Level 1-9 are Secondary Reinfor

Level 1 -Student teaches the lesson -Student debates the teacher (chooses one side of argument to show knowledge) -Kids evaluate the teacher's lesson

Level 2 (student decides how they will learn material) -Student conducts a computer search -Student learns by reading a book

Level 3 (the work products effect the look of the classroom) -Student paints a mural -Students tape their project(s) to the classroom window so passersby can see them -design a bulletin board

Level 4 (student decides on conditions they will work) -Student decides on the level of quality s/he will attain in their work (90% correct, less than 3 spelling errors) -Student may work by the window if s/he remains on task -dim lighting, play music, order of work completion

Level 5: Response Topography (student decides how they will display their knowledge or ability) -Write on a typewriter/computer -Drama/role play -using a magic marker, work on board -recording answers on voice recorder.

FR: Fixed-Ration Schedule A reinforcement should be delivered after a consistent (fixed) number fixed number can be any number. EXAMPLE: An FR of 2 means every 2 correct responses, a reinforce delivered.

FL Fixed-Interval Schedule The reinforcement becomes available after a certain amount of time. reinforcer becomes available after 2 minutes. F115 means the reinfo available after 15 minutes. 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
