What an incredibly exciting time for the Nebraska Global Methodist Church! By Pastor Jake Schadel

The wheels of history are spinning, the spirit of God is moving, and God's church is on the march! I once read a book by C.S. Lewis where he described the church as a gleaming army, fierce and bold with banners furling in the wind, undaunted and unshakeable. What an inspiring image! What a gift to be a member of Christ's Body, when functioning as it was designed bent on overtaking the very gates hell!

Of course, the great call to make disciples requires organizing, planning, and strategy. I don't know about the rest of you, but for the last year or so the concept of "connection" has felt like something on the horizon, something we are reaching for but so far unable to grasp. All of that is coming to an end. Next month, on November 2-4 in Watertown South Dakota the church in all her splendor is gathering. It is finally time for the churches of the Upper Midwest to come together and pray for a movement of the Holy Spirit in our time. On top of that we have divided the state of Nebraska into four districts and appointed Presiding Elders over each district. Our hope and prayer is that this will make the work of finding pastors, connecting, and fellowshipping much easier.

It is such a rare opportunity to not only see a denomination at its inception but to actually take part in shaping and forming it and praying for it and working for it. Our desire in the Upper Midwest is that we would see a conference that exists solely to support the work of the local church. I have been given a very unique opportunity to be a part of the conversations that are already shaping this conference and denomination, and I have to tell you that it will be unlike anything we could have imagined.

First of all, streamlined and fit for ministry at all levels. I have been astonished at how much work and thought and prayer have gone into conference leadership to make sure that the Administrative side is working at a bare bones level. Imagine a conference that rather than paying a District Superintendent a six-figure income, expects that work to be done by clergy and actually reimburses the local church for their time.

Or how about a conference that can operate on only 1% apportionments so that local churches can keep their money and use it in a way that is missional and helpful in their context of ministry.

Or how about seven states working together, sharing resources, and joining hands for youth ministry, evangelism, church planting, leadership training, and revitalization! I could go on and on.

My point today, Nebraskans, is that our patience and our hard work and our prayer is coming to fruition. A theologically sound church is what we all desired. God answered that prayer with the GMC and is adding to it daily. Not only sound theology, but fiscally responsible, truly cooperative, and a laser like focus on mission and fruitful ministry that seeks to save the lost and to deepen our level of discipleship. Lewis described, a gleaming army, fierce and bold, with banners flying ready to march on the world, and overcome even the gates of hell itself. See you in South Dakota friends!

As you can see, we need to **pray daily** for our *Episcopal Leaders*, the *TLC* (*Transitional Leadership Council*, a 16 member body that is charged with the task of creating the Global Methodist Church with members from the US and around the world), the TCAT groups (*Transitional Conference Advisory Teams* in the various states who help form a provisional annual conference in their area.), and our *local Global Methodist Churches*.

Proposal for

2024 General Conference

" In light of the U.S. conferences that have imposed high barriers to disaffiliation, and in light of the fact that conferences and local churches outside the U.S. have not had an equal opportunity to disaffiliate, Good News and the Renewal and Reform Coalition will be proposing the 2024 General Conference adopt a new Par. 2553 for local church disaffiliation and a new paragraph for annual conferences outside the U.S. to disaffiliate. A significant number of U.S. churches, as well as nearly all churches outside the U.S. have been denied a fair and reasonable opportunity to disaffiliate due to conflicts in conscience. This inequity must be addressed. "
