


BREAKDOWN OF THE **RECYCLING PROCESS...** 



White recycled paper is pulped in tanks. This washes off all inks so


the fibres can be reused





back to the beginning of the process and the remaining material is now half fibre and half water.




It's passed over a vibrating machine or through











Sorted office paper follows a similar process to printers' paper. At the end of the process, it's blown to create huge reels of tissue. These are then put onto converters to produce toilet tissue and other tissue-related products.
