
NOMAD COFFEE TRANSPARENCY REPORT 2023

From FOB to "Farmgate":

Transparently disclose all "farmgate" prices, which is the price received by coffee producers for their coffee. Out of the 52 coffee lots we purchased in 2023, we were able to disclose the "Farmgate" price of 51 of them. We came very close to achieving full disclosure, and we are confident that next year we will reach 100%.





Percentage of transparent lots relative to total coffee volume 100%





In 2023, the price of coffee on the C-Market decreased from an average of \$2.14/lb to \$1.74/lb. This resulted in coffees with a cupping score of 80 to 85.9 SCA points being paid less in 2023.


In contrast, the Fairtrade minimum price increased by 40 cents, a development worth celebrating. For our part, in 2023, we continued our trend of paying more and better for high-quality coffees. That's why our average payment increased by over \$3/lb compared to last year.

However, this comparison isn't entirely fair since we don't compete based on C-Market prices. Below, you'll find our prices compared to those paid in our market, the specialty coffee market, thanks to the Specialty Coffee Transaction Guide.

As we mentioned earlier, due to the drop in coffee prices on the C-Market, coffees with SCA scores between 80 and 85.9 points were significantly affected. Fortunately, the specialty coffee market persists and continues to pay fair prices for the quality of these lots.

Regarding NOMAD, lots we purchased ranging from 82 to 84.9 points were, on average, slightly below last year's prices, except for those of this quality we purchased directly, where we maintained or increased prices. These lots include coffees from Finca Aquiares in Costa Rica, Chambakú in Colombia, and Las Brisas.

For lots with scores above 86 points, we continue to pay above average, and much higher for lots above 88 points. At NOMAD, we always prioritize quality; it's one of our unwavering values, which is why we don't hesitate to pay a fair price for excellent quality coffee.

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Finally, we share with you the complete report, including all the lots we purchased during 2023 along with valuable information. At the end of this report, you'll find a legend to help you understand each section of the final report. Thank you, once again, for trusting NOMAD.

Name

Here you will be able to know the name of the farm, the name of the lot of the cooperative or the washing station.

Country

Country from which this coffee comes.

Farm / Co-Operative / Washing Station The coffee lot can come from different hands from the time it is collected until it reaches us:

- Farm: It can be from a farm in origin where the owners of that farm are in charge of collecting, processing and selling their coffee to an exporter or directly to a roaster. The coffee producer is large enough and has sufficient means to carry out the entire process. It is a common practice in Central and South American countries.
- Co-Operative: The coffee may come from a cooperative, where small farms come together to create a batch large enough to cover export costs. This cooperative is in charge of processing and exporting its coffee. This form is very common in the countries of Central and South America.

 Washing Station: It can come from a washing station where small producers bring their coffee in cherries and the washing station is in charge of processing and exporting it. This is the most common way of operating in African countries.

Producer

Here you will be able to know the name of the producer, of the cooperative or if it is a washing station that is a group of several producers.

Years buying to the producer / Washing Station

How many years have we bought coffee from this farm, cooperative or washing station?

Kg Bought

Amount of coffee that we have purchased from this batch in kilograms.

FOB USD/Lb

FOB means "Free On Board", the price of a coffee placed in the container at its origin.

This means that it includes the price paid to the producer (including transportation and threshing costs at origin), as well as the commission that the exporter charges importers who take control of the coffee when it is loaded onto the ship at the port of origin. It does not cover the costs of shipping, insurance or transportation, customs and ground freight incurred upon arrival at the port of destination. It's not the price paid to the producer, but it's a significant indicator of the origin cost of coffees.

Exporter - Importer

Name of the exporter or importer from whom we purchased this lot. In the lots with the name NOMAD, it was a direct deal purchase.

Farm Gate USD/Lb

"Direct price paid to the coffee producer or to the washing station.

*In the case of the lots from Burundi and Ethiopia, the data is the payment made to the small producers who deliver the cherry to the washing stations, where once they receive it, they are in charge of processing, selecting and preparing it for export.

Sca Score

Here we mention the score that we have given internally. The score is established through a Brazilian tasting where we evaluate fragrance, aroma, flavor, aftertaste, acidity, body and balance. The score is in a range of O to 100 points among all these factors and for it to be considered specialty coffee, it must be above 80 points.

Certification

Here we mention if the lot has some type of certification such as Organic or Rainforest alliance.
