

#### Mast migrations overview




- European religious and political context (1650-1750)

### Going North: Bern to Alsace and the Palatinate






#### Crossings: 1737 and 1750






#### Dordrecht Confession of Faith

- Adopted in 1632 to unify Flemish Mennonites in the Netherlands
- Accepted and used by Swiss Anabaptists, contributing to 1693 Amish schism.
- Article 14: "flee, for the Lord's sake...rather than give occasion for offense"




## Amish movements/settlements in Europe





#### First Amish settlement in North America: Northkill






tist's conception of the Jacob Hochstetler immigrant pioneer hon Berne Township. Berks County - 1757, time of the Indian massacre



#### Holmes County, Ohio and "White" Jonas Stutzman




Remembering Mast family hospitality to natives: Peace Bridge plaque near Walnut Creek, Ohio






### Amish Ministers' Meeting 1865/ Abraham Mast




