

I would like to welcome all the directors players coaching staff and fans of Darlington to Victory Park this evening. Travelling away to a Tuesday night fixture is difficult for most teams and Darlington, like us, have a few of them to contend with.

Darlington have not started the season as well as they would've wanted but with Josh Gowling they have a manager who knows the league well. I speak regularly to Josh and know he's doing whatever he can to change their fortunes. A superb win against Chester, helped with a good away win v Farsley shows that his team has what it takes to gather points from excellent teams.

We have had a very tough run of fixtures but I'm pleased to report that our performances over the last couple of games indicates we are back to what we have been used to - strong, hardworking performances showing character.

We are now in the period of Saturday and Tuesday games. It's relentless for the players but the squad are welcoming the challenge of sticking with the early pace setters. We have done excellently to sustain a play off position as we approach the month of December but we recognised the league is as tight as ever. Failing to win on Saturday could have dropped us numerous places to 18th! It's tight, there's pressure but we are enjoying it.

Our form over the past 10 games is good. The challenge is to maintain that and stick as close to 2 points per game as we can. To do that, we need, as usual, the help of our supporters.

On Saturday there was a really positive atmosphere around Victory Park. I'm hoping we can help to keep this positivity with a good performance and result tonight.

Thanks again for all your support, you can make the difference. Enjoy the game.





These changes coincide with the implementation of our new integrated ticketing system, which will go live for our first game of the season!

Online Tickets

In a change from previous seasons, we are now offering discounted ticket prices to everyone who purchases their tickets online for matches at the Chorley Group Victory Park Stadium. To secure the best price on single match tickets, simply visit our new ticket site and purchase your tickets. Online ticket sales will be available until shortly before kick-off (online ticket sales will close 2 hours prior). Then, on matchday, all you need to do is show up at the turnstiles, have your e-ticket scanned on your phone, and you're in! It's that simple.

In-person Tickets

We will continue to offer on-the-day in-person ticket sales for the 2023/24 season. However, the price of these tickets will be slightly higher compared to our online option. Please note that payment at the turnstiles will no longer be available. Instead, on-the-day in-person ticket purchases will be facilitated through our new ticket booth at the Chorley Group Victory Park Stadium. The ticket booth will accept both cash and card payments. Once you've obtained your ticket, you can proceed to the turnstiles as usual for ticket scanning and entry.

WELCOME TO CHORLEY FC MATCHDAY PROGRAMME

In addition to the ticket purchasing changes, we have revised our admission categories for the first time since 2019. To address instances where individuals deliberately attempted to purchase tickets incorrectly to gain access to cheaper admission prices, we have simplified the process to ensure fairness for all supporters. From now on, anyone aged 18 to 64 will be classified as an adult and will be required to purchase an adult admission ticket.



WE'VE MET BEFORE...1989

The Magpies met Darlington in league football over 30 years ago when the Quakers were making their first forays into non-league football since joining the newly-formed Football League Division Three North in 1921/22, leaving the North Eastern League behind.

The Quakers were under the helm of a relatively new and untested manager, Brian Little, who had closed out a nine year professional career as a one club man, appearing nearly 250 times for Aston Villa's first team.

Little's coaching career had been a baptism of fire, assisting Wolverhampton Wanderers' manager Sammy Chapman at Molineux, a club that had been in terminal decline with financial problems continuously blighting the club. Following promotion to English football's top flight in 1983-84, Wolves had finished bottom of that division and then bottom of the Second Division in the following season.

Despite their efforts, they could not stop the club suffering a third successive relegation to the fourth tier and Little was handed the reins for the following season after Chapman's sacking. His tenure lasted all of 36 days. Just over one month later, under Little's successor Graham Turner - who had taken over at Molineux after being sacked at Little's previous employers Aston Villa, Wolves were dumped out of the FA Cup 3-0 by Chorley in a replay that, for most Wolves fans, is considered the lowest point in their history.

Chorley's historic night against Wolves almost didn't happen, having originally been paired with Halifax - but Darlington had been placed in the Southern section of the draw by accident and the draw was remade, making the rest history, as they say...

After taking up a coaching role at Middlesbrough shortly after his Molineux departure, Little left the club for another stab at the Fourth Division, this time with Darlington. The Quakers were sitting bottom of English football and unfortunately for Brian he was unable to keep the side in the division as they slipped into non-league football and the GM Vauxhall Conference for the start of the 1989-90.

After a slow start to the season, victories over Altrincham, Welling United, Sutton United, Northwich Victoria and Yeovil Town, had ignited Chorley's second campaign in the GM Vauxhall Conference, placing them fourth in the table. For Darlington, it was clear they were not planning to remain in the division for long as they sat on top of the pile, undefeated.

Chorley's first fixture against the highly-fancied Quakers came at the end of September and the Magpies were unable to get a foothold in the game with Darlington running out 0-3 winners at Victory Park, in front of a crowd of 1,881.

The return fixture at Feethams, on Saturday 30th December 1989, came on the back of successive home league defeats for the Magpies to Barrow and Runcorn. The Quakers meanwhile had relinquished their stranglehold on the division with defeats to Farnborough and Runcorn, but they remained level at the top on 37 points alongside Macclesfield Town and Kettering Town with games in hand.

It seemed Little had finally been able to put his managerial promise into practice after an inauspicious start to his career on the sidelines. In uncompromising mood, Darlington made it a second 3-0 reverse against the Magpies after September's tie at Victory Park, this time the goals came from David Corner, Andy Toman and Paul Emson.

The Quakers went on to win the league and in 1990/91 won the Football League Division Four on their first attempt by a single point ahead of Stockport County and Hartlepool United to achieve back-to-back promotions.

Early season promise for the Magpies was a distant memory when they were fighting for their Conference existence on the final game of the season, requiring just a point at Victory Park or anything less than a victory for Fisher Athletic victory away at Merthyr Tydfil.

The only problem for Chorley was they were playing Barnet, still in with a chance of promotion to the Football League as long as Darlington failed to beat Welling United. There were two 4-1 defeats that day, for Chorley and for Merthyr, bringing relegation back to the Northern Premier League for the Magpies.
