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Baedeker English Editions

 Austria, including Hungary, Transylvania, Dalmatia, Bosnia. Karl Baedeker, Leipsic, 1896.

A NEGLECTED EDITION because it mentions only Austria on the cover and spine whilst describing the whole of Austria-Hungary as far as Belgrade and Bucharest. Issued c. 1896.

Eighth edition, xiv, 468pp, 28 maps and 25 plans, ink signature on endpapers, hinges cracked publisher's red cloth gilt, spotted on the covers, cloth rubbed; otherwise a good copy. Hinrichsen E55.

First and only edition, VERY RARE. vi, 230pp, Charles Scribner's price list on front paste-down, ink writing inside, publisher's variant pink binding, slightly worn and dirty; a good firm copy. Hinrichsen S.I.I.

3. Belgium and Holland. Karl Baedeker, Coblenz. 1871.

First published in 1869, this series continued up to 1931. Town plans include Amsterdam, Bruges, Brussels and Utrecht. This volume has an extra map (Course of the Meuse from Dinant to Liege) bound in at page 185, with several the maps being coloured. Endpapers dated 'May 1871'.

A good example of an early Baedeker. This series was first started in 1869. Endpapers dated 'July 1875'.

7. Canada with Newfoundland and an excursion to Alaska. Karl Baedeker, Leipsic, 1894.

THE SERIES ON CANADA WAS ONLY PUBLISHED IN ENGLISH and there were only four editions.

It was written by J.F. Muirhead who also wrote the companion volume on the United States. Scarce. Issued c.1894.

Only published in English and therefore relatively scarce. The first edition was published in 1894 and the last in 1922. The bookseller A.T. Chapman was based in Montreal. An unusual price list.

Second edition. Ixii, 268pp, 10 maps and 7 plans, price list of A.T. Chapman pasted down on endpaper, bookplate pasted down on front endpaper, some writing on preliminaries, some slight browning of pages, cloth worn on spine; otherwise a good firm copy. Hinrichsen E264.

FIRST MENTION OF THE GRAND TRUNK PACIFIC RAILWAY (INCORPORATED IN 1903), as yet only partly constructed; the section on Alaska has been enlarged from the previous edition. Issued c.1907.

Third edition. Ixiv, 331pp, 13 maps and 12 plans, a few detached pages (167-170), all complete publisher's red cloth gilt, slightly bumped at one corner; overall a very good copy. Hinrichsen E265.

LAST EDITION OF THIS TITLE. A map of the Rocky mountains has been added. Issued c. 1925.

'EASTERN ALPS' FIRST STARTED IN 1879 AND WAS LAST PUBLISHED IN 1911. Previously this area was included in 'Southern Germany and Austria'. There is a special section devoted to Alpine terms. Issued c.1907.

First English edition of this series devoted solely to the Eastern Alps previously included in Southern Germany and Austria. A very scarce edition. Endpapers dated 'May 1882'.

THE FIRST ENGLISH EDITION TO DESCRIBE EGYPT AS A WHOLE. As a result the contents were somewhat reduced and the Peninsula of Sinai was transferred to the volume on Palestine and Syria. Issued c. 1899.

This is the first English edition after the 1881 rebellion and the bombardment of Alexandria by an Anglo-French fleet in 1882 with the defeat of Arabi Pasha. The general map shows the Egyptian Empire extended into the Northern Hedjaz and in the South to the sources of the White Nile. This and succeeding editions are considered Baedeker classics. Very scarce.

The (German) reader might have been somewhat put off by the size of the medicine chest he is advised to carry (malaria and bed bugs being a problem!) and by the mention of indifferent food and basic beds. This book gives an intriguing insight into travel to a fascinating, if war-torn, part of Europe in those days.
