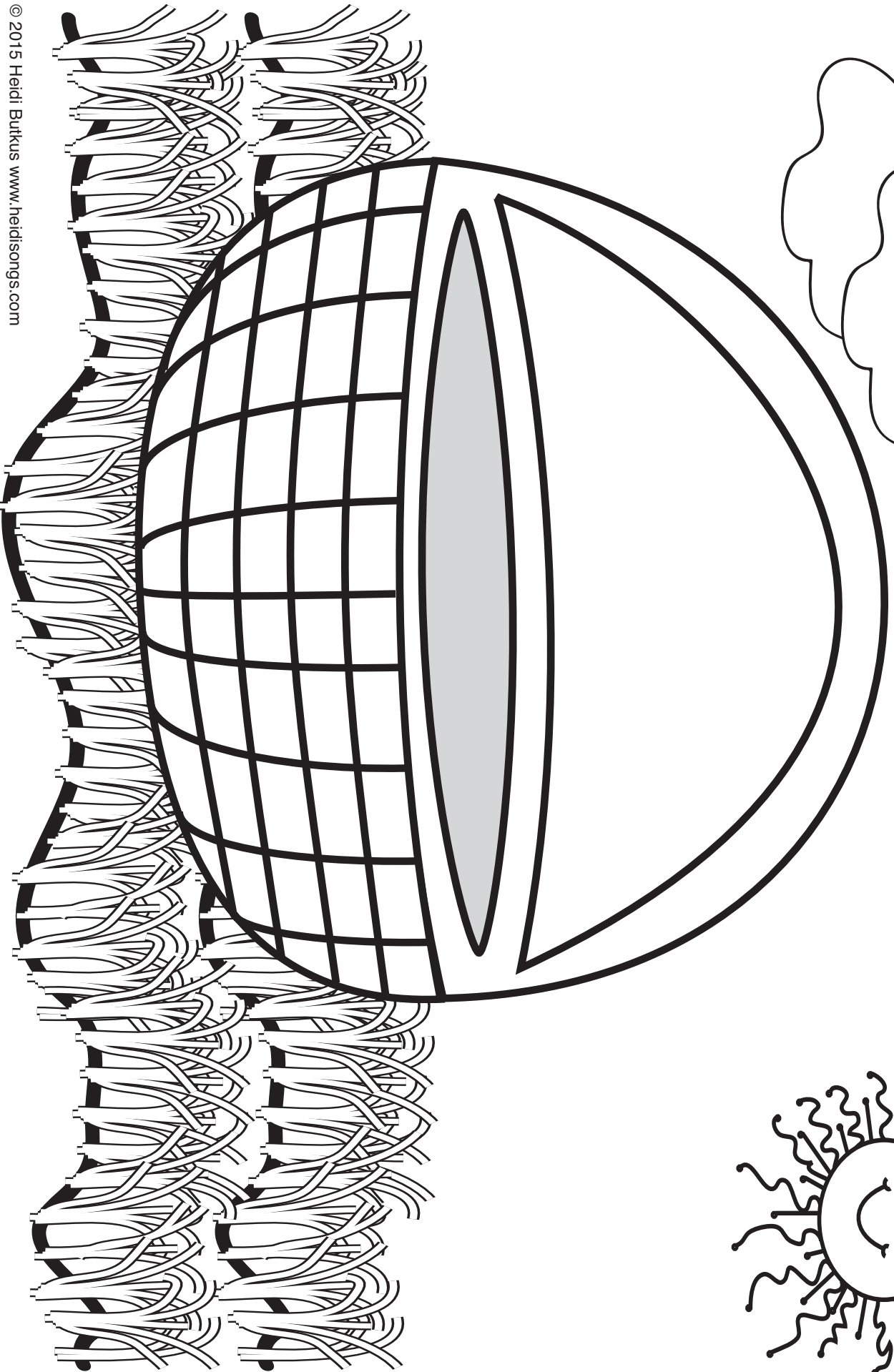
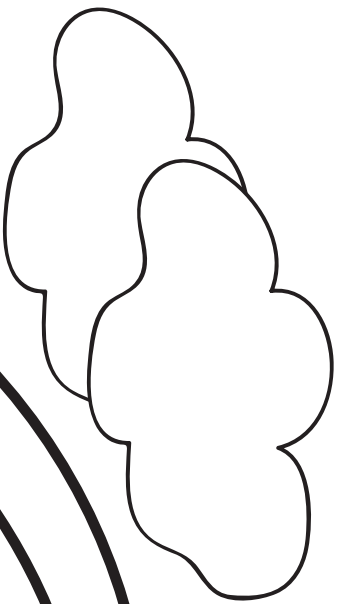
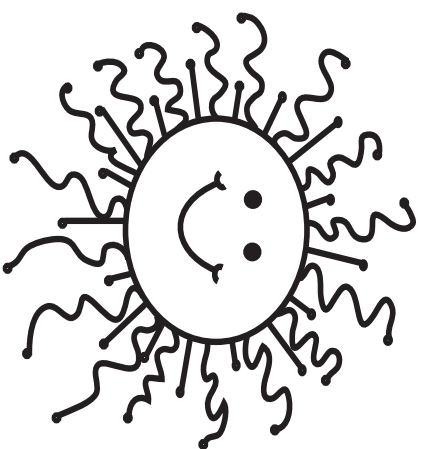
2. Look at the first problem on the worksheet. The example is $2 + 2 = 4$. Have your child place two eggs inside the basket, and then two more on the outside. Then count them all, and write the number in the space under the line. Have your learner circle both groups of eggs on the worksheet. So, if the number sentence is two plus two, then the child would circle two eggs and then another two eggs.

