Nursery rhymes like I'm a Little Teapot and The Itsy Bitsy Spider are perfect for a sing-along when you act them out, too.



I'm a Little Teapot

1. Put your right hand on your hip and you have a handle for your teapot.
2. Put your left hand out and you have a spout.
3. Tip yourself over, and pour yourself out.



The Itsy Bitsy Spider

1. Alternate your forefingers to your thumbs and climb up the water spout like a spider.
2. Flutter your fingers as down-falling rain.
3. Wash the spider out like an umpire calling a player "safe."
4. Circle your arms over your head like the sun coming out.
5. Again, put forefingers to thumbs and climb up the water spout.

I am short and stout. I have a handle and I have a spout. "When I get all steamed up, hear me shout. Just tip me over and pour me out." Who am I?



Find out who is hiding in this jumbled picture. Just:




1. Cut along the dotted lines.
2. Put the pieces of the puzzle together to reveal an adventurous friend.
3. Glue the pieces of your puzzle onto sturdy construction paper or a paper plate.
4. Color your new mask.
5. Put a tiny hole into either side of your mask so you can put a piece of string through to hold the mask in place.
6. Put a piece of string through one hole and knot one end so it won't slip through the hole. Repeat on the other side.
7. Don't forget to make holes in the nose and mouth so you can breathe!




