<u>Acute</u>

Swallowed The oral ATE (Acute Toxicity Calculation) has been calculated to be >

2000 mg/kg, so the product is **not** considered to be toxic via ingestion

under the Australian WHS Regulations.

Likely to cause irritation of the gastrointestinal tract, nausea, vomiting and diarrhoea. Sodium Percarbonate may release oxygen and cause stomach

discomfort.

Eye The eye damage Cat 1 score has been determined to be > 1, so the

product is considered by GHS to cause Cat 1 eye damage. May cause

moderate irritation to the eyes, including redness and stinging.

Skin The dermal ATE (Acute Toxicity Calculation) has been calculated to be >

5000 mg/kg, so the product is **not** considered to be toxic via skin contact

under the Australian WHS Regulations.

The skin irritation Category 2 score has been determined to be < 1, so the

product is considered by GHS not to be a Category 2 skin irritant.

Repeated or prolonged skin contact may lead to irritation.