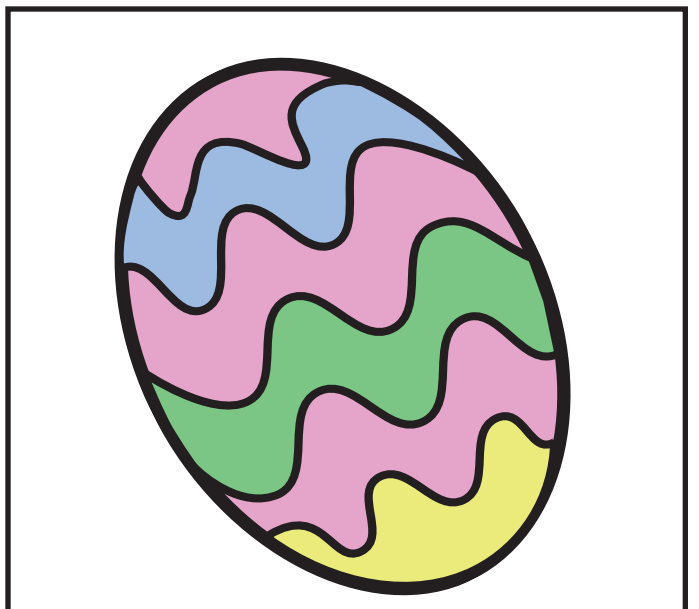
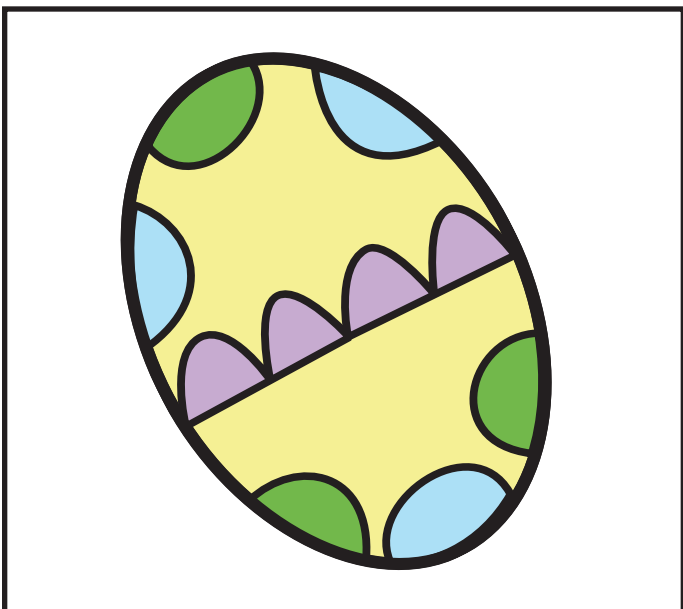
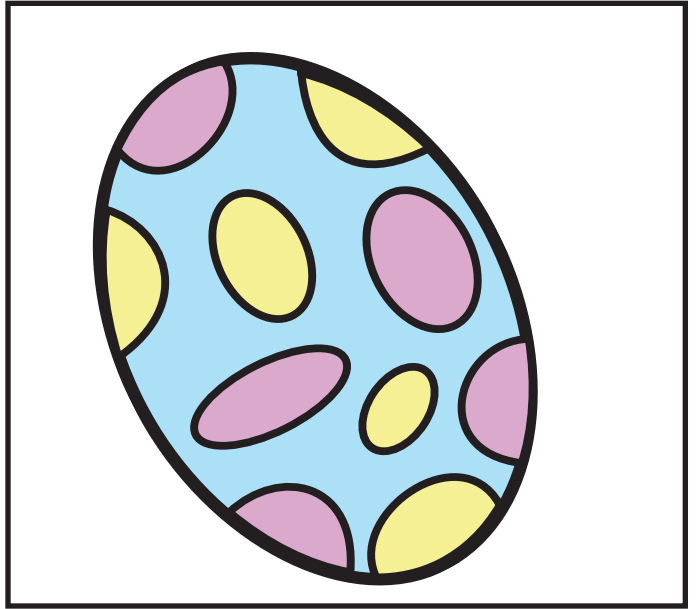
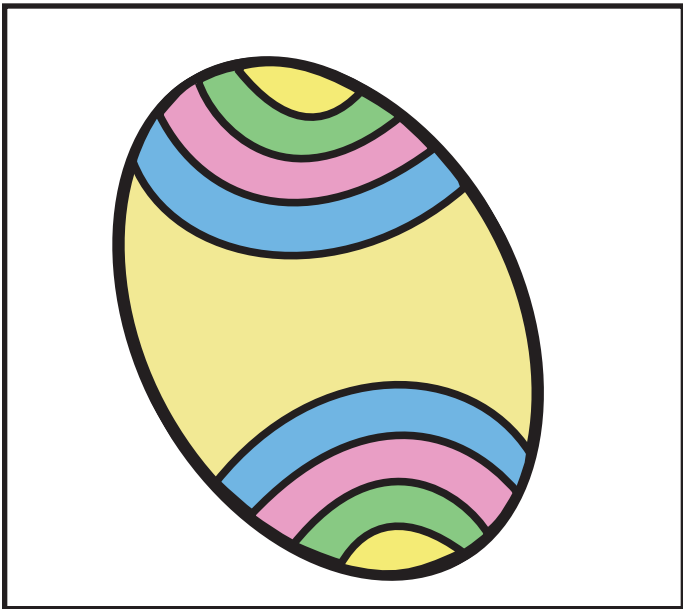
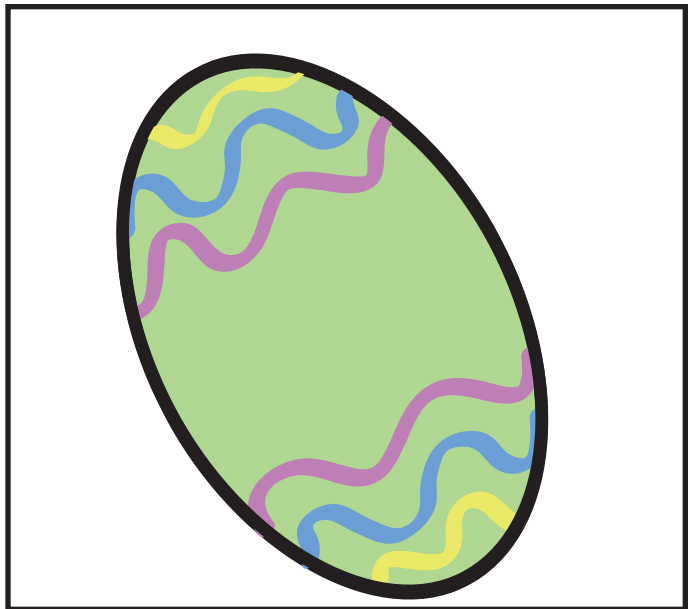
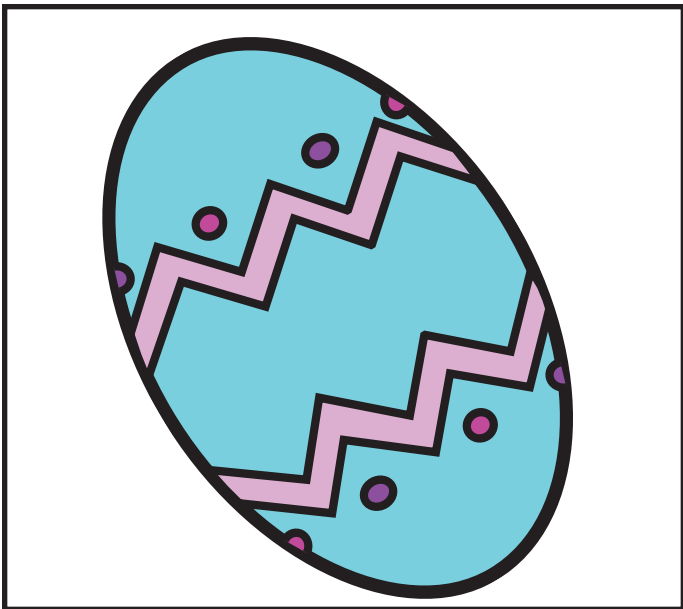
3. Have your child do this for every number sentence on the worksheets, circling both groups of eggs. Example: If the number sentence is $2 + 3$, then put two eggs in the basket and three outside the basket to form two distinct groups. Count them all. Then circle two eggs together and then three eggs together. Write the total in the space.

