

## CARE INSTRUCTIONS



Our furnishing have been expertly woven using the finest materials, and with proper care will grace your home for years to come. This simple guide will address everyday care and provide helpful hints to ensure the longevity of your IAAH bedsheets, bedcovers, quilts, throws and cushions. Many of our products are made from natural fibers that can be machine-washed at home; however, please be sure to read the care label on each item for best results.

### **Bedsheet**

- Wash before first use.
- Wash dark colors separately.
- Do not soak for a long time.
- Machine wash cold, gentle cycle.
- Use only non-chlorine bleach if needed.
- Tumble dry low, remove promptly.
- Warm iron as needed.
- Use of a fabric softener (liquid or dryer sheets) is not recommended for any fine linens, as it coats and weakens natural fibers. Your luxury linens will soften naturally with frequent use and additional washings.
- Do not overload the washing machine, as this can cause unnecessary abrasion to the fabric.
- Store bed linens in a cool, dry, well-ventilated area, shielded from long exposure to direct sunlight.



## Bedcover

- Machine wash in warm water; normal cycle.
- Wash dark colors separately.
- Do not soak for a long time.
- Use only non-chlorine bleach, if needed.
- Tumble dry.
- · Warm iron as needed
- Velvet bedcovers for dry clean only.
- Use of a fabric softener (liquid or dryer sheets) is not recommended for any fine linens, as it coats and weakens natural fibers. Your luxury linens will soften naturally with frequent use and additional washings.
- Do not overload the washing machine, as this can cause unnecessary abrasion to the fabric.
- Store bed cover in a cool, dry, well-ventilated area, shielded from long exposure to direct sunlight.



## Quilts

- Machine wash in cold water; gentle cycle.
- · Wash dark colors separately.
- Do not soak for a long time.
- Only non-chlorine bleach when needed.
- Tumble dry on low heat; remove promptly.
- Warm iron as needed.
- Velvet quilts for dry clean only.
- Use of a fabric softener (liquid or dryer sheets) is not recommended for any fine linens, as it coats and weakens natural fibers. Your luxury linens will soften naturally with frequent use and additional washings.
- Do not overload the washing machine, as this can cause unnecessary abrasion to the fabric.
- Store quilts in a cool, dry, well-ventilated area, shielded from long exposure to direct sunlight.



## Cushions

- Extend the life of your cushion and pillow by keeping them free of dirt and foliage.
- Use a good fabric cleaner and guard recommended for removing stains and treating new fabric for maximum protection.
- Do not store with furniture.
- To maintain the even tone of your cushions fluff them or reverse them periodically.
- Removable cushion covers should be given for professional dry cleaning as required.
- Not meant for outdoor placement.

#### For Removable Slipcover

- Remove slipcover.
- Machine wash in warm water, gentle cycle, in a commercial washer.
- Use only non-chlorine bleach, if needed.
- Tumble dry on low heat in a commercial dryer.

#### For Tufted Cushions (non-removable slipcover)

- Spot clean with a damp, white cloth.
- · Blot to remove excess water.
- Air dry



## **Throws**

- Machine wash in cold water; gentle cycle.
- · Wash dark colors separately.
- Do not soak for a long time.
- Use only use non-chlorine bleach, if needed.
- Tumble dry on low heat, remove promptly
- Dry-clean recommended for velvet throws
- Use of a fabric softener (liquid or dryer sheets) is not recommended for any fine linens, as it coats and weakens natural fibers. Your luxury linens will soften naturally with frequent use and additional washings.
- Do not overload the washing machine, as this can cause unnecessary abrasion to the fabric.
- Store throws in a cool, dry, well-ventilated area, shielded from long exposure to direct sunlight



## **Durries**

Vacuum your rug regularly. Do not machine wash. To remove stains apply a mild non abrasive soap solution with a clean, wet sponge or a damp soft cloth. Do not rub.

- To remove stain, place a small amount of a gentle, moisturizing soap such as Dove on a damp cloth and bring it to a light lather. Wipe away light lather with a fresh damp cloth. Don't rinse the lather in water.
- Water or oil based stains can be blotted up with a dry cloth or a sponge.
- Vacuum your carpets three times a week using a vacuum cleaner with a HEPA (High Efficiency Particulate) filter to remove foot fall dust or gathered dust.

# Hand-Knotted Carpets

Vacuum your rug regularly. Do not machine wash. To remove stains apply a mild non abrasive soap solution with a clean, wet sponge or a damp soft cloth. Do not rub.

- · Do not dry clean or wash carpets.
- Vacuum regularly for dust. At least twice a week for the first 3 months.
- Avoid pulling loose ends, clip them with scissors.
- In case of a spill, dab the spot with a soft dry cloth. Do not rub the stain.



# Hand-Tufted Carpets

Vacuum your rug regularly. Do not machine wash. To remove stains apply a mild non abrasive soap solution with a clean, wet sponge or a damp soft cloth. Do not rub.

- Tufted Carpets are not washable.
- Take your hand tufted carpet outside and shake it on a washing line or on a stand. You can also put it on a railing to dust it.
- Keep the hand tufted carpet out of direct sunlight.
- To remove stain, place a small amount of a gentle, moisturizing soap such as Dove on a damp cloth and bring it to a light lather. Wipe away light lather with a fresh damp cloth. Don't rinse the lather in water.
- Water or oil based stains can be blotted up with a dry cloth or a sponge.
- Vacuum your carpets three times a week using a vacuum cleaner with a HEPA (High Efficiency Particulate) filter to remove foot fall dust or gathered dust.

# Hand-Woven Carpets

Vacuum your rug regularly. Do not machine wash. To remove stains apply a mild non abrasive soap solution with a clean, wet sponge or a damp soft cloth. Do not rub.

- Do not dry clean or wash carpets.
- Vacuum regularly for dust. At least twice a week for the first 3 months.
- Avoid pulling loose ends, clip them with scissors.
- In case of a spill, dab the spot with a soft dry cloth. Do not rub the stain.
