Viking Revival Series Motorcycle Sissy Bar Bag


Parts List Step 1 Step 2

- Sissy Bar Bag
- Mounting Straps

Place the trunk on the sissy bar rack wide-strap around passenger backrest. Make sure the wide-strap fits snug around the backrest.

With trunk bag place on the sissy bar rack, loop each of the 2-front sissy bar mounting straps around corresponding upright and connect the quick disconnect buckle. Pull the straps to tighten them securely.







The rear two mounting straps may be used for securing the bag if the trunk bag is mounted using the rider backrest.

Warning

- Do not use this bag if any part of the motorcycle system has deteriorated, loosened or is beginning to fail. If you have doubts as to the security of bag's installation, stop using it.
- After every stop check the bag to be certain that it did not shift while riding and verify that the straps will not contact or interfere with any part of the drivetrain, suspensions, breaks or wheels.
- Do not exceed 15 pounds' total weight of bag, contents and attachments or the load limits of the motorcycle as specified in the owner's manual supplies with the bike or from the bike manufacturer.
- When the bag is removed. All loose straps must be removed from the motorcycle, or secured, so that they do not contact or interfere with any part of the drivetrain, suspension, brakes or wheel before operating the motorcycle.
- Always remove or stow all shoulder and backpack straps before attaching bag to motorcycle.
