
Breaker's was inspired by Demitri's Woodstone Tavern



This Edmonds standby has been around for more than thirty years and its waterfront location and cozy ambiance are the inspiration for Breaker's, the regular watering hole where Anna and her friends meet up to gossip, drink wine, and occasionally send very regrettable emails.



On the south side of Edmonds, sits the neighborhood of Woodway, a small enclave with some of the dreamiest dream houses in the area.
