

OFF LICENCE

Sections 17 to 20, and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

ARLA Ref: 59/OFF/167/2023

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act), CRAFT LEGENDS LIMITED (the licensee) is authorised to sell or deliver alcohol on or from the premises situated at 5 Bavaria Drive, Rolleston and known as "CRAFT LEGENDS", to any person for consumption off the premises and to supply complimentary samples of alcohol on the premises.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

CONDITIONS – SECTION 116 (2)

- (a) No Alcohol is to be delivered or collected on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1pm on ANZAC Day.
(b) No alcohol is to be delivered contrary to sections 49 and 59 (1) of the Act.
(c) Alcohol may only be sold, and/or supplied or collected on the following days and during the following hours:

Monday to Sunday from 9.00am TO 9.00pm

- (d) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
(e) The licensee must take steps to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises concerned are observed:
• Alcohol must only be sold and supplied in accordance with the premises plan submitted on 31 May 2022.
(f) The following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
• The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in their Host Responsibility Policy aimed at promoting the reasonable consumption of alcohol.
• No direct sales may be made to the public from the premises.

Section 40 ENDORSEMENT (Remote Sellers of Alcohol):

Section 40 of the Act applies to the licence, the licensee is authorised to sell and supply alcohol from the premises and deliver it somewhere else.

(g) Conditions applying to any remote sales for the sale and supply of alcohol – section 59 and Regulations 14 and 15 (Sale and Supply of Alcohol Regulations 2013):

- The following information must be displayed on the internet site in a prominent place, in any catalogue used by the licence holder and on every receipt issued for any alcohol sold via the internet site;
(i) The licence holders name, the licence number, and the date on which the licence expires.
(ii) A legible image of the licence or a clearly identified link to such image must be displayed in a prominent place on the internet site.
- The following steps must be taken to verify that people are over the purchase age;
(i) In the case of an order made using an internet site – the prospective buyer must declare by ticking an on-screen box, that he or she is 18 years of age or over (and where the prospective receiver is involved that the prospective receiver is also 18 years of age or over);
- Once, when the prospective buyer first commences the order process; and
- Again, immediately before the sale of alcohol is completed.
(ii) In the case of a telephone order, the prospective buyer is asked to declare orally that he or she is 18 years of age or over (and where the prospective receiver is also 18 years of age or over):
- Once, when the conversation concerned begins; and
- Again, immediately before the conversation is completed.
- In the case of any internet form or telephone order, unless the prospective buyer has been declaring, or by ticking, or by signing the relevant age declarations that he or she is 18 years of age or over and where any prospective receiver is involved, has declared, ticked or signed that the prospective receiver is 18 years of age or over (and where any prospective receiver is involved, has declared, ticked or signed that the prospective receiver is 18 years of age or over), the procedure is to refuse to sell alcohol to that prospective buyer.
(i) The premises shall be Undesignated

OTHER RESTRICTIONS AND REQUIREMENTS

Section 40 – Off Licence for remote sellers of alcohol

Section 59 – Requirements relating to remote sales by holders of off licences

Section 214 – Manager to be on duty at all times and responsible for compliance

Section 215 – Circumstances where s.214 does not apply (for remote sales)

THE LICENCED PREMISES

The premises situated at 5 Bavaria Drive, Rolleston are more precisely identified as outlined in a plan date stamped as received by the Selwyn District Licensing Committee.

DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE/S

A copy of this licence must be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The principal entrance is from Bavaria Drive, Rolleston.


DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force -

- (a) either -
(i) until the close of the period for which it was last renewed; or
(ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 12 months after the day it was issued; but
(b) if an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence would otherwise expire, either -
(i) until the close of the period of 3 years after the period for which it was last renewed; or
(ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 4 years after the day it was issued.

Subject to the requirements above, the licence expires on the 28th day of July 2024, unless again renewed.
