Important Information For Your Fair Visit

Have questions, need help? Go to an Information Booth!

Info Booths are located inside Brookwood Gate and at the corner of Poplar & Magnolia near the Racing Grandstand. Get a current daily schedule here.

Cash is available at ATMs located in the Racing Grandstand. There is a transaction fee. Bring a credit card to use if possible; the carnival and food & beverage stands all prefer cards.

Cell Phone Charging You can charge your cell phone inside Grace Pavilion, next to the Xfinity booth at the south end of the building.

First Aid is between the Hall of

Flowers and Grace Pavilion on Poplar Avenue. This is the place to go for anything from a bandaid to more serious medical help. EMTs are on duty, and an ambulance is stationed at the fairgrounds at all times.

Hand Washing is very important at the Fair, where you may go from visiting animals in the barn to eating a corn dog. Please make use of the hand washing stations at the Fair.

Every restroom has a Santa Rosa Memorial Hospital sink with soap and water.

Lost and Found items will be taken to the Information Booth at the entrance to the Racetrack from 12 to 8 p.m. To check on items lost after 8 p.m., and to reclaim items lost earlier in the Fair, visit the Administration Building.

Lost Children Reclaim your lost child at the Parents' Rest Station in the Kids Area, or at the First Aid Station (located outside between the Hall of Flowers and Grace Pavilion) after 8 p.m. If your child is missing, report to security or an Information Booth, then go directly to the Parents Rest Station (or First Aid after 8 p.m.). Our Security team will begin immediately working to reunite you and your child at that location. Be sure to pick up Lost Kid Stickers at an Information Booth for your children to wear. These remind everyone that the Kids Area is where lost kids and parents are reunited.

Parents Rest Station is a small building in the Kids Area where you'll find changing tables and armchairs just right for nursing; open 12 to 8 p.m.

Pets are not allowed at the Fair.

The only animals allowed on the fair-grounds (except in exhibitions), are Certified Service Animals. Service Animals, usually dogs of any breed or size, are working animals and are not considered pets. Emotional Support Animals do not qualify.

Smoking The Sonoma County Fair

is a smoke-free/vape-free facility. If you must smoke, please be sure you do so only in designated "Smoking" areas.

Water You can find water fountains in front of Finley Hall and E.C. Kraft, near the restrooms on the Carnival Lot and in the Livestock Area. Water fountains with a refill station (for your water bottle) are located in front of Finley Hall, by the Dairy Barn, Grace Pavilion and the Carnival Restrooms.

Wheelchair Accessibility All

buildings are wheelchair accessible; an elevator at the north end of the racing grandstand provides access to the grandstand upper level.

NEW FAIR POLICY Only Clear Bags at Gate

To keep things safe and smooth at the Fair entrance, we're introducing a Clear Bag Policy. This move will speed up bag checks and enhance security, so you can get to the fun faster!

What bags can I bring?

You can bring clear bags that are not larger than 12" x 12" x 2", small purse-like bags that fit in your hand not larger than 4.5" x 6.5", and bags for baby or medical needs if we can check them first.

Can I bring my diaper bag?

Yes, diaper bags are allowed for guests with infants and toddlers. Please have them ready for security screening upon entry.

Can I bring a blanket or a jacket?

Absolutely, you can bring blankets and jackets. Just have them out for quick screening at the entrance.

What about privacy for personal items, like medication?

We recommend packing such items in a small clutch that meets our size requirements (4.5" x 6.5"). These will be subject to a security check, ensuring your privacy is respected.

Can I bring a bigger bag for shopping inside the Fairgrounds?

Yes! The clear bag is just for getting through security at the gate. Once you're inside, feel free to shop and use a bigger bag for all your finds. You can even bring an empty, foldable non-clear bag in your clear bag and use it inside the Fairgrounds.

Are all bags subject to search?

Yes, for the safety of everyone at the fairgrounds, all bags are subject to search upon entry.

Wheelchair, Scooter Rental

Located inside the Brookwood Gate.

Scooters: \$35 half day (up to 3 hours), \$60 full day. **Wheelchairs:** \$20

Payment: Credit Card, no cash please. ID required at time of rental.

Fairgoers of all ages are invited to head out to the Barn and visit Sweet Lil's Farmery at the 2024 Fair. Young children will find lots to do and enjoy, from soft furry animals to pet and feed, farm animals to meet, fun photo ops, and a chance to learn the basics of Sonoma County Agriculture while having a good time. Thanks to our sponsors, Sweet Lil's is free with Fair admission, and you won't need to pay for anything in the building.

Sweet Lil's is in Saralee & Richard's Barn, near the entrance to the Livestock Area. This exhibit honors the important mission of increasing ag literacy in Sonoma County, embodied by Saralee & Richard Kunde's legacy. You and your kids will walk through exhibits that take you back in time, through the history of Sonoma County agriculture. You will learn all about what came before the vineyards, and what might come next.

Visitors can learn about agriculture through the animals housed at Sweet Lil's. You can pet, feed, and get to know the animals as you get "up close and personal." Keep your eyes open for cow kisses and other adventures that can come when you interact with live animals. Other exhibits offer opportunities for learning and fun. You can watch and help name the goats that will be racing during the Farmers Day Program on August 4. (Yes, racing goats!) Slide through time with the Quack Shack Duck Slide experience. Meet some miniature animals and say hello to the rabbits and chickens. You will find more surprises around every corner.



Becoming LGBTQI-Friendly


Sonoma County LGBTQI Timeline on Display at Fair

Sonoma County has always had an LGBTQI presence. But how did Sonoma County become an LGBTQI-friendly place to live? What did gender nonconformity look like in this area during the 1970s and 80s? How did Guerneville become the vacation destination for gay men from around the US? Did you know the Women's Studies programs at SSU and SRJC were two of the first such programs in California? How did Sonoma County help stop a national anti-LGBTQ movement? Which organizations worked to save the lives of people dying from HIV/AIDS?

The Sonoma County LGBTQI Timeline

tells this history through images and the words of the people who lived here. Find these answers, and more, when you look at the Sonoma County LGBTQI History Timeline. You can find it in the Garrett Building, just inside the Main Gate on Brookwood Avenue.

Tina Dungan and Shad Reinstein are the creators of the Sonoma County LGBTQI Timeline, which premiered at PRIDE 2018. As they research the LGBTQI history of Sonoma County, the timeline continues to expand.

New to the Track?

Basic Tips For Novice Betters

If you are an inexperienced horse racing fan, there are several ways to get started betting. Gather some friends and make a party out of your day at the track! You can buy tickets online to sit together in the racing grandstand. There is food available, and several nearby bars. You can spend the afternoon at the track, and then stay at the Fair for dinner and see the rest of the Fair that evening.

If you want to do some research before you come to the track, there are many sources of information online. Just search for "horse racing for beginners" and you will have lots of choices. But If you just want to dive in, come to the track and easily start with a few basics. There are many types of bets, but for your first attempt, make it simple and bet on WIN (first), PLACE (second), or SHOW (third).

Bettors can use the betting machines or go to a window with a live mutual clerk. If you are a first-time bettor and would like help, see our promotion team members and learn how to use the betting machines. The team is located on the first floor. Look for the table decorated with balloons and posters. Our team will walk you through the process, and in no time, you'll be betting like an old hand!

Besides \$2+ to place a bet, what do you need for a day at the races?

The Racing Program has information on all the horses, jockeys, trainers, and owners. The cost is \$3. Without a program, you won't have the information you need to place your bets.

The Daily Racing Form (DRF):

The DRF provides the past performances of all the horses running on the day's program and includes informative horse racing articles and handicapping by the DRF. The DRF is available for purchase at the north grandstand entrance ticket booth. Not as essential as the Racing Program, but filled with interesting information.

Just a few more things...don't forget the sunscreen, and you might want to bring binoculars to see your favorite horse cross the finish line!

The contestants might be small, but the excitement is huge! Wine Country Racing fans will have something extra to look forward to during Sunday's rac-

es at the Sonoma County Fair. Everyone's favorite little dog race event is back with lots of eager new participants.

The Derby Dog Dash pits pups against each other as they

race towards the finish line on the Sonoma County Fair racetrack. Watch Pekes and Poodles. Chihuahuas and Cockapoos compete for cash prizes; any small pure or mixed breed dog can enter! The races take place in between bouts of live horse racing. There's no official betting on the Derby Dogs, but feel free to wager amongst yourselves! Two escorts join each dog on the track, with one person 'starting' the dog, and the other standing at the finish line, urging the dog on to victory. Admission to the Fair is free for dog owners, with two free admissions per dog. Owners are encouraged to enter as many dogs as possible. If you have a pack of small dogs at home, this is your chance for a group outing! (If entries exceed 108 dogs, owners will be limited to two dogs per human competitor.)

Derby Dog races take place on August 4, August 11, and August 18 at the racing grandstand. The first two days of the Dash are during regular Fair racing (August 4, and 11), and August 18 is the last day of this year's 'bonus week' of racing after the rest of

the Fair has ended.

The first dog race will go off between the second and third horse races of the afternoon, with dog races continuing between horse races. The Championship Race will follow the initial heats. The top two finishers from each heat will advance to the Championship Race at the end of the race day. The winner of each heat will receive \$20 and the second-place finisher will receive \$10. The first-place winner of the Championship Race will receive \$100, second place will receive \$50. Don't expect to see these speedy dogs around the Fair. The dogs must remain in the Grandstand Area and are not permitted to visit the rest of the Fairgrounds. If

you want to see the competitors, you will need to go to the races.

Stomp Team: 1 Stomper + 1 Swabby

When putting together a contending stomp team, it's important to consider your strengths and weaknesses. Be honest with yourself...are you OK with standing up on stage jumping up and down in a barrel full of grapes, while the crowd cheers?



Which member of your team has the longest, strongest arms? Who has the most endurance? Yes, big feet will help at the beginning, but it's the stomper who can keep at it for the whole stomp who brings one the prize. But most of all, remember not to take your partner for granted. Stompers and swabbies come in teams, so grab a friend and consider the following:

Stomper – Stands in a barrel full of grapes, uses their feet to squish out the juice.

Swabby - Stands below a barrel full of grapes while a stomper is stomping and makes sure nothing stops the grape juice from getting into the jug. Strong arms a plus!

Finally...can you trade places during the stomp? No! Even if it wasn't against the rules, there really isn't time -- each preliminary stomp lasts just three minutes!



Ag Mechanics

Vocational Education on Display in Finley Hall

If you didn't know better, you might think part of Finley Hall is a showroom for high-end furniture or sheet-metal and ironwork creations. The pieces are for sale, but they are actually the work of local ag-mechanics junior exhibitors. Ag mechanics is part of the "Industrial Arts" department - it includes entries from students enrolled in vocational classes at school or 4-H & FFA members who are mentored within the community. The entries include electrical skills, metal arts, welding, woodworking, and projects that were completed using at least 2 of those processes.

Some of these items will be sold at auction. The Auction items are required to be entered into the Auction division. The entries are anything that could be entered into the Industrial Arts department but they're normally larger, special projects like BBQs, dining tables, benches, art pieces. Exhibitors are allowed to sell one item per year and those items are judged by a panel consisting of all the ag mechanics judges.

Model Train Club Build Railroad in Garrett Bldg

Trains are coming to the Fair! Local HO scale club Mainline Modular Model Railroad Club is returning for a second year, creating a 40'x26' display in the Garrett Building. The layout will feature a double track mainline so multiple trains can be run in two directions. There is talk of a circus train, so stop by to check it out! Club members will be on hand to answer questions and run the trains.

Each section of the railroad is independently owned, and the theme of each section varies. Members run a variety of equipment ranging from passenger trains to freight trains pulled by either steam locomotives or diesel units. The display will include landscaping, structures, and more.

Mainline Modular Model Railroad Club started in 2019, as an offshoot of an earlier club. With a core membership of 12, they meet every Friday night to work on models and run trains. They are a modular group, which means the layout is portable and can be assembled when they meet.

Most of the members have been into model railroading most of their lives, with over 60 years of experience associated with the railroad on display at the Fair. Wonky House Quilt Five-Year Quilt Project on Display

Welcome Home Quilters was an active group of volunteers in Sonoma County for many decades. These guilters sewed hundreds of quilts for the children and families who moved into homes built by Habitat for Humanity in Sonoma County over the years. They also donated time and money. For many years the Welcome Home Quilters also made quilts for Habitat fundraising raffles. With a different theme each year, the guilters worked at meetings and at home to create quilts. In 2017, they decided to make a "wonky" quilt, using a common background fabric and other fabrics to make houses and buildings. There were no set patterns, so each quilter did their own thing. The plan was to lay out all the houses, buildings, and trees once they were finished, and figure out how they all fit together. Unfortunately, work on the quilt came to a halt in 2019, when the club learned that Habitat for Humanity would no longer be building homes in Sonoma County. Welcome Home Quilters disbanded.

Quilter Toni Saunders took the unfinished Wonky House Quilt pieces home. Over the course of a year, she sewed the wonky houses, buildings, and trees

together to make an amazing quilt top. She then handed the quilt top to Jan Taylor, and there it sat for a couple of years. The guilt still needed to be assembled, and all the finishing touches added. Jan had developed arthritis in her hands and couldn't do the job. When she looked at the quilt top, she was inspired by the countless hours spent on the pieces! It was clear to her that the guilt needed to be finished, but she did not know how to get it done. Fortunately, Jan Taylor's husband, Joe, offered to sew the quilt back. With her guidance and the help of other volunteers, the quilt was finally finished! The Welcome Home Quilters are happy to be able to display the Wonky House Quilt at the Fair this year as a tribute to all those who worked together to make it happen. And a special thanks to all who donated fabric, time, and talent! You can see the Wonky House Quilt in the Garrett Building during the 2024 Sonoma County Fair.




LOS FUGITIVOS 8-9:00 p.m.
