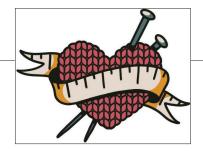

SUNUP ON 82ND

Inspired by the textures and colors of daybreak – craggy shadows, backlit clouds marching across a sherbert sky, the delicacy of first light creeping along a pebbled sidewalk – this sweater features a nubby garter pattern in the yoke shaping and down the sides. The scoop neck and shaped hem add sophistication to an easy-fitting everyday pullover.

Note: This pattern was originally published in 2020. This revision adds bust darts, extends the size range, and improves the finishing techniques for the trim. We hope you love the new version!

CONSTRUCTION

Sunup on 82nd is worked seamlessly from the top down. Stitches are picked up and worked for the collar. A curved hem is shaped with German short rows. Optional bust shaping in five cup sizes is also worked with German short rows. All bind-offs are finished with an optional sewn bind-off.

TECHNIQUES USED

- Working directional shaping
- Knitting in the round
- Casting-on with a Cable Cast-on (page 5)
- Working German Short Rows (page 6)
- Sewn Bind-off (optional, page 6)
- Picking up and knitting

Knitters will be most comfortable working this pattern if they can read their knitting (recognize a knit and purl on the needle).

SIZE INFORMATION

GAUGE

20 stitches and 30 rows/rounds in 4 inches / 10 cm worked both flat and in the round in stockinette stitch with size A needles.

SIZES

1 (2, 3, 4) [5, 6, 7] (8, 9, 10)

PICK A GARMENT SIZE

Choose the size closest to your actual upper chest measurement.

Upper chest is measured above the full bust, at an angle close to diagonal beneath the underarms, and straight across the back.

PICK A CUP SIZE

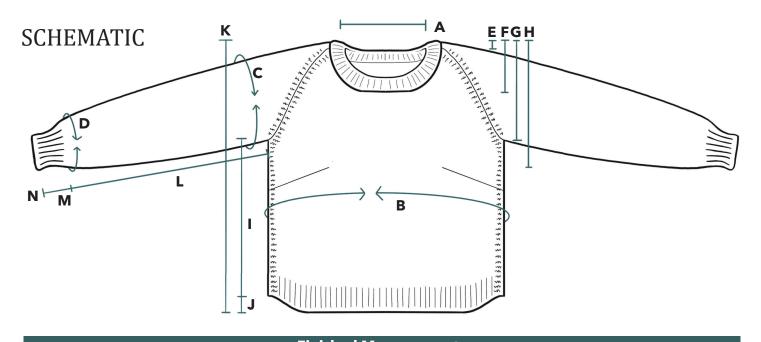
Sunup on 82nd includes instructions for knitting short rows to accommodate breasts. Short rows add length to the front of the garment only, so that the hem does not rise in the front. To choose a cup size,

measure your body from the top of the shoulder to your underbust in both the back and the front. Subtract the back length from the front length then subtract 2 inches / 5 cm and choose a cup size based on the result.

Cup size 5 is only available for sizes 2 - 10.

Jen is wearing size 4, cup 3, with 2 inches / 5 cm of positive ease at the full bust and 2.5 inches / 6.5 cm of positive ease at the upper arm. Her upper chest is 41 inches / 104 cm and she is 5'8" / 172.5 cm tall.

INTENDED FIT

Sunup on 82nd is designed to fit with approximately 4 inches / 10 cm of positive ease at the full bust and 3 inches / 7.5 cm of positive ease at the upper arm.

The front of this garment is approximate 1.5 inches / 4 cm wider than the back.

This is a standard-length garment; the total length is measurement K, page 3. To see where the hem will land on your frame, measure straight down from your inner neck point (where your shoulder meets your neck, halfway between front and back).

MATERIALS

YARN

Explorer Knits Earthy DK

100% Non-superwash Merino; 246 yds / 225 m per 100 g skein. This is a 4-ply, 26 micron count yarn. Earthy DK is a soft, lofty yarn with excellent stitch definition. Shown in colorway Vatnajökull.

1125 (1200, 1300, 1405) [1500, 1590, 1695] (1810, 1910, 2000) yds / 1025 (1095, 1190, 1285) [1375, 1455, 1550] (1655, 1750, 1830) m; 5 (5, 6, 6) [7, 7, 7] (8, 8, 9) skeins

If you are working the optional cup shaping, you will need an additional:

Cup 1: 10 (15, 15, 15) [15, 15, 20] (20, 20, 20) yds / 10 (10, 15, 15) [15, 15, 15] (20, 20, 20) m

Cup 2: 25 (30, 30, 35) [35, 40, 40] (45, 45, 50) yds / 25 (25, 30, 30) [35, 35, 40] (40, 45, 45) m

Cup 3: 35 (40, 45, 50) [55, 55, 60] (65, 65, 70) yds / 35 (35, 40, 45) [50, 50, 55] (60, 60, 65) m

Cup 4: 50 (55, 60, 65) [70, 75, 80] (85, 90, 95) yds / 45 (50, 55, 60) [65, 65, 70] (75, 80, 85) m

Cup 5: - (65, 75, 80) [85, 90, 95] (105, 110, 115) yds / - (60, 65, 70) [80, 85, 90] (95, 100, 105) m

NEEDLES AND NOTIONS

Needles

All garment sizes use both needle sizes:

Size A: US size 6 / 4 mm needle, or as needed to obtain gauge.

For the body: Choose a circular needle length approximately ¾ of your finished bust measurement.

For the sleeves: Choose your preferred needles for small circumference knitting.

Size B: US size 4 / 3.5 mm needle, or two US sizes smaller than size A, for working the trim.

For the body: Choose a circular needle length approximately ¾ of your finished bust measurement.

For the sleeves: Choose your preferred needles for small circumference knitting.

Notions

- 5 stitch markers (including 1 unique for beginning of round)
- Stitch holder and waste yarn
- Cable needle (for setting up optional Sewn Bindoff)
- Tapestry needle
