



### I would like to extend a welcome to the King's Lynn team and board of directors. We know like us, they are desperate to achieve their first win of the season.

You shouldn't assume based on their current league position and recent results that they won't be near the top of the table at the end of the season. They, too, wasted chances to capitalise in some of their fixtures and we know from last season - they're an excellent team.

After losing to Warrington Town at home last week, just like you, all of us were disappointed. We haven't lost at home too frequently, and we'll do all in our power to prevent it from happening again. In the opening games, we were unfortunate to only pick up a point at home to Brackley then Farsley on the road. In a challenging encounter at Chester, we were resilient and managed to show enough character to earn a tough point. The performance at home to Warrington fell short of expectations for all of us.

Everyone suffers when we don't perform, for whatever reason. Everyone involved feels pain the players hurt, you hurt, and stomachs ache! It leaves a bad taste in our mouth. This lingers for a while, especially for the players and it is amplified if individual performances fall short of personal expectations. This emotion weighs most heavily on the management team until the next match and subsequent strong performance.

We all know that success on the pitch is necessary to get a town excited. Everyone here is trying very hard to get there, especially the management team and new owners. In football, things don't always go as planned. In 2020–2021, one of our best years to date, we managed to advance to the FA Cup fourth round. In the first five league games of the same season, we earned one point. When we made the playoffs in 2021–22, we lost our first two games, conceding four goals and scoring none. We had five points after the first five games of last season, but we fell short of the playoffs by just 15 minutes of play!

The pathway to success is not a straight line. We know that at our club. Do you remember when we struggled to attract 200 supporters to watch a home game? I remember playing away to Bacup Borough with less than 100 watching (I remember scoring 2 goals in that game too!).

We are on a new journey. We will have numerous low points, as we always do in football. Our goal is to surpass more milestones and forge more wonderful experiences for our team, our community, and our fans. Our club's ability to stay grounded, maintain a positive attitude and make everyone feel supported is what has made us successful in the past. Therefore, if and when we go through some tough times, let's do it together and stay strong as a group. That way, when we create new memories—and believe me, we will, they'll taste and feel even better.

We are thrilled to announce that, as part of our new ownership's commitment to improving and modernising the matchday experience, we have made some significant changes for the 2023/24 season. These changes coincide with the implementation of our new integrated ticketing system, which will go live for our first game of the season!

### **Online Tickets**

In a change from previous seasons, we are now offering discounted ticket prices to everyone who purchases their tickets online for matches at the Chorley Group Victory Park Stadium. To secure the best price on single match tickets, simply visit our new ticket site and purchase your tickets. Online ticket sales will be available until shortly before kick-off (online ticket sales will close 2 hours prior). Then, on matchday, all you need to do is show up at the turnstiles, have your e-ticket scanned on your phone, and you're in! It's that simple.

### **In-person Tickets**

We will continue to offer on-the-day in-person ticket sales for the 2023/24 season. However, the price of these tickets will be slightly higher compared to our online option. Please note that payment at the turnstiles will no longer be available. Instead, on-the-day in-person ticket purchases will be facilitated through our new ticket booth at the Chorley Group Victory Park Stadium. The ticket booth will accept both cash and card payments. Once you've obtained your ticket, you can proceed to the turnstiles as usual for ticket scanning and entry.

### WELCOME TO CHORLEY FC MATCHDAY PROGRAMME

In addition to the ticket purchasing changes, we have revised our admission categories for the first time since 2019. To address instances where individuals deliberately attempted to purchase tickets incorrectly to gain access to cheaper admission prices, we have simplified the process to ensure fairness for all supporters. From now on, anyone aged 18 to 64 will be classified as an adult and will be required to purchase an adult admission ticket.

# **26TH AUGUST**

### 60 YEARS AGO – CHORLEY FC 2-0 DROYLSDEN

### The more things change, the more they stay the same. Or so it's said. Just as we have had two months of fairly miserable weather, Chorley began the 1963/64 Lancashire Combination on Saturday 24th August in much the same conditions.

A convincing 2-0 victory at Southport Reserves saw Peter Watson snatch the points with a brace. On the same day, the first ever Bundesliga games kicked off in West Germany, replacing the original Oberliga.

The UK had just about thawed out after the Big Freeze of 1963 saw heavy snowfall in Lancashire and sub-zero temperatures lasting until March. The Profumo Affair was rocking domestic politics and in May the release of The Beatles' debut album Please Please Me saw the explosion of Beatlemania.