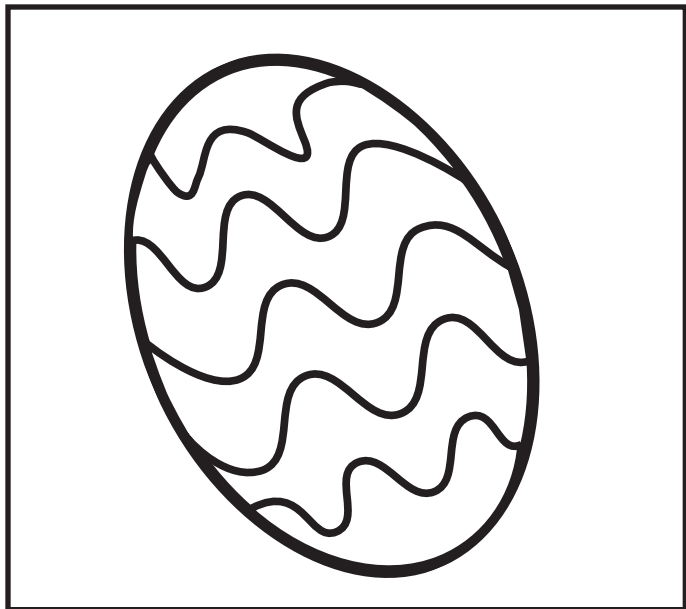
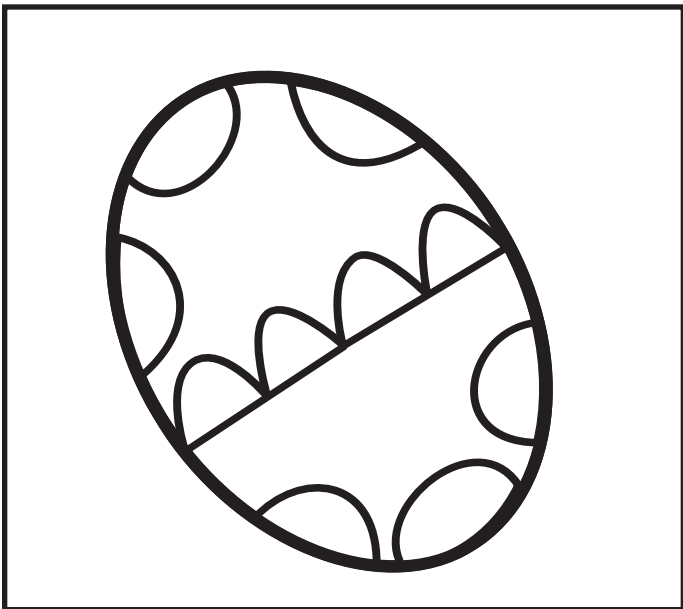
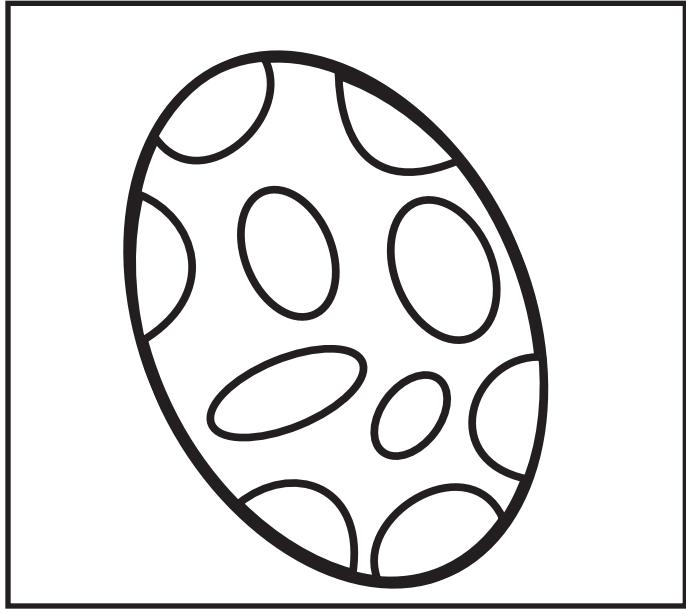
