#### GENERAL INFORMATION

Conservative use of Party Lines. Satisfactory service on party lines depends very largely upon the willingness of the joint users to co-operate with one another in their demand on the service. The Company accordingly respectfully requests party line subscribers to LIMIT THEIR CONVERSATION TO FIVE MINUTES WHEN OTHERS WISH TO USE THE LINE, and to give immediate right-of-way in case of emergency calls.

Four-Party Line Service. The four-party line service in New Glasgow is handled on a semi-selective basis. Each subscriber will receive not only his own ring but also the ringing signal for one other subscriber on his line. Therefore it is most important that four-party line subscribers should answer only their own ring. The letter at the end of the number denotes each subscriber's proper ringing signal as follows:

W—1 Ring J—1 Ring L—2 Rings R—2 Rings

Identification of Employees. Employees authorised to examine, exchange, or remove any of the Company's apparatus, are furnished with a badge of the following description: A nickel shield bearing the words

Maritime Tel. & Tel. Co., Ltd.

Subscribers are earnestly requested not to allow interference with their telephone instruments, unless the badge can be shown.

Publishing Telephone Numbers. The publishing by subscribers of their telephone numbers on stationery, etc., is against the advice of the Company, for the reason that occasional changes in numbers are unavoidable; the term "Telephone Connection" should be used. The advertising of a business in connection with residence telephone service is prohibited.

Emergency Calls. In the case of a fire or an accident where assistance is quickly and urgently required, the Maritime Telegraph & Telephone Company will give, without charge, any such local calls from public pay stations. In placing such a call the calling party should use the word "Emergency." for example:

"Fire Department—EMERGENCY."


Ambulance — EMERGENCY."

Be sure to make clear to the operator that your call is an emergency call, and she will do her best to hasten the connection. The Company cannot assume any responsibility on such calls, although it will do its utmost to make them fully effective.

Service Criticism. The Company will appreciate as a special favour reports of specific instances of unsatisfactory service. It is its desire that the service be kept at a high standard of efficiency, and such reports will enable the Company to remedy the difficulty, whether it be the result of an operating error, or caused by some defect in the delicate and complicated mechanism of the telephone apparatus. Notify CHIEF OPERATOR promptly of any service difficulty. Call trouble operator to report telephone out of order.

No Complaints can be handled by the Local Operators.

In case of trouble occurring repeatedly, report to Exchange Manager,
