Houston Masterworks Chorus in Houston's Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart features a version for full chorus and instrumental ensemble comprising organ, piano and percussion. Two "bonus" selections were included in the concert: O Holy Night, for trumpet and piano; and an organ chorale prelude by J. S. Bach, Liebster Jesu, wir sind hier ("Dearest Jesus, we are here").

sound (up to 192 kHz/24Bit) in surround and stereo with the easy and straight-forward handling of a CD. Pure Audio Blu-rays play back on every Blu-ray player.

The Pure Audio Blu-ray can be operated either with or without a screen: by on-screen menu navigation or by screen-less navigation. For users prefering navigation on a screen, the Pure Audio Blu-ray provides menus just as on a video Blu-ray.

Since users have learned the straightforward, screen-less navigation from CDs over the last decades, it was key for the research team that the Pure Audio Blu-ray also works screen-less – as simple as a CD. Just insert the Pure Audio Blu-ray in your Blu-ray player and navigate through the tracks via the standard transport controls (Skip Forward/Backward; Fast Forward/Backward). And for direct access to the tracks use the numeric keys – just as on a CD.

The Pure Audio Blu-ray can hold various audio streams in stereo and surround. The audio streams are allocated to the colour buttons on the remote control, also allowing for a seamless change between them.
