Well soitenly the Three Stooges live on

Some describe it as slapstick, a longrunning act that featured three grown men, each with an identifiable stage persona, not to mention an equally distinctive hairdo. Think sight gags and lots of physical (or simulated physical) contact, along with a healthy sprinkling of over-the-top sound effects and wiseguy threats ("Why, I oughta. . ."). Maybe comedian Moe Howard got it right when he labeled this brand of entertainment as "farcical comedy." But whatever it's called, one thing is clear: Generations of audiences have long laughed at the antics of the Three Stooges. And dedicated fans still collect a variety of memorabilia related to "Hollywood's Sensational Screwballs."

Beginning in the early 1920s, two brothers from Brooklyn, Moe and Shemp


Howard, teamed up with a childhood friend to form a vaudeville act, "Ted Healy and His Stooges." Thus marked the beginning of show business careers that would endure for the next halfcentury. Along the way, the act evolved, as the Stooges became an independent act, not a backup to another comedian.

Several changes in personnel ensued, with the addition of Philadelphian Larry Fine. And while Moe and Larry remained the "constants" of the act, there would be four comedians who, for a variety of

Ferrari screamed away with \$37,000 at Briggs estate auction

GARNETT VALLEY, Pa. — On September 29, Briggs Auction held an exceptional curated fine estates auction featuring an exciting pair of classic cars, antique and mid-century modern furniture, decorative and fine art, silver, and jewelry from selected Delaware Valley

Arguably the most sensational item was a red 1984 Ferrari 308 GTS Quattrovalvole like the one featured in the 1980s TV series, Magnum P.I. This classic supercar, with a 2.9-liter V8 quad-cam engine, five-speed manual transmission, and only 67,250 miles, racked up the auction's high of \$37,000.

Designer mid-century furniture was one of the spotlighted categories and the offerings did not disappoint. A Tobia Scarpa for Cassina Model 925 lounge chair with a dark walnut frame and leather-covered seat/back exceeded high estimates five-fold, grabbing \$3,400. Going for twice its high estimate, at \$2,200, was an 88-inch Jydsk Mobelvaerk Interform Collection Danish modern rosewood sofa on chrome legs. Bidding went to \$700 for an amazing set of eight Sinda, Canada

sculpted walnut dining chairs with upholstered seats/backs.

Including the furniture, sixteen lots hit five-figure winning bids. Grabbing the auction's second-highest sum of \$3,800 was a 39 ½ x 21 ½-inch early 20th-century Louis Vuitton monogram steamer trunk with the original liner and key. An Irish 4 1/2-inch diameter silver-covered round box with a domed lid, totaling 9.96 troy ounces, bid to \$2,200. And, a 26-inch diameter stained and leaded glass hanging lampshade, attributed to New York's Duffner & Kimberly, reached \$1,400.

The auction commenced with vintage jewelry, with Native American pieces at the outset. The first lot, a sterling sil-

ver Concho belt with 12 alternating turquoise-mounted cabochons and a sterling buckle went for \$475. A silver cuff bracelet totaling 1.30 troy ounces snagged \$175. It featured a carved bear design and was signed by maker Doug Chilton (Tlingit/Pacific Northwest, 20th-century). Grabbing a bit less, at \$125, was a Navajo sterling silver cuff bracelet, weighing in at 2.13 troy ounces. That piece was set with azurite, malachite, and onyx and was signed and dated 1986 by Thomas R. O' Keef.

After the Native American pieces came world jewelry, including an Italian 18K vellow gold foliate-form pendant brooch that soared to \$1,700. The piece featured a central 12mm x 9mm emerald cut tourmaline surrounded by cut peridots and diamonds (31.9 dwt). A pair of Tiffany & Company 18k yellow and white gold rope twist clip-on earrings brought \$900.

Henkle Harris furniture to be offered at River City Auction

DANVILLE, Va. - Several pieces of Henkle Harris furniture will be offered at an online auction that features two generations of carefully selected furnishings and art.

The Compson family admired antiques, but also collected items that complemented antiques in their spacious home. Among those items were several pieces of Henkel Harris furniture made in nearby Winchester, Virginia. Henkel Harris started just after World War II and is still making furniture.

"I think Henkel Harris will be one of the leading antiques of the future," said Auctioneer Rita Smith of River City Auction Co., which will be conducting

The owners of the Henkel Harris company appreciated the design of early American and European furniture, and very studiously copied the work of their predecessors. As an example, a 92inch Henkle Harris highboy, signed and numbered, is not only an impeccable reproduction of an early American highboy, but it also originally cost the Compost family \$30,000, according to Smith.



That piece is starting at a \$1,500 bid and there is no reserve. The sale is ongoing until Oct. 17, with the closings beginning at 7 a.m.

The consignor, 67-year-old Michael

Compson, is moving to an assistant living center after losing his wife in May. In his day, Compson was a very successful photographer, following in the footsteps of his father Ray Michael Compson Sr., who developed a highly lucrative career in commercial photography. On an assignment in New York, he became enamored with a model who he later married, according to his granddaughter Miki Younger.

cups, and a Cartier sterling basket, all totaling 21.86 troy ounces exceeded silver value, at \$550. A collection of seven American sterling silver tongs from makers like Tiffany, Wallace, and others, totaling 10 troy ounces, hit its metal value at \$325.

The silver was followed by 18 quality Persian, Pakistani, and Navajo rugs. Landing the highest in the category, at \$950, was an 11 by 8-foot circa 1930s red Persian Sarouk room-size carpet. A bid of \$900 won an 11 by 8-foot Heriz carpet with central red ground and ivory corners.

At the auction's midpoint, the first of multiple rounds of wall art were auctioned. With a few exceptions, most sold modestly in the low \$100s. One painting by Pennsylvania artist Tony Fachet (1945-1998) caught bidders' eyes. It was a 20 ½ by 26 ½-inch framed photo-realism-style oil on canvas of tobacco pipes, signed and dated to 1971. It brought

\$450. Six other Fachets sold from \$150-\$375. A 30 ½ by 36 ½-inch acrylic on canvas bayou landscape by Louisiana artist Lloyd Hawthorne (1924-2003), signed and dated 1961, did even better at \$650.

Three-dimensional art was similarly abundant and included everything from antique Chinese porcelain to modern sculpture. A five-piece lot of early esoteric carved items like an early Roman Palaimon plaque, a carved warrior figurine, and a wooden portrait block, bid to over ten times high estimates at \$3,200. A 55-inch-wide early 20th-century electrified Continental carved wood nativity Presepio went for \$700. More contemporary, a signed Jane Peiser (American, b. 1933) salt-glazed vase with an abstract motif of a woman's face, went home for \$350.

There were 19 lots of antique and vintage microscopes with their wooden cas-

es that proved interesting, though didn't generate dramatic prices. The highest unit sold for \$225; it was a 19th-century Hartnack brass compound microscope with an articulated magnifier and mirror. Its purple silk-lined case was by Broadhurst-Clarkson of London. An early Bausch & Lomb student microscope with a two-lens turret, lacking its condenser, pulled \$100.

Toward the auction's end, 18 pieces of unusual Adirondack furniture were offered. A pair of Maine-crafted rustic Adirondack-style three-tier end tables, that hailed from the mid-century era, ran up \$150. A companion dressing table with a painted case, birch elements, and carved trout decoration hit \$125, while the

matching one-drawer nightstand with applied birch branch elements pulled \$80.

As for that second car? It was a green Oldsmobile Cutlass Supreme with a green vinyl interior. It was equipped with a V8 with four-barrel carburetor, automatic transmission, power steering, and power brakes. As of October 6, it still was available at a buy-it-now price of \$15,000.

What time is it? Time to key in on Seth Thomas clocks

The mantel clock timepiece is perhaps the most coveted by collectors. And no name affixed to mantel clocks stands out more than Seth Thomas.

It may surprise some that Grand Central Terminal's clock was manufactured by Seth Thomas. This four-sided clock carries a \$20 million price tag. But it was the small, affordable mantel clock that caught the eye of people over the past 200 years and has clock collectors' attention today.

According to Javeria Saud of Jacqueline Rare Antique, "the most well-liked designs of clocks produced by Seth Thomas' company were mantel clocks, so named because they often hang over fireplace mantels. As a result, it's the type people have the greatest chance of having."

Seth Thomas, born in 1785, was an amateur clockmaker who began his career in earnest when he moved to Plymouth, Connecticut in 1807. Building homes and barns was the majority of Thomas' early employment as an apprentice woodworker. However, Eli Terry hired Thomas to work for him in 1807 after noticing his woodworking abilities.

