Hermann Scherchen (1891-1966) had a reputation as an auto-didact who maintained his own ideas of musical architecture, tempo, and dynamics. His 1957 Scheherazade of Rimsky-Korsakov (1888) is no exception: working with his responsive Vienna State Opera Orchestra personnel – many of whom served in the Vienna Philharmonic as principals – Scherchen elicits a combination of excitement and eroticism. having imposed his own notion of phrasings in each of the four movements, which capture the series of tales related to ensure the life of the narrator against the resolve of the Sultan Schariar, sworn to destroy all faithless women. Of the many versions of the symphonic suite, which include those classic (but relatively conventional) readings by Beecham and Reiner, Ferenc Fricsay and Hermann Scherchen offer highly unconventional readings, charged with electric energy and intelligent sympathy. Despite an occasional loss of ensemble homogeneity in the VSOO, the visceral excitement becomes

impossible to deny, especially in the last movement, The Festival at Bagdad, in which the percussion section rips loose. For purists, the performance will border on eccentrici-

ty, but for those who enjoy manic commitment from interpreters – as from Stokowski, Celibidache, and Scherchen – this reading will warrant repeated listening. As one enthusiast quipped, "this recording can grip even the most jaded listener into hearing Scheherazade anew, joining Scherchen as he dares to blaze new paths with searching intelligence."
