It was intended to poke fun at the lack of musical skill and taste displayed by certain musicians of the time. Despite its humorous nature, the composition also showcases Mozart's deep understanding of music and his ability to manipulate musical conventions for comedic effect.



"Eine kleine Nachtmusik" (German for "A Little Night Music") is a serenade composed by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart in 1787. Its official catalog number is K. 525.

The composition is written for a chamber ensemble and consists of four movements:
