

# SOFT WALK

Airy, wearable, and imminently knittable – this little tank is everything I want to shrug on in the summer.

Lighter and fresher than cotton, Breezeway is knit in silk bourette (also known as raw silk or silk noil). Silk bourette is made from short silk fibers that are naturally short, are from the broken cocoons from which silkworms emerge, or are leftover from continuous silk production. Unlike continuous silk yarns, bourette is soft, matte, and lofty with a gently nubby texture.

#### A "Classic" Pattern

Our Classic series of patterns are designed to help you grow your knitting and fitting skillset. These patterns include at least one modification in the pattern to help you make it your own, and enough support that they could be your first garment pattern. Soft Walk offers two modification options – a long and short version, and optional bust shaping in four cup sizes.

### CONSTRUCTION

Soft Walk is knit in the round from the bottom up to the underarms and then knit flat to the shoulders. The shoulders are seamed and stitches are picked up and knit for the collar and armhole trim, which are finished with a sewn tubular bind-off (or other bind-off of your choice).

- Seaming (for the shoulders only)

### SIZE INFORMATION

### GAUGE

22 stitches and 33 rows/rounds over 4 inches / 10 cm in stockinette stitch with size A needles after blocking.

#### SIZES

1 (2, 3, 4) [5, 6, 7] (8, 9, 10, 11)

#### CHOOSE A GARMENT SIZE

Choose the size closest to your actual upper chest measurement.

Upper chest is measured above the full bust, at an angle close to diagonal beneath the underarms, and straight across the back.

### PICK A CUP SIZE

Soft Walk includes instructions for working short rows to accommodate breasts. Short rows add length to the front of the garment only, so that the hem does not rise in the front. To choose a cup size, measure your body from the top of the shoulder to your underbust in both the back and the front. Subtract the back length from the front length then subtract 2 inches / 5 cm and choose a cup size based on the result.

Jen is wearing size 5, cup 2, Short Length with 4 inches / 10 cm of positive ease at the full bust. Her upper chest is 41 inches / 104 cm and she is 5'8" / 172.5 cm tall.

### INTENDED FIT

Soft Walk is designed to fit with approximately 4 inches / 10 cm of positive ease at the fullest part of your bust.

The finished total length of the garment is measurement L (page 4). To see where the hem will land on your frame, measure straight down from your inner neck point (where your shoulder meets your neck, halfway between the front and back). Short Length is designed to land at the high hip, Long Length at the full hip.

## MATERIALS

### YARN

#### Wonderland Yarns Summer Silk

100% Silk bourette; 390 yds / 357 m per 100 g skein. This is a matte, heavy-fingering weight yarn.

Summer Silk is a high-drape yarn with moderate stitch definition and rustic texture. It is very soft and cool. Shown in Out to Sea (MC) and Little Bat (CC).

#### Main Color (MC)

**For Short Length:** 530 (610, 665, 740) [790, 870, 915] (1000, 1050, 1125, 1175) yds / 485 (555, 610, 680) [725, 795, 835] (915, 960, 1035, 1075) m; 2 (2, 2, 2) [3, 3, 3] (3, 3, 3, 4) skeins

**For Long Length:** 615 (695, 770, 845) [915, 990, 1060] (1145, 1205, 1290, 1350) yds / 560 (635, 705, 775) [840, 905, 970] (1045, 1100, 1180, 1230) m; 2 (2, 2, 3) [3, 3, 3] (3, 4, 4, 4) skeins

If you are working the optional cup shaping, you will need an additional:

**Cup 1:** 15 (15, 20, 20) [20, 20, 25] (25, 25, 30, 30) yds / 15 (15, 15, 20) [20, 20, 20] (25, 25, 25, 25) m

**Cup 2:** 30 (30, 35, 40) [40, 45, 45] (50, 55, 55, 60) yds / 25 (30, 30, 35) [40, 40, 45] (45, 50, 50, 55) m

**Cup 3:** 45 (50, 55, 60) [60, 65, 70] (75, 80, 85, 90) yds / 40 (45, 50, 55) [55, 60, 65] (70, 75, 80, 80) m

**Cup 4:** 60 (65, 70, 75) [85, 90, 95] (100, 105, 115, 120) yds / 55 (60, 65, 70) [75, 80, 85] (95, 100, 105, 110) m

### Contrasting Color (CC)

For Long and Short Length: 50 (50, 55, 55) [60, 60, 65] (65, 70, 75, 75) yds / 40 (40, 45, 45) [50, 50, 55] (55, 60, 60, 65) m, less than one skein.

### NEEDLES AND NOTIONS

#### Needles

All garment sizes use all needle sizes.

**Size A:** US Size 5 / 3.75 mm needle, or as needed to obtain gauge.

Choose a circular needle length approximately 3/4 of your finished bust measurement.

**Size B:** US Size 3 / 3.25 mm needle, or two US sizes smaller than size A.

For the hem: Choose a circular needle length approximately 3/4 of your finished bust measurement.

For the collar: Circular needle at least 16 inches / 40 cm long.

For the armhole trim: Circular needle at least 12 (12, 12, 16) [16, 16, 16] (16, 16, 16, 24) inches / 30 (30, 30, 40) [40, 40, 40] (40, 40, 40, 60) cm long.

**Size C (for the optional Tubular Cast-on):** US Size 2 / 2.75 mm needle, or three US sizes smaller than size A.

Choose a circular needle length approximately 3/4 of your finished bust measurement.


#### Notions

- Waste yarn for the optional Tubular Cast-on (choose a smooth yarn in a contrasting color and similar weight)
- One Stitch marker for the beginning of the round
- Waste yarn or stitch holder
- Tapestry needle
