As a member of the local commune council I think we need to commit and promise to give them education. When they have education they will be able to support their family to escape from poverty.







Our first social enterprise, we opened the Epic Arts Café in 2006 to increase employment opportunities for people with disabilities in Kampot.

The café is now a successful model that generates funds for our Inclusive Arts projects and education programmes.

We produced our first tourist show in Kampot, which was opened to tourists and locals alike. 'Come Back Brighter', the dance piece Epic Encounters toured the UK with in 2014 had it's own run of shows in The Old Royal Cinema, Kampot.

Students learn to believe in their abilities, see the opportunities that are possible for them and develop skills and confidence. For many of our students and their families this is something they never saw as a possibility.

The completion of new music studio has allowed us to expand our Inclusive Education curriculum.

With the new facilities we were able to employ a music teacher and add music lessons for our students, expanding the learning outcomes of the Inclusive Arts Course.

The studio has also helped us to expanded our creative output for partner projects, which generate income for Epic Arts.





19, 548 people attended workshops, performances and classes run by Epic Arts.











SOCIAL ENTERPRISE INCOME BREAKDOWN 2016