In the early 1800s, American clock making was revolutionized by Terry

and his associates, Seth Thomas and Silas Hoadley, when they pioneered mass production manufacturing of clocks for homes.

Seth Thomas Clocks

In 1810, Thomas and Hoadley bought Terry's Connecticut factory. Three years later, Thomas sold his shares of Terry's factory to Hoadley and purchased a clock company that had been launched by another of Terry's apprentices, Heman Clark. There, Thomas began making tall clocks with wooden movements.

But it was the mantel clocks that would garner the most attention some 200 years later, and it was in 1817 when Thomas added the mantel clock to his line of inventory. Some of his earliest antique mantel clocks can be identified by their pillar-and-scroll cases, usually with scenes painted on the bottom third of the cases below the clocks' faces.

While the French and Germans had long been using brass for their clock mechanisms, the Americans sought to produce a clock that the average American could afford. That's why the first Seth Thomas clocks had wooden clock works, and he began making clocks in this manner around 1830. These clocks undoubtedly would have been laughed at by the Europeans, who at the time, were producing clocks that were beautiful, ornate masterpieces of clock-making craftsmanship and often reserved for the wealthy and royalty.

The American clock makers, like Seth Thomas, brought time keeping to rural and small town America, helping to set the stage for the Industrial Revolution in the U.S. These early wooden clocks often made their way across America on horse-drawn wagons of peddlers – the door-to-door salesman of that day.

Collectors can date antique Seth Thomas clocks based on their movements. Brass movements replaced wooden ones

in 1842 (wood was phased out entirely in 1845), which was also the first year that Thomas made mantel clocks with ogee cases (a type of molding whose profile resembles an S-shape curve, a practice that continued until 1913.)

In 1853, Thomas incorporated his business as the Seth Thomas Clock Company. Though an innovator when it came to production techniques and business, he was rather conservative when it came to the appearance of his clocks. So, after his death in 1859, Thomas' sons, Seth Jr. and Aaron, were quick to introduce new clock styles. To this day you can see the company's late 19th-century creativity in handsome antique wall clocks, regulators, spring-driven clocks, and clocks with calendars.

In 1865, the Thomas family also launched a subsidiary called Seth Thomas' Sons & Company, which produced a high-grade 15-day movement for mantel clocks. Around this same time, the Seth Thomas Clock Company bought into the production of tower clocks and street clocks. The tower clocks consist of huge mechanisms that even now, probably run a tower clock near you.

The adamantine black mantel clocks produced by Thomas beginning in 1882 are well-recognized. Glued to the wood case is a celluloid veneer called adamantine. White and black, as well as colored patterns like wood grain, onyx and marble were used to create adamantine veneer. The Seth Thomas adamantine mantel clocks were popular enough to remain in production until 1917.

Another trend from the late 19th century was the practice of naming a clock after international cities. Seth Thomas did that, too, using names like Milan, Genoa and Naples to evoke the style of a particular clock. The company also had a 'City Series' of clocks named after U.S. cities. The antique Atlanta clock, for example, has a rosewood case with gilt details and a glass door that had been etched in leaf pattern. Even Utica got its own clock. The City Series was produced for roughly 40 years.

Antique Seth Thomas clocks were also named after presidents (Lincoln, Garfield) and royalty (Victoria). Others were named after universities, from Cambridge to Cornell.

In the 20th century, Seth Thomas had such a reputation for high standards that it was known as the "Tiffany" of Connecticut clock making. The company introduced its first tambour clock in 1904. The low, wide profile of these mantel clocks made them perfect above fireplaces. Chime clocks followed in 1909, and electric clocks were added to the company's catalog in 1928.

In the 1930s, the family relinquished control of the company and it became a subsidiary of General Time Instruments Corporation.

The first step in identifying a Seth Thomas clock is finding its label. Labels were glued on the inside, back or bottom of the clock case. Some clocks included a stamped metal label on the clock and some included engraved pendulums featuring the Seth Thomas name.

Antique Seth Thomas clocks made between 1881 and 1918 are often marked with an ink-stamped code on the case bottom or back. These stamps were a series of numbers and letters, and they can be difficult to decode. Each code starts with four numbers and ends with a letter. The numbers are the year backwards. The letter represents the month with "A" standing for January and "L" standing for December. For instance, a code of 2981D would indicate a clock that was made in April of 1892.

