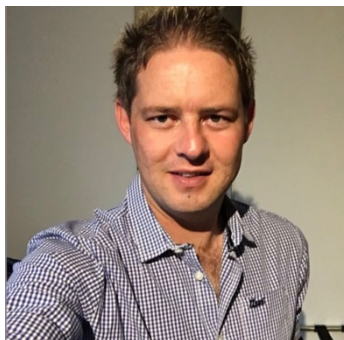

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ITINERARY

DAY 1: JOHANNESBURG

Upon arrival in SA you are met by your Local Guide who will transfer you to your hotel to settle in and relax after your journey to SA.

We will take it easy today and check in to our accommodation for the night. One can enjoy a leisurely self-guided walk on the property where one can also see some wildlife in close proximity.

Your guide will also do a full tour briefing over a relaxing dinner at the lodge.

DAY 2: JOHANNESBURG to MOREMI GORGE (BOTSWANA)

After breakfast this morning, we set off due north for our first destination, leaving behind the hilly terrain of Johannesburg and the Magaliesberg Mountains. Today our adventure begins with a scenic drive on-route to Botswana. Moremi Gorge, which is our final destination for the day, can be compared to an oasis in the middle of the Kalahari Desert and gives a different view of this country known for its aridity and its vast open spaces usually stretching as far as the eye can see.

Today we cross border into Botswana and we will need our passports and any relevant or required travel documentation.

We will spend this first night in Botswana in the comfort of our rooms at the Lodge located near the gorge.

Distance: 520 km
Accommodation: Moremi Gorge

DAY 3: KHAMA RHINO SANCTUARY

After a good night's rest and a nice breakfast, we will go for a walk in the Moremi Gorge to admire its small waterfalls and natural swimming pool. Do not forget your swimsuit!

After this refreshing morning we will travel the short distance to the Khama Rhino Sanctuary – an area dedicated for the conservation of rhinos in Botswana. The Khama Rhino Sanctuary in Botswana has been established in one of the best areas of Botswana, in order to provide the most optimal conditions for the conservation and preservation of rhinos.

Many other animals such as wildebeest, wild cat, brown hyena, leopard, jackal, antelope and zebra all share the reserve with these rhinos, however the main objective and purpose of the reserve is to conserve and protect rhinos as they are at critical population levels. We will explore this reserve aboard our vehicle but also, we will familiarize ourselves with the tracks and signs and smaller species one mostly finds on a walking safari and rhino tracking experience the following morning.

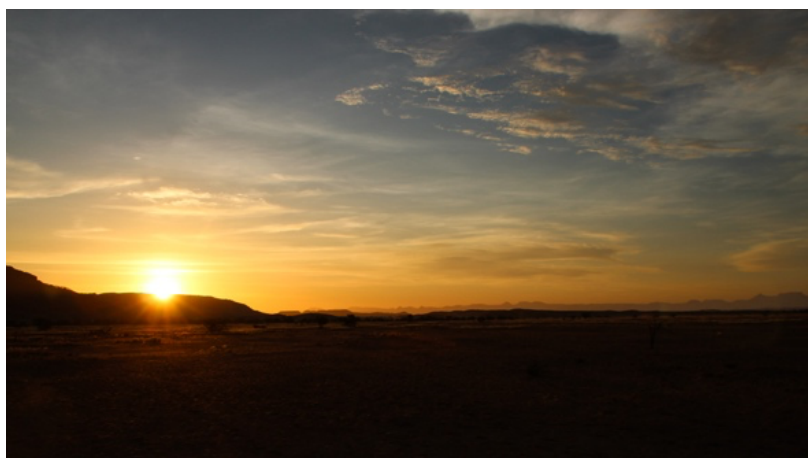
DAY 4: KHAMA to BOTETI RIVER

Today we wake up with the sounds of the surrounding bush and the animals that inhabit this area.

Today we partake in our Rhino Tracking experience, which will be a walking experience. You will head out with some of the guides in search of fresh rhino tracks after which you will jump down from the vehicle and pursue the rhino tracks further on foot.

Once back from the activity, we pack up camp as today we will travel to the Boteti River; a river flowing out of the Okavango Delta and one that also seasonally flows into the Makgadikgadi Salt Pans. On our way we pass the Sowa, Nwetwe and Nxai – salt pans (combined forming the Makgadikgadi Salt Pans); these salt pans which was separated from each other by the Kalahari Desert.

Upon arrival clients can enjoy a nice refreshing swim as we enjoy the views and sunset setting over the Boteti River.

DAY 5, 6, 7 and 8: MOREMI GAME RESERVE

Today we are heading for the eastern part of the famous Okavango Delta, through the Khwai area and Moremi Game Reserve.

Our journey today is at the height of a true exploration expedition, indeed the road leading to our destination will give us an "African massage" but it will quickly be forgotten because once we reach our private camp we will settle in and enjoy the awe-inspiring beauty teaming with wildlife.

Moremi Game Reserve is well known for its prolific wildlife. In fact, on numerous occasions it has been home to National Geographic photographers and videographers filming wildlife in Africa. We will explore Moremi in search of some of the famous Big 5 (elephant, buffalo, lion and leopard) as well as numerous bird species and general plains/wetlands game.

DAY 9: MAUN

Today we enjoy a relaxing breakfast as we set down camp and make our way further south and back to Maun.

We will do a quick shopping stop before heading back to our accommodation in Maun.

Our afternoon is spent around the pool and relaxing before heading to the Okavango Delta for the next couple of days.

Here we will enjoy a nice cooked meal by the lovely staff and share our stories from Moremi Reserve.

Meals: B D (Lunch own expense in town)

Distance: 180 km

Accommodation: Maun (Lodge TBC)

DAY 10, 11 and 12: OKAVANGO DELTA

Today we travel north to the edge of the Okavango Delta where we will get into our motorboat and continue our journey into the heart of the Okavango Delta, where we as humans are only one species among many others that can be found on these magical islands.

We will spend two nights in complete wilderness on an island and our days will be spent both by the observation of all the flora and fauna in the area and in the form of a walking safari to soak up the scents and sounds of this place as well mokorro excursions. Our third night will be back on the mainland at the main camp on the edge of a Delta lagoon.

For those who are interested, it is possible to take a helicopter flight to have a breathtaking view of all the meanders that form the Okavango Delta (optional).

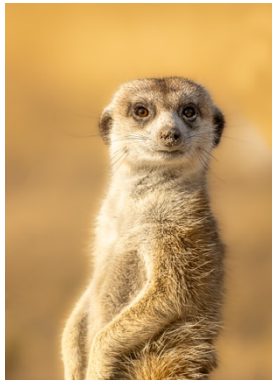

DAY 13 and 14: PLANET BAOBAB AND THE MAKGADIKGADI SALT PANS



Our last morning in the Okavango Delta, we slowly wake up to the sounds of the bush as we enjoy breakfast and start preparing ourselves to exit the park.

Today we head out of the Okavango Delta and on to the Makgadikgadi Salt Pans. Here we will stay at a lodge where we can explore the pans by foot or by quad bikes (own expense). There is also a resident group of Meerkats that live in the area for one to see.

Our next two nights will be spent at the lodge relaxing around the pool, enjoy the pans and refreshing after our camping experience in the parks.

Distance: 510 km

Accommodation: Planet baobab camping

DAY 15: ELEPHANT SANDS

On the way up to Victoria Falls, we stop by at this marvelous rest stop. At the lodge, there exists a watering spot where majestic elephants wander freely. It presents a remarkable chance to intimately connect with a wild elephant. If your desire is to experience nature while still having convenient amenities nearby, Elephant Sands emerges as the impeccable destination.

Meals: B, L (Dinner at own expense at Elephant Sands)

Distance: 160 km

Accommodation: Elephant Sands Camping

DAY 16: KASANE and CHOBE NATIONAL PARK

Today we make our way north to Kasane for a leisure Boat Cruise that will take us back into Chobe National Park – this time by boat exploring the river's edge.

Even in the city, you must keep an eye out because it is not uncommon to see baboons, warthogs and even elephants roaming around town amongst the vehicles and people. We will enjoy a substantial afternoon boat cruise on the Chobe River in search of wildlife coming for a drink on the river bank.

After our leisure cruise we head back to our accommodation for the night where we enjoy our last dinner together as a group (own expense).

Meals: B (Lunch and dinner is own expense)

Distance: 410 km

Accommodation: Kasane – Thebe River Lodge (or similar)

Included Highlights/Activity:

- PM boat safari in Chobe National Park
- Kasane

Optional Activities:

- None – all included

DAY 17: VICTORIA FALLS

On our way out of Chobe National Park with the vehicle this morning, we will be crossing the border of Zimbabwe into Victoria Falls via the Zambezi National Park. We will take the afternoon tour of the falls before settling in for the night at our lodge.

Even in the city, you must keep an eye out because it is not uncommon to see baboons, warthogs and even elephants roaming around town amongst the vehicles and people. We will have a full day in town to explore the numerous adventure activities on offer. These activities include things such as helicopter flight, rafting, boat ride to name a few (these are all optional activities)

We will spend the next two nights in Victoria Falls after which the tour officially comes to an end on the evening of day 17

Meals: B, B (Lunch and dinner on day 17 and 18 is own expense)

Distance: 120 km

Accommodation: Vic Falls Accommodation – Shearwater Village or similar

- Border crossing into Zimbabwe

- White water rafting
- Horse Rides
- Bungy Jump
- Helicopter Flights

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

This tour is a camping tour and a sleeping bag and pillow is required. Clients will do a fair amount of walking so a small daypack is advisable. Seasonal malaria precautions may be necessary and can be purchased locally.

A valid passport is required by everyone. The tour will visit Botswana. It is the client's responsibility to insure they have the appropriate visas required for this trip. Some nationalities might need to obtain visas before departure as they cannot be obtained at the border.

The price includes all transport, accommodation, meals as per the itinerary, tea and coffee at the lodges, group equipment, permits, entry fees, and professional guides. The price does not include alcohol, bottled water and soft drinks, meals where stipulated, curios, tips and optional excursions. Before departure clients will be required to enter into an agreement pertaining to our booking conditions and general information as defined on our website and in our brochure.
