Play It Forward

ESTEEMED PRODUCER KENNY ALHADEFF BRINGS COME FROM AWAY, HIS INSPIRING MUSICAL, BACK TO SEATTLE FOR A PERFORMANCE STEEPED IN HUMANITY.

AS A TONY AWARD WINNER AND

a seventh-generation Seattleite, Kenny Alhadeff is accustomed to the concept of legacy. The producer and founding partner of Junkyard Dog Productions, Alhadeff has brought stories to the stage that speak to the marks people make on history while staking his own claim to history in the world of theater.

His most recent project, the Tony-nominated musical Come from Away, tells the true story of the small town of Gander, Newfoundland, which in the wake of September 11, 2001, welcomed 38 grounded planes—and thousands of stranded people from all over the world. In the aftermath of the tragedy, locals opened their homes to the passengers, feeding and clothing them at a time full of uncer-




the politics they ascribed to," says Alhadeff. "It was just human beings acting kindly toward human beings."

The show premiered in 2015 in Seattle. It is currently on Broadway in New York and London's West End. It returned to Washington for an encore run this fall at the Fifth Avenue Theatre, where it was first workshopped. "The venue is a big deal to me because the musical was, in a sense, born here," says Alhadeff. "And it's also personal." In 1978, the theater (first opened in 1926) was forced to close after falling into serious disrepair. Unable to see the icon destroyed, a group of 43 local businesses and community leaders-including Alhadeff's father—raised the \$2.6 million needed for its restoration and reopening.

"We produce theater because we believe it can be a torch of light in the darkness in our world. We hope it entertains. We hope it brings joy. We hope that it can teach lessons of civility and humanity," says Alhadeff.

Alhadeff even has Goldfarb jewelry inherited from his father, whose own father passed it down to him.

"When I was a teenager, every holiday season I would dress up and go to the store, and Alvin would treat me as a special customer," Alhadeff recalls. "I'd take my \$50 to buy gifts for my entire family, and he would spend over an hour with me, trying to find a little Cross pen or a bookmark, the same way he would spend time with people spending thousands and thousands of dollars. It was always a very special event. That kindness and professionalism stuck with me my whole life."

Alhadeff has made it his mission to manifest the same level of compassion he's experienced at Alvin Goldfarb. "Kindness is the great equalizer of the human condition," he says. "People have different abilities, in both intelligence and opportunity, but we need to be empathetic and understanding of those who are different from us. We need to celebrate the common denominator of the human spirit."



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
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



























Rock-Solid Advice

STEVEN GOLDFARB TACKLES YOUR MOST PERPLEXING JEWELRY QUESTIONS.

I want to get my wife something special for a big birthday this year. Are diamonds still a girl's best friend?

The saying "diamonds are a girl's best friend" comes from the song made famous by Marilyn Monroe in the movie version of Gentlemen Prefer Blonds. For a new generation, it is Rhianna who encourages people to shine bright like "diamonds in the sky." It's true diamonds are the most popular gemstones for fine jewelry. Not only are they beautiful and eye-catching, but their clear color complements every outfit, color, and style. Diamonds are strong enough to take on the active lifestyle we live today.





My husband and I are celebrating our 30th wedding anniversary. He's a watch guy, and I would love to get him something different but also classic enough to last a long time—like us!

Different watches suit different uses and moods. He needs something dressy to wear with a suit or for an important meeting just as much as he needs a rugged timepiece to wear when he's spending the weekend boating or on vacation. Get him something handsome and different from his other watches, and he'll find the right time and place to wear it. He'll always remember the anniversary, too, every time he looks at his wrist.

I have lots of older jewelry I can no longer wear (single earrings, broken chains, dated designs, gifts from old boyfriends). What can I do with it?

You can turn something old into something new. Think of musicians: they often sample songs from the past, adding their own touches to make them new

Can you give me an example of a signature piece of jewelry?

Classic pieces look great on everyone. Other items are unique and convey the spirit of the individual wearer. A family crest ring, a colorful necklace, shoulder-duster earrings, or a braided strand bracelet can help showcase your personal style. Musical artists often successfully experiment with remaking classic songs (think of Rod Stewart, who released several albums of classic 1940s and '50s covers a few years ago), so try a twist on an old classic every few years. ■

again. Run-DMZ did it in the '80s with Aerosmith's "Walk This Way," and Jake Owen did it more recently with John Mellencamp's "Jack and Diane." Making new pieces out of old ones

is something we do regularly, and it is a great way to preserve the sentiment you attach to your jewelry while keeping it current. We also accept items as trade if they no longer match a client's desires. Jewelry is best when it's worn, not stored in a drawer.

I like to stay up-to-date with my jewelry, but I also want to collect pieces that will stand the test of time. What are a few trends you think will have long-term staying power?

Just as in music, the best way to figure out which jewelry will have staying power is to look at what has never gone out of style. Diamond stud earrings are a must-have (we set ours in three prongs in platinum or white gold, and we can reset yours), as are classic pendants, pearl strands, bangle bracelets, beautiful blue sapphires, vibrant green emeralds, and red rubies. Once you have your basic jewelry wardrobe, just add one or two signature pieces to make it your own.

have thrived in the firm's unique setting: in 1984, he began his goldsmith apprenticeship at Furrer Jacot and currently holds the firm's master of design position, drawing inspiration—and garnering awards—for his works from nature, architecture, and even current events while overseeing much of the training for the workshop's team of craftspeople.

Furrer Jacot's collections range from classic to cuttingedge, including the influential line of carbon-fiber rings that it launched in 2012 as an alternative (or an addition) to traditional metals such as gold and platinum. Its engraving services straddle a similar span, from simple declarations to text

hand-engraved in the giver's own script. As another ultrainnovative option, clients can have their partner's fingerprint laser-engraved inside a ring as a way to keep a distinctive mark of their loved one forever close.

The heritage brand brings its 160 years of artistry to each piece, a fitting gift for a future of eternal love. Every ring also comes with a lifetime warranty that covers periodic care and service even after it has been passed down through generations. It is this sort of dedication to excellence and individual care that elevates Furrer Jacot among its fellow jewelers and drives its future of inventiveness, workmanship, and mastery.



Taylor remained Brett's muse, with most of the artist's first album inspired by her, including his number-one hits "Like I Loved You," "Mercy," and "In Case You Didn't Know," which went triple platinum, selling over a million copies.


Steven

What jewelry is special to you?


My current favorite piece is a white gold and diamond bolo necklace because it's so streamlined and versatile. It is one necklace that can be worn three different ways.

What jewelry is special to you?


My favorite piece of jewelry in the store is our spectacular strand of South Sea pearls.

What jewelry is special to you?