Thomas' name was engraved on a few of the timepieces he made, directly above the number 6. This can be found, specifically, in clocks made in the years 1881 to 1888, or after 1913.

The rating of Seth Thomas clocks can be determined in four areas: glass condition, function, frame condition and clock face.

Seth Thomas clocks, particularly mantel clocks, are treasured by clock collectors and antiques lovers who value craft and sophistication.



turing silhouettes of ghosts and goblins across the bottom. This "Come and Meet Your Spookie Friends/Gala Halloween Party" poster was bid to \$950.

A dozen Halloween figures - some composition, some plastic, some papier-mache and some with paper, feather, and chenille elements; ranging in height from 2 to 6 inches sold as a lot for \$850. A lot of 10 Halloween noise makers were also up for grabs with this grouping including four with lithograph tin (two marked T. Cohn and two M. & B.) came in at \$750.

Of the decorative pottery offered for sale, the top lot in this category was the fabulous 10.5 inch tall, Cowan Pottery Studio "Elephant" paperweight which realized \$3,000. Designed by Margaret Postgate (American, 1879-1953) and wearing the Oriental red glaze, this elephant also wore the impressed Cowan mark on the side.

Stoneware was well received at this

Rachel Davis September auction. A surprise was the unmarked stoneware canning jar decorated with a stylized cobalt blue snake. Standing 8.5 inches high, this gem made \$1,900 (est. \$100-\$200), while a T.E. Exby stoneware pitcher decorated with a blue flower was bid to \$1,600. This pitcher was 10.5 inches tall and 6.75 inches wide. A 16.75 inches tall, a 4-gallon stoneware jug, marked "A.Leet, Greenville, PA" and decorated with two cobalt flowers made \$1,300 and a lot of 60-plus miniature stoneware jugs including souvenirs, whiskeys, and commemorative pieces brought \$1,300.

Philadelphia: Rice & Clark, 1842 that sold for \$1,400. A 28-inch high Bohemian flash cut amber glass pokal decorated with a hunting scene sold for \$1,100 and a Gene Conely carved wood sculpture of a bird which stood 36 inches high and signed on the bottom brought \$1,300.



Sulphide marbles provide art inside a sphere

Kids love playing with marbles of all kinds, whether they are made of stone. clay, wood, or glass. Collectors, on the other hand, have their favorites. One of the most popular classes of marbles among collectors is sulphide marbles.

Sulphide marbles are made of clear glass with a small figurine encapsulated inside of the marble. Most sulphide marbles were made between 1840 and 1926, but as late as 1950 some sulphide marbles were still being made by hand. Sulphide marbles primarily came from the Lauscha area of what is now East Germany. The German craftsmen who made them referred to sulphide marbles as "figure marbles."

Manufacturing methods of sulphide marbles show a surprisingly simple production process. First the figurines were cast. Occasionally metal figurines were used in sulphides, but most figurines were made by pressing gypsum, kaolin, or clay into a double mold and then slowly drying the figurine inside a kiln at 77 degrees Fahrenheit. Most commonly,

sulphide marbles tended to be large. The most common sizes ranged from 1½ inch to 3+ inches in diameter.

When you look at a sulphide marble, sometimes a noticeable sheen appears to surround the figurine. This "sheen" effect is the result of a small air space between the figurine and the glass surrounding it. The air space reflects light rays passing through the marble, creating the sheen or silvery coloring.

Heat regulation was difficult. If the glass was too hot, the figurine might melt or be distorted along with poor adhesion. And if the figurine was too hot or became too hot upon contact with the molten glass, then the figurine might expand, breaking the glass or shrink upon cooling, causing large air bubbles. The end result of hand-made sulphide marbles is that many of the marbles found today have imperfections.

Sulphide marbles were most often finished, just like other hand-made marbles, by applying a harder glass shell around the marble, or by dipping the marbles into an acid solution, or by rotating the marbles in a tumbler with

water and sand, or by, once again, baking the marbles until they just began to melt and allowing the outside melted surface to re-cool.

Keep in mind that these types of marbles have been reproduced for many years. Before spending a lot of money on a marble; do your homework or work with a trusted seller.



reasons (including health), would come to fill the role of the third Stooge: Shemp, his brother "Curly" Howard, Joe Besser, and finally, "Curly Joe" DeRita

One thing that did not change, however, was the role that each Stooge played. Moe was the leader and brains (under his "bowl cut" hairdo) of the group. Larry was notably the guy in the middle, the one with frizzy hair, the "glue," in the words of longtime fan Gary Lassin. And the third Stooge, often with a shaved head, was usually the butt of the joke, the last to understand what was going on.

But that's getting ahead of the story. Making a living on the vaudeville circuit and hoping to hit it big was physically demanding. The Stooges lived out of steamer trunks, going from one stop to the next along the rail line, playing live shows at theaters along the way. Grueling, to be sure, Lassin agreed.

Despite their decades-long popularity, the Three Stooges were not an overnight success. Working steadily for years on vaudeville stages, they were "getting their comedy chops in order," he continued. As the popularity of motion pictures grew and vaudeville acts faded away, the "Boys" got their first big break in 1934, a contract with Columbia Pictures, which led to their appearance in approximately 200 comedy shorts. Lassin acknowledged that, while the Boys were good actors, they worked with talented producers and directors, as well as supporting actors and sound effects artists. And thanks to films, their work would not be lost to time.

All the while, the Stooges continued to perform live. In his recent 765-page book, "A Tour De Farce: The Complete History of the Three Stooges on the Road," Lassin documented more than 1,500 personal appearances made by the Stooges at a myriad of venues. Wherever they appeared, the Boys were met by

enthusiastic crowds at venues as varied as theaters, military bases, and amusement parks, as well as hospital wards, the circus, and a corn palace. Over the years, the Stooges never turned down an opportunity to sign an autograph or pose for a photograph. When approached, they routinely went into their act, because, as Lassin notes, "They were hams."

With the end of their Columbia contract in 1957, a new generation of fans were introduced to the Stooges, thanks to the airing of their work on television. Although they continued to make public appearances, the days of the act were numbered: Larry suffered a paralyzing stroke in 1970, thereby bringing an end to nearly 50 years of laughs.

These days, comedians work solo. And the nature of their humor is certainly different than that of a century ago. But the legacy of the Three Stooges lives on, thanks in large part to Lassin's efforts. What began as a childhood interest in the comedy team became personal when he married the granddaughter of Larry's

brother. As a Stooge-in-law, Lassin continued his own hunt for memorabilia related to the act. Surprisingly, he noted that there was never an attic full of Stooge-related souvenirs in the family ("they were relatives, not movie stars"). "Just a comic book here, a letter there" is how he described what was kept.

Lassin's work to preserve the legacy of the Stooges took a new direction when, approximately 40 years ago, he assumed the leadership of the Three Stooges Fan Club; he proudly noted it is one of the longest continuously running fan clubs in the country. Not surprisingly, he estimated that 90 percent of the approximately 2,000 club members are men.

And then, in 2004, Lassin opened what serves as the club's headquarters. the Stoogeum, located in Ambler, Pennsylvania. Open by appointment, the public is welcome to tour this 10,000-square-foot, three-story museum that houses nearly 100,000 Stoogerelated artifacts. And "soitenly," there is a gift shop. On the other hand, Lassin draws the line to those devoted fans who have requested permission for having their ashes scattered at the Stoogeum.

As for those beginning a Stooge collection, Lassin suggested that one strategy might be to assemble a complete set of trading cards, purchased individually for a few dollars (to be upgraded later on). A previously read Three Stooges comic book can be procured for about \$20. Early collectibles include autographs, photographs, and contracts, as well as costumes and props that are "incredibly rare." (Note: Lassin cautions that fakes and reproductions abound.) More accessible are newspaper clippings, posters, and playbills. And during the 1950s and beyond, "everything from soup to nuts" was made, including toys, games, and toilet paper with Three Stooges trivia questions.

So how does Lassin describe the Three Stooges? In the end, he offered his insight into what made the Three Stooges "click," and why their fans continue to adore them. "The best way I can explain it is that they were human cartoons." If a bomb were to blow up at your feet, your clothes might be "torn and tattered, but you'd live to tell about it." Hit in the head and knocked unconscious? A splash of water will make it right again. Angry at your boss? "Give him a swift kick in the rear end" (and not lose your job). And, for the record, no one ever lost their sight from all those pokes in the eye, because in the world of the Three Stooges, "nothing is real." Nyuk, nyuk, nyuk!






