Rules

- This is a sanctioned show and is recognized by the International Llama Registry (ILR). ILR rules, definitions, and judging procedures govern provided they do not conflict with Division of Fairs or Department of Food and Agriculture rules and regulations.
- ILR requires a \$3 fee per animal entered (example: if you have three llamas entered, the fee is \$9). This fee is due at the time of check-in, payable to ILR, only cash or check accepted)
- 3. Original International Llama Registry (ILR) certificates required at check-in.
- 4. Owner/ exhibitor information must match entry and registration paperwork.
- 5. Llamas may be shown in youth or adult performance classes but not both.
- If there are less than six entries in any two youth divisions the youth divisions may be combined.
- 7. Pens are 10' x 11', horse stalls. Space is limited.
- All llamas shall be presented for judging with a halter and a lead rope and no additional decorations, including but not limited to: tassels, pompoms, or other removable decorations.
- Crias may not accompany nursing llama mothers; it is recommended not to show nursing mother.
- 10. Fair staff or the judge may dismiss unruly animals from the ring. Animals may be dismissed even prior to entering the ring if deemed unruly.
- 11. All llamas must be shown in the correct age and sex classification.
- Llamas may be entered in only one halter class or wool division. It is the responsibility
 of the exhibitor to place their llama in the correct division and class.
- 13. Large classes may be divided for judging at the request of the judge; only one set of awards will be given for the class as a whole.
- 14. Llamas may not be moved from one class to another after halter judging has begun except at the judges discretion.
- 15. All llamas must have a halter on at all times while on the fairgrounds.
- 16. All llamas five months and older, must be registered or listed with the ILR.
- Any llama with ILR listing can show in performance, showmanship, youth, and other
 optional classes. Llamas must be "LL" IRL registered to be shown in halter and fleece
 classes.
- 18. Animal's age determined by show date.
- 19. State Rule: No exhibitor shall recieve more than two cash awards in any one class using American judging system.

Division 2901 – Suri Wool - Should have natural luster and hand drape over the llama's body, usually forming a natural part along the spine. The fiber is also characterized by the absence of crimp and minimal loft

Division 2902 – Silky Wool - Should have natural luster, some loft, some wave or crinkle but no crimp. The guard hair is nearly indiscernible and the fiber exhibits very soft or silky handle.

Division 2903 – Light Wool - Minimal body wool, short neck wool with smooth legs.

Division 2904 – Medium Wool - Moderate to long body wool, minimal to moderate neck wool, smooth to moderate leg wool.

Division 2905 – Heavy Wool - Abundant body and neck wool with minimal to abundant leg wool. **Classes**

Point Performance Rules:

- 3. Llamas are limited to one attempt at each obstacle. After three refusals of three separate obstacles, the judge will dismiss the animal from the course.
- 4. A diagram of all courses will be posted at least one hour before the scheduled class.
