
Students who attend PreK are 48% more likely to obtain an associate's degree than those who didn't attend Pre-K.

Pre-K students show 61% improvement in letter/word recognition compared to students who didn't attend Pre-K.



Pre-K students are more than twice as likely to be ready for Kindergarten compared to students who didn't attend Pre-K.

Students who attend PreK are 23% more likely to attend a fouryear college than those who didn't attend Pre-K.
