## Trees

It may seem odd to list trees for rabbits given a tree's height and a rabbit's reach. However, bunnies will sometimes eat the bark off of some trees, especially in winter when other food is scarce. If bunnies are a huge problem in your area, use a barrier around all young new trees. Those listed below are ones they don't prefer.

Bunnies, though adorable, can wreak havoc on gardens that contain food they enjoy. You can try to curtail their damage by choosing plants that rank lower on their list of preferred food. For added protection, you may choose to use repellent sprays (must re-apply after rain), barriers, or perhaps even planting a diversion patch of something bunnies love (parsley) to keep them away from your gardens.

The plants listed below are ones that they do not prefer. However, if food is scarce, as in times of drought, rabbits will eat just about anything. They tend to do the most damage to tender young sprouts in Spring & Early Summer. So, if you have plants that bunnies enjoy in your landscape, consider sprays or barriers during this time.

**\*denotes plants that are drought tolerant once established.**
