

# *Ice Cream Sundaes in Three Scales*

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## *Materials Needed*

Cream colored polymer clay  
Chocolate colored polymer clay  
White puffy fabric paint  
Brown slick or glossy fabric paint  
Cream colored acrylic paint (to match the clay)  
Bowl  
Red No-hole beads

## *Instructions*

Step 1.



Using your bowl to determine the correct size, roll out one small ball of the cream colored polymer clay and

one small ball of the chocolate colored polymer clay. Roll on rough sandpaper to texture. Bake (these are small items and can bake at a lower temperature and for less time than the directions on the package, generally.)

Step 2.



Put a little of the brown fabric paint and the cream colored acrylic paint in the bottom of the bowl. This is the melted ice cream.

Step 3.



Glue the scoops into the bowl, with the chocolate on the brown side and the vanilla scoop where the cream colored paint is.

Step 4.



Add your "hot fudge" sauce to the top. Use a small brush or pin to apply (a pin works well for smaller scales.) Apply the paint starting at the bottom of the scoops and then working upward. This way, any excess paint pools at the bottom in the bowl, where the hot fudge sauce would pool in a real sundae.

Step 5.

Let dry, then add some puffy white paint to the top of the fudge. You may want to apply this a few times to build up a whipped cream peak.

Step 6.



When you have enough whipped cream, drop a small no-hole red bead on the very top for your maraschino cherry.
