1. Before printing this ring sizing guide, make sure that page scaling is set to "NONE" or unchecked in your printer settings.
2. Be sure you're printing this document at full size or a page size of 100 percent.
3. Compare a ruler or U.S. Quarter with the guides on the right to ensure your printed document is the correct size. The marks on the ruler should match precisely and the U.S. Quarter should completely fill the circle shape.
4. If the measurement isn't accurate, please review your printer settings again.

## MEASURE YOUR OWN RING

1. Use a ring that fits comfortably and has a similar band width to the one you would like to purchase. Our rings are available in band widths of $1 \mathrm{~mm}, 1.3 \mathrm{~mm}$ and 1.6 mm .
2. If the ring you are using to measure has a band width of 3 mm or more, once you determine the exact ring size, consider sizing down $1 / 2$ to one whole size when placing your final order with us. Rings with wider band widths tend to fit fingers more tightly than rings of the same size with narrower band widths.
3. Pleace the ring over the circles below. Be sure yo use a ring that can lay perfectly flat on the paper. Try not to use a ring that has stones or is tapered, preventing it from laying flat.
4. Match the inside diameter of your ring to the closest size. You want the inside edge of your ring to line up perfectly with the black outline of the circle.


Measurements match the inside edge of the ring.