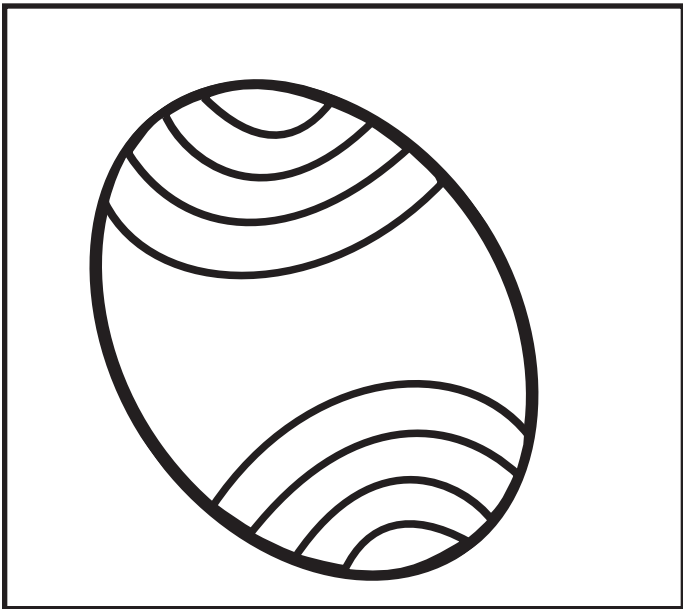
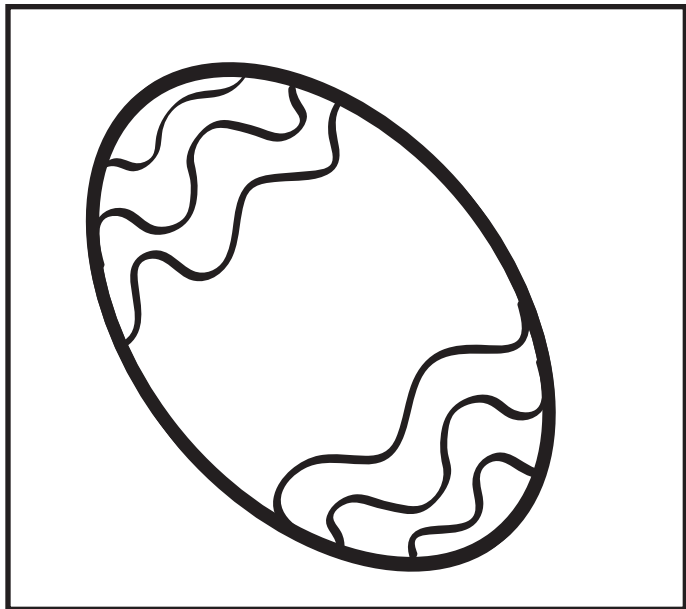
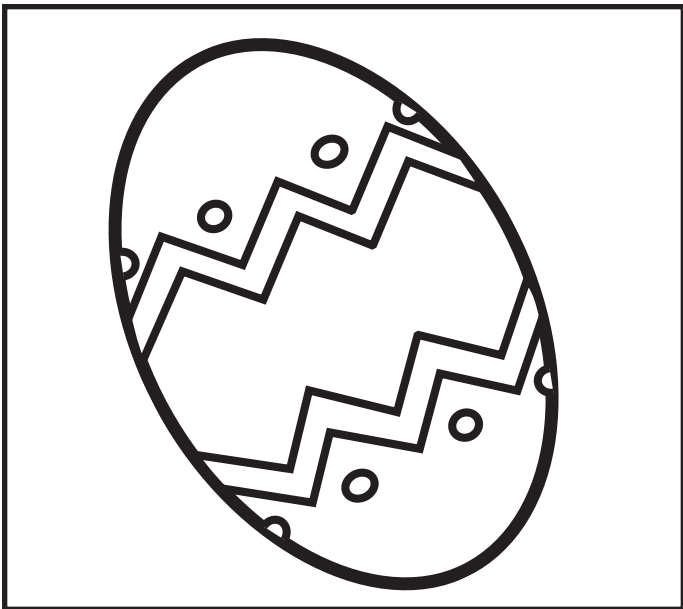