Chorley welcomed Droylsden on this day sixty years ago for the Summer Bank Holiday Monday clash, which saw the Magpies maintain their perfect record in the league in front of a Victory Park crowd of 1,255.

The squad remained unchanged and so the scoreline was 2-0, as for the win over Southport Reserves two days earlier. This time Peter Watson sportingly shared out the finishing duties, despatching one himself and allowing Charlie Wroth to add the other.

After a fifth-place finish in 1961-62, player/ coach Arthur Rowley had been brought in to restore the Magpies to their former glories of back-to-back League and Lancashire Junior Cup honours that had heralded the new decade. Second place in 1962/63 was an improvement, but two wins from two was a dream start to the new campaign.

Forty-eight hours later, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. delivered his "I Have A Dream" speech on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial, where more than 250,000 people demonstrated in the "March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom".

# 26TH AUGUST

### 23 YEARS AGO – CHORLEY FC 8-1 LINCOLN UNITED

### The saga of the OceanGate submarine has gripped the media recently, and in mid-August 2000 a similar story captured the attention of the public when Kursk, the Russian cruise-missile sub, was lost in the Barents Sea along with 118 personnel.

A week later, Chorley opened their Unibond League First Division campaign with a 1-1 draw at Bradford (Park Avenue) followed by a midweek 1-0 defeat at home to Witton Albion. Looking to kick start the Bank Holiday weekend with their first win of the season, the Magpies greeted Lincoln United at Victory Park twenty-three years ago today.

As stuffy thunderstorms rolled across Britain, Reggie Kray was released from Broadmoor Hospital on compassionate grounds and Groovejet (If This Ain't Love) by Spiller, featuring Sophie Ellis-Bexter, hit number one on the UK Singles Chart that evening.

During the afternoon, the Magpies got into their own groove. A goal apiece for David Eatock and Paul Thomson, a brace from Matt Swailes and a hat-trick from Danny Mills gave the Magpies an unbelievable 8-1 victory, their best result in more than a decade. Remarkably, it was not the highest scoreline notched in the league that season. Ashton United made their Croft Park home a feared place to visit, despatching Gretna 9-2 – and also recording 8-1 against Kendal Town and, unfortunately, thrashing the Magpies in March by a 7-3 scoreline.

# **10 YEARS OF SOCCER SCHOOLS**

Almost ten years ago, on August 27, 2013, we opened our first-ever 'Soccer School.' The sessions were led by Adam Roscoe, who is well-known for more than just his overhead kicks and me! The coordinator was the late David Murgatroyd. For the first one or two, we had trouble with the numbers less than 10 children signed up to the first one), but by the fourth and fifth sessions, we were booming and regularly reaching 70 to 100 kids. James Turner, who is pictured with his mother Carole and next to Roscoe in the photograph, was one of the first kids to arrive. Up to the age of approximately 16, James attended pretty much every soccer school he could. James is now a fully committed supporter with his parents.

Murgy was instrumental in the club's new project. His pen would be writing furiously and his phone would be buzzing with the most extravagant ring tones. He would record the information of kids who were signing up on a folded-up piece of paper or a small book he kept on the inside of his jacket. Emails? For Murgy? No! To get the information to me, he used carrier pigeons. Lists would be delivered with capital letters, carefully written. He would cover any errors with the strongest Tipp-ex you could locate! Everything was organised.

Murgy would plan everything out before serving as the 'front of house' while kids and parents came. Kind, cheerful, and eager to support our families, he would be diligent with everything related to the Soccer Schools, including writing the certificates precisely, organising tickets, gathering autographed balls, etc. I remember he once searched his drawers for a shell suit (1980s style!), to wear so that he could 'look like a coach!' – He wore this on one of the away trips too!

One of Murgy's finest club accomplishments at the club was without a doubt founding, expanding, and most recently maintaining and developing the Soccer Schools with Preecy.

"I made you into the manger that you are!" Murgy would always inform me when we were travelling to and from games. Every time we travelled, Murgy would insist over a glass of red wine and some cheese and crackers that the Soccer School 'HE' founded and offered me the chance at,



was what made me into a football manager. Although we both knew that was not the case, spending so much time with a fantastic man had a positive impact on my attitude and character.

It is quite appropriate that the kids now strive towards the "David Murgatroyd Award" on every Football School. A prize for kids who, like Murgy, have been committed, diligent, and have a constantly positive attitude
