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#### About this CD.

The title of this 1050\* page directory continues, "Alphabetically arranged as to Places, Names, Businesses and Professions. While this title does an excellent job at identifying the primary purpose of the book it fails to mention that the book also provides: "Historical sketches of the Provinces of Ontario and Quebec," gazetteer like descriptions of virtually every centre of population throughout Quebec, Indexes of; Cities, Towns and Villages, and Advertisers names as well as a "Miscellaneous Index of articles relating to the Dominion of Canada and the Province of Quebec." As bonus material it also contains a list of Banks in Canada and a Postal Guide.

The language of this directory is primarily English although the names of people and places given in French are respected. Most businesses and professional are identified in English but, particularly in the Trades Directory, the equivalent French description is also usually given.

The main business of the directory can be found in two sections, being:

- 1. a Business and Professional Directory of the Province of Quebec Alphabetically Arranged as to Place Names, Business and Profession, and
- 2. a Province of Quebec Classified Directory of Businesses, Trades, Professions, Alphabetically Arranged.

Section 1. lists every place alphabetically, and - for places larger than a village - the most important features; physical, political, economic, social and distinguishing, are mentioned, including the contemporary population. The length of this description varies with the size of the population so that the description of cities may run to several pages. Following are listed all the names of business and professionals in Alphabetical order identifying their trade or profession and listing their street address for the larger population centers.

Section 2. lists trades, professions, occupations, facilities, services etc. in alphabetical order and under each provides an alphabetical listing of the Cities, Towns or Villages and in each all those engaged in the trade or profession together with their address (for Cities.)

This Directory provides over 1000 pages just bursting with the names of virtually everyone owning, running or operating a business or professional service in the Province of Quebec in 1890-91, together with a host of contemporary factual information and commercial advertising. A "must have" for anyone researching family history in the Province of Quebec during the closing decades of the 1800's.

There is some duplication of page numbering in this book with page numbers in rear of the Introductory section being duplicated in the beginning of the first section of the Business and Professional Alphabetical section.

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
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#### HISTORICAL SKETCHES

OF THE

#### PROVINCES OF QUEBEC AND ONTARIO.

#### QUEBEC AND ONTARIO.

As the division of Canada into two prowinces did not take place till 1791, and as the two sections were reunited in 1840, and were not disjoined until the confederation of the provinces in 1867, much repetition will be avoided by including in one sketch the principal events in the history of the whole province as it existed before confederation.

#### I. CANADA UNDER FRENCH RULE.

The history of Canada is naturally divided into two great epochs: the period of French rule and that of British rule. Of the former period, the most prominent events were the incessant wars of the colonists with the native inhabitants, and with the neighboring colonies of Britain. The second period has been remarkable as an era of wonderful expansion and prosperity, especially in Western The most prominent events are the introduction of a representative system of Government, the division of the province, the war with the United States, the political struggles arising out of hostility of race, the rebellion, followed by the reunion of the provinces, the institution of "Responsible Government," and the concession to the Legislative Assembly of entire control over revenue and expenditure; and, lastly, confederation with the other British provinces.

#### EARLY VOYAGES AND DISCOVERIES.

It was on the 3rd of August, 1492, that Columbus, with his little fleet of three vessels, sailed on his memorable voyage of discovery from Palos, a port on the coast of

Spain. On the 9th of the following month he passed Ferro, the last of the Canary Isles, and launched out into unknown seas. After the lapse of another month, during which the spirit of the commander was sorely tried by the murmurs and menaces of mutinous and superstitious crews, Columbus left his ship on the 11th of October, and planted the flag of Spain on an island to which he gave the name of San Salvador. Several months were spent in exploration, and then the great explorer set sail for home on the 4th of January, 1493, and arrived safely at Palos.

The discoveries of Columbus excited a spirit of enterprise and adventure throughout Europe, and subsequent explorers had not to encounter the great difficulties which long baffled the efforts of the pioneer adventurer, to procure means to prosecute his voyage. Newfoundland and Prince Edward Island were discovered by the Cabots. Other discoveries followed in quick succession; but it was not till 1534 that the discovery of old Canada (Ontario and Quebec) was made by Jaques Cartier, a navigator in the service of Francis I., King of France. The kings of Spain and Portugal protested against the proposed expedition under Cartier as an encroachment on their territorial rights "What!" Francis is reported to have exclaimed, "do they expect to share all America between them? I should like to see the clause in our father Adam's will that makes them sole heirs to so vast a heritage."

Cartier, with two small vessels, sailed from the port of St. Malo, on the coast of Brittany, on the 20th of April, 1534. Arriving off the coast of Newfoundland after a favorable voyage, he passed through the Straits of Belle Isle into the Gulf of the St Lawrence, and sailed southward to the Baie
